#### **INTRODUCTION**

I grew up with a fundamentalist Christian background. My father took me to church three times a week, and the doctrines of the church and of the Bible were well drilled into me. I believed them, at least as much as any sane person can (See the last chapter of this book.), and took them very seriously. I was the "Bible Boy" in my high school and proudly carried my Bible with me to every class. (Ooh, does it hurt to admit that!) I studied it daily, often at the expense of studying the things I should have been studying. I memorized large portions of it, starting out with those selected verses that were proffered by Bible memory courses, because they were deemed to be verses or passages of particular value.

However, as I got to be an adult things changed. I couldn't seem to determine "god's will for my life." I went through an unhappy marriage. By the time I was through my twenties I had given up on an empty fiasco that just wasn't working.

More recently in life I was looking for some good humor to read and thought it would be fun to read a parody of the Bible. Surely someone has written such a thing sometime in the last 2000 years, right? Well, while some of the things that I found that were referred to as Bible parodies were fun and entertaining to read, I did not find any that actually took the entire Bible and rewrote it in humorous or parody form. I took that as my "divine signal" to finally write that book that I had always dreamed of writing.

This, of course, required reading the entire thing again, this time with a bit more of a critical eye, and in the process of doing so I came across many contradictions that I pointed out in the text as I was writing. I decided to gather them together into a list for those who did not wish to take the time to read my parody.

However, probably not too many people particularly care just what are the specific contradictions that I happened to come across as I was writing my book, so I decided to produce a more comprehensive work and researched in other books and on the internet the contradictions that others claimed to have found, many of which I agreed with, but many of which I did not agree were contradictory. I applied a critical approach to those claims, as well. Many critics will take liberties in their interpretations or just simply misread things and make mistakes. I culled out those examples that I thought had good merit. Although I did not agree with all the examples that they gave, I appreciated their work and was often impressed with the keenness and diligence these sources displayed in finding things that I probably never would have found.

Contradictory passages in the Bible, though, are only part of its problems and only part of the reason I now look back and wonder that I ever accepted its nonsensical and abhorrent teachings. In order to give a more complete picture of the ridiculousness of accepting the Bible as the "inerrant word of god" or any kind of reasonable guide to be followed, I then added some other examples of passages that conflicted with

known reality or were just simply ludicrous, even though they did not contradict other passages of the Bible. I then added the parts of the Bible that were simply repugnant or horrifying, such as where god engages in wanton violence and destruction, an example being the story that probably everyone, even if he or she never even set foot in a church or attended a Sunday School, is at least somewhat familiar with, when god drowned the whole earth (men, women, children and little babies, as well as all the animals) in a huge flood, excepting only eight people and their animal companions in a wooden ark. The violent or hateful actions depicted in the Bible by its assumed god and the abhorrent and abominable morals taught by many Bible passages cannot be overlooked by any reasonable-minded person reading them. My thanks, once again, to those sources listed above who provided additional information for these parts, as well.

The result is more or less a "condensed" version of the Bible, so that a person can read all the parts that illustrate why it is a book not worth reading, or at least not worth putting any faith in. If anyone complains that I am unfairly picking out only the portions of the Bible that display its dark side, I simply respond that I am doing nothing more than what those Bible memory courses did that I took as a kid, choosing the parts that serve my purpose, only I have chosen those portions that they would generally choose to leave out.

The book is organized into three parts. The first part consists of those Bible passages in which god or religion are presented as evil, violent or repugnant for some reason or other. Chapter One lists passages that display the wanton violence that god is depicted as displaying in the Bible. Chapter Two lists passages that actually describe god as evil or hateful. Chapter Three lists that passages that teach rather twisted or perverse morals or a warped sense of justice. Chapter Four contains just a few leftover passages that will leave the reader to wonder about the "holiness" or "wholesomeness" of the Bible or that might be interesting for some other reason. The second part consists of two chapters that give Bible passages and then ask a question for the reader to answer about those passages. Chapter Five is the chapter that contains the list of contradictory passages in the Bible. Chapter Six lists passages that do not necessarily contradict other passages in the Bible but would give pause to a reader who wishes to claim that the Bible is the "inerrant word of god". Many of these contradict known reality, such as the earth being a sphere or turning on its axis, even though they don't necessarily conflict with other Bible passages. Finally, the last part is just one short chapter, Chapter Seven, consisting of a short ten-question "test" for a person to take if he or she wishes to claim that he or she actually believes this book of fables, superstition and horror. I believe it is safe to bet that most "believers" would "fail" the test. Those who don't are or should be in insane asylums. My apologies for any offense. This is not to say that Christians or people who are adherants to other religions are bad people. Most Christians are good, upstanding people in general. As Steven Pinker states in The Better Angels of Our Nature, "The overwhelming majority of observant Jews and Christians are, needless to say, thoroughly decent people who do not sanction genocide, rape, slavery, or stoning people for frivolous infractions. Their reverence for the Bible is purely talismanic. In recent millennia and centuries the Bible has been spin-doctored, allegorized, superseded by less violent texts (the Talmud among Jews and the New Testament among Christians), or discreetly ignored. And that is the point. Sensibilities toward violence have changed so much that religious people today compartmentalize their attitude to the Bible. They pay it lip service as a symbol of morality, while getting their actual morality from more modern principles."

Since there is none among the many different translations and versions of the Bible that is universally accepted as most accurate, all passages quoted are taken from the traditional King James Version of the Bible. Although its wording and style are a bit archaic, it is still generally intelligible to people of our times.

As a note to those who are not already familiar with the Bible, it is a collection of 66 books, divided into an Old Testament, the books written before the time of Christ, consisting of 39 books, and a New Testament, written since the time of Christ, consisting of 27 books. The books of 1 Samuel ("First Samuel"), 2 Samuel, 1 Kings and 2 Kings in the Old Testament recite the history of the kings of Israel and Judah (which split off from Israel during the course of the books). The two books that follow those, 1 Chronicles and 2 Chronicles, are essentially a rehash of the same sequence of kings, and so present good fodder for finding contradictions between the two different accounts. You will see numerous examples of contradictions posing a passage from the first group of books against a passage from the latter. Similarly, the first four books of the New Testament are the four "gospels", each giving a separate account of the life of Jesus, and so, once again,

provide plenty of fodder for contradictions. Also, note that the spellings of names often vary from one book to another, in particular, between the Old Testament and the New Testament. Isaiah, for instance, in the Old Testament, is Esaias in the New Testament. Elijah in the Old Testament is Elias in the New Testament. I have tried to clarify these differences in the examples given.

# PART 1 THE UNHOLY

The parts of the Bible that illustrate god's violence, evilness, hatred, immorality and injustice.

#### CHAPTER 1 GOD'S VIOLENCE

The Bible is filled with war and killing, in particular, in the Old Testament, and, in particular, violence by god or sanctioned or even ordered by god. I have, however, not included here all the wars that were fought in the Old Testament. War was, essentially, a "way of life", as evidenced by 2 Samuel 11:1, " And it came to pass, after the year was expired, at the time when kings go forth to battle...." I have only included in this list those examples in which god or his people deliberately killed women, children or other non-combatants or in which god directly instructed people to attack those who were not being aggressive. I have also left out references to the greatest violence of all -- the condemnation of most of humanity to suffer eternally in a "lake of fire". I believe anyone reading this is already aware of this horrific concept taught by Jesus and by others in the New Testament (and only in the New Testament).

Psalm 145:8 – The LORD is gracious, and full of compassion; slow to anger, and of great mercy. Romans 14:17 – for the kingdom of God is not meat and drink; but righteousness, and peace Romans 15:33 – Now the God of peace be with you all. Amen. Philippians 4:9 – ... and the God of peace shall be with you.

Genesis 6: <sup>7</sup> And the LORD said, I will destroy man whom I have created from the face of the earth; both man, and beast, and the creeping thing, and the fowls of the air; for it repenteth me that I have made them. ... <sup>17</sup> And, behold, I, even I, do bring a flood of waters upon the earth, to destroy all flesh, wherein is the breath of life, from under heaven; and every thing that is in the earth shall die.... And all the sons of Levi gathered themselves together unto him. <sup>27</sup> And he said unto them, Thus saith the LORD God of Israel, Put every man his sword by his side, and go in and out from gate to gate

- throughout the camp, and slay every man his brother, and every man his companion, and every man his neighbour. <sup>28</sup> And the children of Levi did according to the word of Moses: and there fell of the people that day about three thousand men.... <sup>35</sup> And the LORD plagued the people, because they made the calf, which Aaron made.

- Leviticus 20: <sup>9</sup> For every one that curseth his father or his mother shall be surely put to death.... <sup>10</sup> And the man that committeth adultery with another man's wife, even he that committeth adultery with his neighbour's wife, the adulterer and the adulteress shall surely be put to death. <sup>11</sup> And the man that lieth with his father's wife hath uncovered his father's nakedness: both of them shall surely be put to death; their blood shall be upon them. <sup>12</sup> And if a man lie with his daughter in law, both of them shall surely be put to death: they have wrought confusion; their blood shall be upon them. <sup>13</sup> If a man also lie with mankind, as he lieth with a woman, both of them have committed an abomination: they shall surely be put to death; their blood shall be upon them. <sup>14</sup> And if a man take a wife and her mother, it is wickedness: they shall be burnt with fire, both he and they; that there be no wickedness among you. <sup>15</sup> And if a man lie with a beast, he shall surely be put to death: and ye shall slay the beast. <sup>16</sup> And if a woman approach unto any beast, and lie down thereto, thou shalt kill the woman, and the beast: they shall surely be put to death; their blood shall be upon them... <sup>27</sup> A man also or woman that hath a familiar spirit, or that is a wizard, shall surely be put to death: they shall stone them with stones: their blood shall be upon them.
- Leviticus 21: <sup>9</sup> And the daughter of any priest, if she profane herself by playing the whore, she profaneth her father: she shall be burnt with fire.
- Leviticus 24: <sup>16</sup> And he that blasphemeth the name of the LORD, he shall surely be put to death, and all the congregation shall certainly stone him.... <sup>23</sup> And Moses spake to the children of Israel, that they should bring forth him that had cursed out of the camp, and stone him with stones. And the children of Israel did as the LORD commanded Moses.
- Leviticus 24: <sup>19</sup> And if a man cause a blemish in his neighbour; as he hath done, so shall it be done to him; <sup>20</sup> breach for breach, eye for eye, tooth for tooth: as he hath caused a blemish in a man, so shall it be done to him again.

- Numbers 11: <sup>1</sup> And when the people complained, it displeased the LORD: and the LORD heard it; and his anger was kindled; and the fire of the LORD burnt among them, and consumed them that were in the uttermost parts of the camp.
- Numbers 11: <sup>31</sup> And there went forth a wind from the LORD, and brought quails from the sea, and let them fall by the camp.... <sup>33</sup> And while the flesh was yet between their teeth, ere it was chewed, the wrath of the LORD was kindled against the people, and the LORD smote the people with a very great plague.
- Numbers 13: <sup>31</sup> But the men that went up with him said, We be not able to go up against the people; for they are stronger than we. <sup>32</sup> And they brought up an evil report of the land which they had searched unto the children of Israel, saying, The land, through which we have gone to search it, is a land that eateth up the inhabitants thereof; and all the people that we saw in it are men of a great stature. <sup>33</sup> And there we saw the giants, the sons of Anak, which come of the giants: and we were in our own sight as grasshoppers, and so we were in their sight.... Numbers 14: <sup>36</sup> And the men, which Moses sent to search the land, who returned, and made all the congregation to murmur against him, by bringing up a slander upon the land, <sup>37</sup> even those men that did bring up the evil report upon the land, died by the plague before the LORD.
- Numbers 14: <sup>11</sup> And the LORD said unto Moses, How long will this people provoke me? and how long will it be ere they believe me, for all the signs which I have shewed among them? <sup>12</sup> I will smite them with the pestilence, and disinherit them, and will make of thee a greater nation and mightier than they.
- Numbers 15: <sup>32</sup> And while the children of Israel were in the wilderness, they found a man that gathered sticks upon the sabbath day. <sup>33</sup> And they that found him gathering sticks brought him unto Moses and Aaron, and unto all the congregation. <sup>34</sup> And they put him in ward, because it was not declared what should be done to him. <sup>35</sup> And the LORD said unto Moses, The man shall be surely put to death: all the congregation shall stone him with stones without the camp. <sup>36</sup> And all the congregation brought him without the camp, and stoned him with stones, and he died; as the LORD commanded Moses.
- Numbers 16: <sup>1</sup>Now Korah, the son of Izhar, the son of Kohath, the son of Levi, and Dathan and Abiram, the sons of Eliab, and On, the son of Peleth, sons of Reuben, took men: <sup>2</sup> and they rose up before Moses, with certain of the children of Israel, two hundred and fifty princes of the assembly, famous in the congregation, men of renown: 3 and they gathered themselves together against Moses and against Aaron, and said unto them, Ye take too much upon you, seeing all the congregation are holy, every one of them, and the LORD is among them: wherefore then lift ye up yourselves above the congregation of the LORD?... <sup>20</sup> And the LORD spake unto Moses and unto Aaron, saying, <sup>21</sup> Separate yourselves from among this congregation, that I may consume them in a moment. <sup>22</sup> And they fell upon their faces, and said, O God, the God of the spirits of all flesh, shall one man sin, and wilt thou be wroth with all the congregation? <sup>23</sup> And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, <sup>24</sup> Speak unto the congregation, saying, Get you up from about the tabernacle of Korah, Dathan, and Abiram.... <sup>31</sup> And it came to pass, as he had made an end of speaking all these words, that the ground clave asunder that was under them: <sup>32</sup> and the earth opened her mouth, and swallowed them up, and their houses, and all the men that appertained unto Korah, and all their goods. 33 They, and all that appertained to them, went down alive into the pit, and the earth closed upon them: and they perished from among the congregation. <sup>34</sup> And all Israel that were round about them fled at the cry of them: for they said, Lest the earth swallow us up also. 35 And there came out a fire from the LORD, and consumed the two hundred and fifty men that offered incense....  $^{41}$ But on the morrow all the congregation of the children of Israel murmured against Moses and against

Aaron, saying, Ye have killed the people of the LORD. <sup>42</sup> And it came to pass, when the congregation was gathered against Moses and against Aaron, that they looked toward the tabernacle of the congregation: and, behold, the cloud covered it, and the glory of the LORD appeared. <sup>43</sup> And Moses and Aaron came before the tabernacle of the congregation. <sup>44</sup> And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, <sup>45</sup> Get you up from among this congregation, that I may consume them as in a moment. And they fell upon their faces. <sup>46</sup> And Moses said unto Aaron, Take a censer, and put fire therein from off the altar, and put on incense, and go quickly unto the congregation, and make an atonement for them: for there is wrath gone out from the LORD; the plague is begun. <sup>47</sup> And Aaron took as Moses commanded, and ran into the midst of the congregation; and, behold, the plague was begun among the people: and he put on incense, and made an atonement for the people. <sup>48</sup> And he stood between the dead and the living; and the plague was stayed. <sup>49</sup> Now they that died in the plague were fourteen thousand and seven hundred, beside them that died about the matter of Korah.

- Numbers 21: <sup>1</sup>And when king Arad the Canaanite, which dwelt in the south, heard tell that Israel came by the way of the spies; then he fought against Israel, and took some of them prisoners. <sup>2</sup> And Israel vowed a vow unto the LORD, and said, If thou wilt indeed deliver this people into my hand, then I will utterly destroy their cities. <sup>3</sup> And the LORD hearkened to the voice of Israel, and delivered up the Canaanites; and they utterly destroyed them and their cities: and he called the name of the place Hormah.
- Numbers 21: <sup>5</sup> And the people spake against God, and against Moses, Wherefore have ye brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? for there is no bread, neither is there any water; and our soul loatheth this light bread. <sup>6</sup> And the LORD sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people; and much people of Israel died.
- Numbers 21: <sup>33</sup> And they turned and went up by the way of Bashan: and Og the king of Bashan went out against them, he, and all his people, to the battle at Edrei. <sup>34</sup> And the LORD said unto Moses, Fear him not: for I have delivered him into thy hand, and all his people, and his land; and thou shalt do to him as thou didst unto Sihon king of the Amorites, which dwelt at Heshbon. <sup>35</sup> So they smote him, and his sons, and all his people, until there was none left him alive: and they possessed his land.
- Numbers 25: <sup>3</sup> And Israel joined himself unto Baal-peor: and the anger of the LORD was kindled against Israel. <sup>4</sup> And the LORD said unto Moses, Take all the heads of the people, and hang them up before the LORD against the sun, that the fierce anger of the LORD may be turned away from Israel. <sup>5</sup> And Moses said unto the judges of Israel, Slay ye every one his men that were joined unto Baal-peor. <sup>6</sup> And, behold, one of the children of Israel came and brought unto his brethren a Midianitish woman in the sight of Moses, and in the sight of all the congregation of the children of Israel, who were weeping before the door of the tabernacle of the congregation. <sup>7</sup> And when Phinehas, the son of Eleazar, the son of Aaron the priest, saw it, he rose up from among the congregation, and took a javelin in his hand; <sup>8</sup> and he went after the man of Israel into the tent, and thrust both of them through, the man of Israel, and the woman through her belly. So the plague was stayed from the children of Israel. <sup>9</sup> And those that died in the plague were twenty and four thousand....
- Numbers 25: <sup>16</sup> And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, <sup>17</sup> Vex the Midianites, and smite them: <sup>18</sup> for they vex you with their wiles, wherewith they have beguiled you in the matter of Peor, and in the matter of Cozbi, the daughter of a prince of Midian, their sister, which was slain in the day of the plague for Peor's sake.
- Numbers 31: <sup>1</sup> And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, <sup>2</sup> Avenge the children of Israel of the Midianites ....

  <sup>7</sup> And they warred against the Midianites, as the LORD commanded Moses; and they slew all the males....

  <sup>9</sup> And the children of Israel took all the women of Midian captives, and their little ones, and took the spoil of all their cattle, and all their flocks, and all their goods.... <sup>15</sup> And Moses said unto them, Have ye saved all

the women alive? <sup>16</sup> Behold, these caused the children of Israel, through the counsel of Balaam, to commit trespass against the LORD in the matter of Peor, and there was a plague among the congregation of the LORD. <sup>17</sup> Now therefore kill every male among the little ones, and kill every woman that hath known man by lying with him. <sup>18</sup> But all the women children, that have not known a man by lying with him, keep alive for yourselves.... <sup>32</sup> And the booty, being the rest of the prey which the men of war had caught, was ... <sup>35</sup> and thirty and two thousand persons in all, of women that had not known man by lying with him.

- Numbers 35: <sup>22</sup> But if he thrust him suddenly without enmity, or have cast upon him any thing without laying of wait, <sup>23</sup> or with any stone, wherewith a man may die, seeing him not, and cast it upon him, that he die, and was not his enemy, neither sought his harm....<sup>25</sup> and the congregation shall deliver the slayer out of the hand of the revenger of blood, and the congregation shall restore him to the city of his refuge, whither he was fled: and he shall abide in it unto the death of the high priest, which was anointed with the holy oil. <sup>26</sup> But if the slayer shall at any time come without the border of the city of his refuge, whither he was fled; <sup>27</sup> and the revenger of blood find him without the borders of the city of his refuge, and the revenger of blood kill the slayer; he shall not be guilty of blood
- Deuteronomy 2: <sup>20</sup> (That also was accounted a land of giants: giants dwelt therein in old time; and the Ammonites call them Zamzummims; <sup>21</sup> a people great, and many, and tall, as the Anakims; but the LORD destroyed them before them; and they succeeded them, and dwelt in their stead: <sup>22</sup> as he did to the children of Esau, which dwelt in Seir, when he destroyed the Horims from before them; and they succeeded them, and dwelt in their stead even unto this day: <sup>23</sup> and the Avims which dwelt in Hazerim, even unto Azzah, the Caphtorims, which came forth out of Caphtor, destroyed them, and dwelt in their stead.)
- Deuteronomy 2: <sup>30</sup> But Sihon king of Heshbon would not let us pass by him: for the LORD thy God hardened his spirit, and made his heart obstinate, that he might deliver him into thy hand, as appeareth this day.
- Deuteronomy 3: <sup>2</sup> And the LORD said unto me, Fear him not: for I will deliver him, and all his people, and his land, into thy hand; and thou shalt do unto him as thou didst unto Sihon king of the Amorites, which dwelt at Heshbon. <sup>3</sup> So the LORD our God delivered into our hands Og also, the king of Bashan, and all his people: and we smote him until none was left to him remaining. <sup>4</sup> And we took all his cities at that time, there was not a city which we took not from them, threescore cities, all the region of Argob, the kingdom of Og in Bashan. <sup>5</sup> All these cities were fenced with high walls, gates, and bars; beside unwalled towns a great many. <sup>6</sup> And we utterly destroyed them, as we did unto Sihon king of Heshbon, utterly destroying the men, women, and children, of every city.
- Deuteronomy 7: <sup>1</sup> When the LORD thy God shall bring thee into the land whither thou goest to possess it, and hath cast out many nations before thee, the Hittites, and the Girgashites, and the Amorites, and the Canaanites, and the Perizzites, and the Hivites, and the Jebusites, seven nations greater and mightier than thou; <sup>2</sup> and when the LORD thy God shall deliver them before thee; thou shalt smite them, and utterly destroy them; thou shalt make no covenant with them, nor shew mercy unto them
- Deuteronomy 9: <sup>1</sup> Hear, O Israel: Thou art to pass over Jordan this day, to go in to possess nations greater and mightier than thyself.... <sup>3</sup> Understand therefore this day, that the LORD thy God is he which goeth over before thee; as a consuming fire he shall destroy them, and he shall bring them down before thy face: so shalt thou drive them out, and destroy them quickly, as the LORD hath said unto thee.
- Deuteronomy 13: <sup>5</sup> And that prophet, or that dreamer of dreams, shall be put to death; because he hath spoken to turn you away from the LORD your God, which brought you out of the land of Egypt, and

redeemed you out of the house of bondage, to thrust thee out of the way which the LORD thy God commanded thee to walk in. So shalt thou put the evil away from the midst of thee

Deuteronomy 13: <sup>6</sup> If thy brother, the son of thy mother, or thy son, or thy daughter, or the wife of thy bosom, or thy friend, which is as thine own soul, entice thee secretly, saying, Let us go and serve other gods, which thou hast not known, thou, nor thy fathers; <sup>7</sup> namely, of the gods of the people which are round about you, nigh unto thee, or far off from thee, from the one end of the earth even unto the other end of the earth; <sup>8</sup> thou shalt not consent unto him, nor hearken unto him; neither shall thine eye pity him, neither shalt thou spare, neither shalt thou conceal him: <sup>9</sup> but thou shalt surely kill him; thine hand shall be first upon him to put him to death, and afterwards the hand of all the people. <sup>10</sup> And thou shalt stone him with stones, that he die; because he hath sought to thrust thee away from the LORD thy God, which brought thee out of the land of Egypt, from the house of bondage.

Deuteronomy 13: <sup>12</sup> If thou shalt hear say in one of thy cities, which the LORD thy God hath given thee to dwell there, saying, <sup>13</sup> Certain men, the children of Belial, are gone out from among you, and have withdrawn the inhabitants of their city, saying, Let us go and serve other gods, which ye have not known; <sup>14</sup> then shalt thou enquire, and make search, and ask diligently; and, behold, if it be truth, and the thing certain, that such abomination is wrought among you; <sup>15</sup> thou shalt surely smite the inhabitants of that city with the edge of the sword, destroying it utterly, and all that is therein, and the cattle thereof, with the edge of the sword.

Deuteronomy 17: <sup>2</sup> If there be found among you, within any of thy gates which the LORD thy God giveth thee, man or woman, that hath wrought wickedness in the sight of the LORD thy God, in transgressing his covenant, <sup>3</sup> and hath gone and served other gods, and worshipped them, either the sun, or moon, or any of the host of heaven, which I have not commanded; <sup>4</sup> and it be told thee, and thou hast heard of it, and enquired diligently, and, behold, it be true, and the thing certain, that such abomination is wrought in Israel: <sup>5</sup> then shalt thou bring forth that man or that woman, which have committed that wicked thing, unto thy gates, even that man or that woman, and shalt stone them with stones, till they die

Deuteronomy 17: <sup>12</sup> And the man that will do presumptuously, and will not hearken unto the priest that standeth to minister there before the LORD thy God, or unto the judge, even that man shall die: and thou shalt put away the evil from Israel.

Deuteronomy 18: <sup>20</sup> But the prophet, which shall presume to speak a word in my name, which I have not commanded him to speak, or that shall speak in the name of other gods, even that prophet shall die.

Deuteronomy 19: <sup>21</sup> And thine eye shall not pity; but life shall go for life, eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, foot for foot.

Deuteronomy 20: <sup>10</sup> When thou comest nigh unto a city to fight against it, then proclaim peace unto it. <sup>11</sup> And it shall be, if it make thee answer of peace, and open unto thee, then it shall be, that all the people that is found therein shall be tributaries unto thee, and they shall serve thee. <sup>12</sup> And if it will make no peace with thee, but will make war against thee, then thou shalt besiege it: <sup>13</sup> and when the LORD thy God hath delivered it into thine hands, thou shalt smite every male thereof with the edge of the sword: <sup>14</sup> but the women, and the little ones, and the cattle, and all that is in the city, even all the spoil thereof, shalt thou take unto thyself; and thou shalt eat the spoil of thine enemies, which the LORD thy God hath given thee. <sup>15</sup> Thus shalt thou do unto all the cities which are very far off from thee, which are not of the cities of these nations. <sup>16</sup> But of the cities of these people, which the LORD thy God doth give thee for an inheritance, thou shalt save alive nothing that breatheth: <sup>17</sup> but thou shalt utterly destroy them; namely,

- the Hittites, and the Amorites, the Canaanites, and the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites; as the LORD thy God hath commanded thee
- Deuteronomy 21: <sup>18</sup> If a man have a stubborn and rebellious son, which will not obey the voice of his father, or the voice of his mother, and that, when they have chastened him, will not hearken unto them: <sup>19</sup> then shall his father and his mother lay hold on him, and bring him out unto the elders of his city, and unto the gate of his place; <sup>20</sup> and they shall say unto the elders of his city, This our son is stubborn and rebellious, he will not obey our voice; he is a glutton, and a drunkard. <sup>21</sup> And all the men of his city shall stone him with stones, that he die
- Deuteronomy 22: <sup>13</sup> If any man take a wife, and go in unto her, and hate her, <sup>14</sup> and give occasions of speech against her, and bring up an evil name upon her, and say, I took this woman, and when I came to her, I found her not a maid: <sup>15</sup> then shall the father of the damsel, and her mother, take and bring forth the tokens of the damsel's virginity unto the elders of the city in the gate.... <sup>20</sup> But if this thing be true, and the tokens of virginity be not found for the damsel: <sup>21</sup> then they shall bring out the damsel to the door of her father's house, and the men of her city shall stone her with stones that she die
- Deuteronomy 22: <sup>22</sup> If a man be found lying with a woman married to an husband, then they shall both of them die, both the man that lay with the woman, and the woman: so shalt thou put away evil from Israel. <sup>23</sup> If a damsel that is a virgin be betrothed unto an husband, and a man find her in the city, and lie with her; <sup>24</sup> then ye shall bring them both out unto the gate of that city, and ye shall stone them with stones that they die; the damsel, because she cried not, being in the city; and the man, because he hath humbled his neighbour's wife: so thou shalt put away evil from among you....
- Deuteronomy 25: <sup>19</sup> Therefore it shall be, when the LORD thy God hath given thee rest from all thine enemies round about, in the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee for an inheritance to possess it, that thou shalt blot out the remembrance of Amalek from under heaven; thou shalt not forget it.
- Deuteronomy 28: <sup>53</sup> And thou shalt eat the fruit of thine own body, the flesh of thy sons and of thy daughters, which the LORD thy God hath given thee, in the siege, and in the straitness, wherewith thine enemies shall distress thee
- Joshua 6: <sup>21</sup> And they utterly destroyed all that was in the city [Jericho], both man and woman, young and old, and ox, and sheep, and ass, with the edge of the sword.
- Joshua 7: 1...Achan, the son of Carmi, the son of Zabdi, the son of Zerah, of the tribe of Judah, took of the accursed thing: and the anger of the LORD was kindled against the children of Israel.... 4... and they fled before the men of Ai. 5 And the men of Ai smote of them about thirty and six men.... 10 And the LORD said unto Joshua, Get thee up; wherefore liest thou thus upon thy face? 11 Israel hath sinned, and they have also transgressed my covenant which I commanded them: for they have even taken of the accursed thing.... 15 And it shall be, that he that is taken with the accursed thing shall be burnt with fire, he and all that he hath: because he hath transgressed the covenant of the LORD.... 24 And Joshua, and all Israel with him, took Achan the son of Zerah, and the silver, and the garment, and the wedge of gold, and his sons, and his daughters, and his oxen, and his asses, and his sheep, and his tent, and all that he had: and they brought them unto the valley of Achor. 25 And Joshua said, Why hast thou troubled us? the LORD shall trouble thee this day. And all Israel stoned him with stones, and burned them with fire, after they had stoned them with stones.... Joshua 8: 21 And when Joshua and all Israel saw that the ambush had taken the city, and that the smoke of the city ascended, then they turned again, and slew the men of Ai. 22 ... and they smote them, so that they let none of them remain or escape. 23 And the king of Ai they took alive, and brought him to Joshua. 24 And it came to pass, when Israel had made an end of slaying all the

inhabitants of Ai in the field, in the wilderness wherein they chased them, and when they were all fallen on the edge of the sword, until they were consumed, that all the Israelites returned unto Ai, and smote it with the edge of the sword. <sup>25</sup> And so it was, that all that fell that day, both of men and women, were twelve thousand, even all the men of Ai. <sup>26</sup> For Joshua drew not his hand back, wherewith he stretched out the spear, until he had utterly destroyed all the inhabitants of Ai.

Joshua 10: <sup>28</sup> And that day Joshua took Makkedah, and smote it with the edge of the sword, and the king thereof he utterly destroyed, them, and all the souls that were therein; he let none remain: and he did to the king of Makkedah as he did unto the king of Jericho. <sup>29</sup>Then Joshua passed from Makkedah, and all Israel with him, unto Libnah, and fought against Libnah: 30 and the LORD delivered it also, and the king thereof, into the hand of Israel; and he smote it with the edge of the sword, and all the souls that were therein; he let none remain in it; but did unto the king thereof as he did unto the king of Jericho. 31 And Joshua passed from Libnah, and all Israel with him, unto Lachish, and encamped against it, and fought against it: 32 and the LORD delivered Lachish into the hand of Israel, which took it on the second day, and smote it with the edge of the sword, and all the souls that were therein, according to all that he had done to Libnah. <sup>33</sup> Then Horam king of Gezer came up to help Lachish; and Joshua smote him and his people, until he had left him none remaining. <sup>34</sup> And from Lachish Joshua passed unto Eglon, and all Israel with him; and they encamped against it, and fought against it: 35 and they took it on that day, and smote it with the edge of the sword, and all the souls that were therein he utterly destroyed that day, according to all that he had done to Lachish. <sup>36</sup> And Joshua went up from Eglon, and all Israel with him, unto Hebron; and they fought against it: <sup>37</sup> and they took it, and smote it with the edge of the sword, and the king thereof, and all the cities thereof, and all the souls that were therein; he left none remaining, according to all that he had done to Eglon; but destroyed it utterly, and all the souls that were therein. <sup>38</sup> And Joshua returned, and all Israel with him, to Debir; and fought against it: <sup>39</sup> and he took it, and the king thereof, and all the cities thereof; and they smote them with the edge of the sword, and utterly destroyed all the souls that were therein; he left none remaining: as he had done to Hebron, so he did to Debir, and to the king thereof; as he had done also to Libnah, and to her king. <sup>40</sup> So Joshua smote all the country of the hills, and of the south, and of the vale, and of the springs, and all their kings: he left none remaining, but utterly destroyed all that breathed, as the LORD God of Israel commanded. 41 And Joshua smote them from Kadesh-barnea even unto Gaza, and all the country of Goshen, even unto Gibeon. <sup>42</sup> And all these kings and their land did Joshua take at one time, because the LORD God of Israel fought for Israel.

Joshua 11: <sup>10</sup> And Joshua at that time turned back, and took Hazor, and smote the king thereof with the sword: for Hazor beforetime was the head of all those kingdoms. <sup>11</sup> And they smote all the souls that were therein with the edge of the sword, utterly destroying them: there was not any left to breathe: and he burnt Hazor with fire. <sup>12</sup> And all the cities of those kings, and all the kings of them, did Joshua take, and smote them with the edge of the sword, and he utterly destroyed them, as Moses the servant of the LORD commanded.... <sup>20</sup> For it was of the LORD to harden their hearts, that they should come against Israel in battle, that he might destroy them utterly, and that they might have no favour, but that he might destroy them, as the LORD commanded Moses. <sup>21</sup> And at that time came Joshua, and cut off the Anakims from the mountains, from Hebron, from Debir, from Anab, and from all the mountains of Judah, and from all the mountains of Israel: Joshua destroyed them utterly with their cities. <sup>22</sup> There was none of the Anakims left in the land of the children of Israel: only in Gaza, in Gath, and in Ashdod, there remained.

Judges 1: <sup>8</sup> Now the children of Judah had fought against Jerusalem, and had taken it, and smitten it with the edge of the sword, and set the city on fire.... <sup>17</sup> And Judah went with Simeon his brother, and they slew the Canaanites that inhabited Zephath, and utterly destroyed it.... <sup>23</sup> And the house of Joseph sent to descry Beth-el. (Now the name of the city before was Luz.) <sup>24</sup> And the spies saw a man come forth out of the city, and they said unto him, Shew us, we pray thee, the entrance into the city, and we will shew thee

- mercy. <sup>25</sup> And when he shewed them the entrance into the city, they smote the city with the edge of the sword; but they let go the man and all his family.
- Judges 3: <sup>17</sup> And he brought the present unto Eglon king of Moab: and Eglon was a very fat man. <sup>18</sup> And when he had made an end to offer the present, he sent away the people that bare the present. <sup>19</sup> But he himself turned again from the quarries that were by Gilgal, and said, I have a secret errand unto thee, O king: who said, Keep silence. And all that stood by him went out from him. <sup>20</sup> And Ehud came unto him; and he was sitting in a summer parlour, which he had for himself alone. And Ehud said, I have a message from God unto thee. And he arose out of his seat. <sup>21</sup> And Ehud put forth his left hand, and took the dagger from his right thigh, and thrust it into his belly: <sup>22</sup> and the haft also went in after the blade; and the fat closed upon the blade, so that he could not draw the dagger out of his belly; and the dirt came out.... and, behold, their lord was fallen down dead on the earth.
- Judges 8: <sup>4</sup> And Gideon came to Jordan, and passed over, he, and the three hundred men that were with him, faint, yet pursuing them. <sup>5</sup> And he said unto the men of Succoth, Give, I pray you, loaves of bread unto the people that follow me; for they be faint, and I am pursuing after Zebah and Zalmunna, kings of Midian. <sup>6</sup> And the princes of Succoth said, Are the hands of Zebah and Zalmunna now in thine hand, that we should give bread unto thine army?.... <sup>8</sup> And he went up thence to Penuel, and spake unto them likewise: and the men of Penuel answered him as the men of Succoth had answered him.... <sup>13</sup> And Gideon the son of Joash returned from battle... <sup>17</sup> And he beat down the tower of Penuel, and slew the men of the city.
- Judges 11: <sup>29</sup> Then the Spirit of the LORD came upon Jephthah, and he passed over Gilead, and Manasseh, and passed over Mizpeh of Gilead, and from Mizpeh of Gilead he passed over unto the children of Ammon. <sup>30</sup> And Jephthah vowed a vow unto the LORD, and said, If thou shalt without fail deliver the children of Ammon into mine hands, <sup>31</sup> then it shall be, that whatsoever cometh forth of the doors of my house to meet me, when I return in peace from the children of Ammon, shall surely be the LORD's, and I will offer it up for a burnt offering. <sup>34</sup> And Jephthah came to Mizpeh unto his house, and, behold, his daughter came out to meet him with timbrels and with dances.... <sup>37</sup> And she said unto her father, Let this thing be done for me: let me alone two months, that I may go up and down upon the mountains, and bewail my virginity, I and my fellows.... <sup>39</sup> And it came to pass at the end of two months, that she returned unto her father, who did with her according to his vow which he had vowed
- Judges 14: <sup>12</sup> And Samson said unto them, I will now put forth a riddle unto you: if ye can certainly declare it me within the seven days of the feast, and find it out, then I will give you thirty sheets and thirty change of garments.... <sup>16</sup> And Samson's wife wept before him, and said, Thou dost but hate me, and lovest me not: thou hast put forth a riddle unto the children of my people, and hast not told it me.... <sup>17</sup> and it came to pass on the seventh day, that he told her, because she lay sore upon him: and she told the riddle to the children of her people.... <sup>19</sup> And the Spirit of the LORD came upon him, and he went down to Ashkelon, and slew thirty men of them, and took their spoil, and gave change of garments unto them which expounded the riddle.
- Judges 15: <sup>14</sup> And when he came unto Lehi, the Philistines shouted against him: and the Spirit of the LORD came mightily upon him, and the cords that were upon his arms became as flax that was burnt with fire, and his bands loosed from off his hands. <sup>15</sup> And he found a new jawbone of an ass, and put forth his hand, and took it, and slew a thousand men therewith.
- Judges 16: <sup>23</sup> Then the lords of the Philistines gathered them together for to offer a great sacrifice unto Dagon their god, and to rejoice: for they said, Our god hath delivered Samson our enemy into our hand.... And they called for Samson out of the prison house; and he made them sport: and they set him between the

pillars.... <sup>29</sup> And Samson took hold of the two middle pillars upon which the house stood, and on which it was borne up, of the one with his right hand, and of the other with his left. <sup>30</sup> And Samson said, Let me die with the Philistines. And he bowed himself with all his might; and the house fell upon the lords, and upon all the people that were therein. So the dead which he slew at his death were more than they which he slew in his life.

Judges 18: <sup>2</sup> And the children of Dan sent of their family five men from their coasts, men of valour, from Zorah, and from Eshtaol, to spy out the land.... <sup>7</sup> Then the five men departed, and came to Laish, and saw the people that were therein, how they dwelt careless, after the manner of the Zidonians, quiet and secure.... <sup>27</sup> And they took the things which Micah had made, and the priest which he had, and came unto Laish, unto a people that were at quiet and secure: and they smote them with the edge of the sword, and burnt the city with fire.

Judges 19: 1...there was a certain Levite sojourning on the side of mount Ephraim, who took to him a concubine out of Beth-lehem-judah.... 9 And when the man rose up to depart, he, and his concubine .... <sup>15</sup> And they turned aside thither, to go in and to lodge in Gibeah: and when he went in, he sat him down in a street of the city.... <sup>16</sup> And, behold, there came an old man from his work out of the field at even.... <sup>21</sup> So he brought him into his house.... <sup>22</sup> Now as they were making their hearts merry, behold, the men of the city, certain sons of Belial, beset the house round about, and beat at the door, and spake to the master of the house, the old man, saying, Bring forth the man that came into thine house, that we may know him. <sup>23</sup> And the man, the master of the house, went out unto them, and said unto them, Nay, my brethren, nay, I pray you, do not so wickedly; seeing that this man is come into mine house, do not this folly. <sup>24</sup> Behold, here is my daughter a maiden, and his concubine; them I will bring out now, and humble ye them, and do with them what seemeth good unto you: but unto this man do not so vile a thing. <sup>25</sup> ... so the man took his concubine, and brought her forth unto them; and they knew her, and abused her all the night until the morning.... <sup>28</sup> And he said unto her, Up, and let us be going. But none answered.... <sup>29</sup> And when he was come into his house, he took a knife, and laid hold on his concubine, and divided her, together with her bones, into twelve pieces, and sent her into all the coasts of Israel.... Judges 20: 18 And the children of Israel arose, and went up to the house of God, and asked counsel of God, and said, Which of us shall go up first to the battle against the children of Benjamin? And the LORD said, Judah shall go up first.... <sup>21</sup> And the children of Benjamin came forth out of Gibeah, and destroyed down to the ground of the Israelites that day twenty and two thousand men.... <sup>23</sup> (And the children of Israel went up and wept before the LORD until even, and asked counsel of the LORD, saying, Shall I go up again to battle against the children of Benjamin my brother? And the LORD said, Go up against him.).... <sup>25</sup> And Benjamin went forth against them out of Gibeah the second day, and destroyed down to the ground of the children of Israel again eighteen thousand men.... <sup>30</sup> And the children of Israel went up against the children of Benjamin on the third day.... 35 And the LORD smote Benjamin before Israel: and the children of Israel destroyed of the Benjamites that day twenty and five thousand and an hundred men.... <sup>37</sup> And the liers in wait hasted, and rushed upon Gibeah; and the liers in wait drew themselves along, and smote all the city with the edge of the sword.... <sup>46</sup> So that all which fell that day of Benjamin were twenty and five thousand men that drew the sword; all these were men of valour. <sup>47</sup> But six hundred men turned and fled to the wilderness unto the rock Rimmon.... <sup>48</sup> And the men of Israel turned again upon the children of Benjamin, and smote them with the edge of the sword, as well the men of every city, as the beast, and all that came to hand: also they set on fire all the cities that they came to..... Judges 21: 1 Now the men of Israel had sworn in Mizpeh, saying, There shall not any of us give his daughter unto Benjamin to wife.... <sup>6</sup> And the children of Israel repented them for Benjamin their brother, and said, There is one tribe cut off from Israel this day. <sup>7</sup> How shall we do for wives for them that remain, seeing we have sworn by the LORD that we will not give them of our daughters to wives?... <sup>10</sup> And the congregation sent thither twelve thousand men of the valiantest, and commanded them, saying, Go and smite the inhabitants of Jabesh-gilead with the edge of the sword, with the women and the children. <sup>11</sup> And this is the thing that ye shall do, Ye shall utterly

destroy every male, and every woman that hath lain by man. <sup>12</sup> And they found among the inhabitants of Jabesh-gilead four hundred young virgins, that had known no man by lying with any male... <sup>14</sup> and they gave them wives which they had saved alive of the women of Jabesh-gilead... <sup>16</sup> Then the elders of the congregation said, How shall we do for wives for them that remain, seeing the women are destroyed out of Benjamin?... <sup>20</sup> Therefore they commanded the children of Benjamin, saying, Go and lie in wait in the vineyards; <sup>21</sup> and see, and, behold, if the daughters of Shiloh come out to dance in dances, then come ye out of the vineyards, and catch you every man his wife of the daughters of Shiloh, and go to the land of Benjamin.... <sup>23</sup> And the children of Benjamin did so, and took them wives, according to their number, of them that danced, whom they caught

- 1 Samuel 5: <sup>1</sup> And the Philistines took the ark of God, and brought it from Eben-ezer unto Ashdod.... <sup>6</sup> But the hand of the LORD was heavy upon them of Ashdod, and he destroyed them, and smote them with emerods, even Ashdod and the coasts thereof.
- 1 Samuel 6: <sup>19</sup> And he smote the men of Beth-shemesh, because they had looked into the ark of the LORD, even he smote of the people fifty thousand and threescore and ten men: and the people lamented, because the LORD had smitten many of the people with a great slaughter.
- 1 Samuel 14: 11 And both of them discovered themselves unto the garrison of the Philistines: and the Philistines said, Behold, the Hebrews come forth out of the holes where they had hid themselves. 12 And the men of the garrison answered Jonathan and his armourbearer, and said, Come up to us, and we will shew you a thing. And Jonathan said unto his armourbearer, Come up after me: for the LORD hath delivered them into the hand of Israel. 13 And Jonathan climbed up upon his hands and upon his feet, and his armourbearer after him: and they fell before Jonathan; and his armourbearer slew after him. 14 And that first slaughter, which Jonathan and his armourbearer made, was about twenty men, within as it were an half acre of land, which a yoke of oxen might plow....<sup>20</sup> And Saul and all the people that were with him assembled themselves, and they came to the battle: and, behold, every man's sword was against his fellow, and there was a very great discomfiture. <sup>21</sup> Moreover the Hebrews that were with the Philistines before that time, which went up with them into the camp from the country round about, even they also turned to be with the Israelites that were with Saul and Jonathan. <sup>22</sup> Likewise all the men of Israel which had hid themselves in mount Ephraim, when they heard that the Philistines fled, even they also followed hard after them in the battle. <sup>23</sup> So the LORD saved Israel that day: and the battle passed over unto Beth-aven. [Note: Technically I have broken my rule by including this event in the list, since the Bible does not say that god instructed Jonathan to instigate this fighting, but since the conclusion is that the Lord saved Israel that day" I believe we can assume he was acting under god's guidance or, at least, with god's approval.]
- 1 Samuel 15: <sup>2</sup>Thus saith the LORD of hosts, I remember that which Amalek did to Israel, how he laid wait for him in the way, when he came up from Egypt. <sup>3</sup>Now go and smite Amalek, and utterly destroy all that they have, and spare them not; but slay both man and woman, infant and suckling, ox and sheep, camel and ass.... <sup>7</sup>And Saul smote the Amalekites from Havilah until thou comest to Shur, that is over against Egypt. <sup>8</sup>And he took Agag the king of the Amalekites alive, and utterly destroyed all the people with the edge of the sword.
- 1 Samuel 18: <sup>22</sup> And Saul commanded his servants, saying, Commune with David secretly, and say, Behold, the king hath delight in thee, and all his servants love thee: now therefore be the king's son in law. <sup>23</sup> And Saul's servants spake those words in the ears of David. And David said, Seemeth it to you a light thing to be a king's son in law, seeing that I am a poor man, and lightly esteemed? <sup>24</sup> And the servants of Saul told him, saying, On this manner spake David. <sup>25</sup> And Saul said, Thus shall ye say to David, The king desireth not any dowry, but an hundred foreskins of the Philistines, to be avenged of the king's enemies. But Saul

thought to make David fall by the hand of the Philistines. <sup>26</sup> And when his servants told David these words, it pleased David well to be the king's son in law: and the days were not expired. <sup>27</sup> Wherefore David arose and went, he and his men, and slew of the Philistines two hundred men; and David brought their foreskins, and they gave them in full tale to the king, that he might be the king's son in law. And Saul gave him Michal his daughter to wife.

- 1 Samuel 22: <sup>17</sup> And the king said unto the footmen that stood about him, Turn, and slay the priests of the LORD; because their hand also is with David, and because they knew when he fled, and did not shew it to me. But the servants of the king would not put forth their hand to fall upon the priests of the LORD. <sup>18</sup> And the king said to Doeg, Turn thou, and fall upon the priests. And Doeg the Edomite turned, and he fell upon the priests, and slew on that day fourscore and five persons that did wear a linen ephod. <sup>19</sup> And Nob, the city of the priests, smote he with the edge of the sword, both men and women, children and sucklings, and oxen, and asses, and sheep, with the edge of the sword.
- <sup>9</sup> And when David's young men came, they spake to Nabal according to all those words in the name of David, and ceased. <sup>10</sup> And Nabal answered David's servants, and said, Who is David? and who is the son of Jesse? there be many servants now a days that break away every man from his master. <sup>11</sup> Shall I then take my bread, and my water, and my flesh that I have killed for my shearers, and give it unto men, whom I know not whence they be? <sup>12</sup> So David's young men turned their way, and went again, and came and told him all those sayings. <sup>13</sup> And David said unto his men, Gird ye on every man his sword. And they girded on every man his sword; and David also girded on his sword.... <sup>17</sup> for evil is determined against our master.... <sup>38</sup> And it came to pass about ten days after, that the LORD smote Nabal, that he died.
- 1 Samuel 27: <sup>1</sup> And David said in his heart, I shall now perish one day by the hand of Saul: there is nothing better for me than that I should speedily escape into the land of the Philistines; and Saul shall despair of me, to seek me any more in any coast of Israel: so shall I escape out of his hand. <sup>2</sup> And David arose, and he passed over with the six hundred men that were with him unto Achish, the son of Maoch, king of Gath. <sup>3</sup> And David dwelt with Achish at Gath, he and his men, every man with his household, even David with his two wives, Ahinoam the Jezreelitess, and Abigail the Carmelitess, Nabal's wife.... <sup>5</sup> And David said unto Achish, If I have now found grace in thine eyes, let them give me a place in some town in the country, that I may dwell there: for why should thy servant dwell in the royal city with thee? <sup>6</sup> Then Achish gave him Ziklag that day: wherefore Ziklag pertaineth unto the kings of Judah unto this day....

  <sup>8</sup> And David and his men went up, and invaded the Geshurites, and the Gezrites, and the Amalekites: for those nations were of old the inhabitants of the land, as thou goest to Shur, even unto the land of Egypt.

  <sup>9</sup> And David smote the land, and left neither man nor woman alive.... <sup>11</sup> And David saved neither man nor woman alive
- 1 Samuel 30: <sup>1</sup> And it came to pass, when David and his men were come to Ziklag on the third day, that the Amalekites had invaded the south, and Ziklag, and smitten Ziklag, and burned it with fire; <sup>2</sup> and had taken the women captives, that were therein: they slew not any, either great or small, but carried them away, and went on their way.... <sup>16</sup> And when he had brought him down, behold, they were spread abroad upon all the earth, eating and drinking, and dancing, because of all the great spoil that they had taken out of the land of the Philistines, and out of the land of Judah. <sup>17</sup> And David smote them from the twilight even unto the evening of the next day: and there escaped not a man of them, save four hundred young men, which rode upon camels, and fled.
- 2 Samuel 1: <sup>6</sup> And the young man that told him said, As I happened by chance upon mount Gilboa, behold, Saul leaned upon his spear; and, lo, the chariots and horsemen followed hard after him. <sup>7</sup> And when he looked behind him, he saw me, and called unto me. And I answered, Here am I. <sup>8</sup> And he said unto me,

- Who art thou? And I answered him, I am an Amalekite. <sup>9</sup> He said unto me again, Stand, I pray thee, upon me, and slay me: for anguish is come upon me, because my life is yet whole in me. <sup>10</sup> So I stood upon him, and slew him, because I was sure that he could not live after that he was fallen.... <sup>15</sup> And David called one of the young men, and said, Go near, and fall upon him. And he smote him that he died.
- 2 Samuel 2: <sup>14</sup> And Abner said to Joab, Let the young men now arise, and play before us. And Joab said, Let them arise. <sup>15</sup> Then there arose and went over by number twelve of Benjamin, which pertained to Ishbosheth the son of Saul, and twelve of the servants of David. <sup>16</sup> And they caught every one his fellow by the head, and thrust his sword in his fellow's side; so they fell down together. [*Note: Okay, all of the people who died in this one were soldiers, but I couldn't help but include it for just how outrageous and unbelievable it is.* (Besides, it is described as "play".)]
- 2 Samuel 6: <sup>6</sup> And when they came to Nachon's threshingfloor, Uzzah put forth his hand to the ark of God, and took hold of it; for the oxen shook it. <sup>7</sup> And the anger of the LORD was kindled against Uzzah; and God smote him there for his error; and there he died by the ark of God.
- 1 Chronicles 13: <sup>9</sup> And when they came unto the threshingfloor of Chidon, Uzza put forth his hand to hold the ark; for the oxen stumbled. <sup>10</sup> And the anger of the LORD was kindled against Uzza, and he smote him, because he put his hand to the ark: and there he died before God.
- 2 Samuel 11: <sup>1</sup>And it came to pass, after the year was expired, at the time when kings go forth to battle, that David sent Joab, and his servants with him, and all Israel; and they destroyed the children of Ammon, and besieged Rabbah.
- 2 Samuel 12: <sup>13</sup> And David said unto Nathan, I have sinned against the LORD. And Nathan said unto David, The LORD also hath put away thy sin; thou shalt not die. <sup>14</sup> Howbeit, because by this deed thou hast given great occasion to the enemies of the LORD to blaspheme, the child also that is born unto thee shall surely die. <sup>15</sup> And Nathan departed unto his house. And the LORD struck the child that Uriah's wife bare unto David, and it was very sick.... <sup>18</sup> And it came to pass on the seventh day, that the child died.
- 2 Samuel 12: <sup>31</sup> And he brought forth the people that were therein, and put them under saws, and under harrows of iron, and under axes of iron, and made them pass through the brickkiln: and thus did he unto all the cities of the children of Ammon.
- 1 Chronicles 20: And it came to pass, that after the year was expired, at the time that kings go out to battle.... And Joab smote Rabbah, and destroyed it.... <sup>3</sup> And he brought out the people that were in it, and cut them with saws, and with harrows of iron, and with axes. Even so dealt David with all the cities of the children of Ammon.
- 2 Samuel 21: <sup>1</sup>Then there was a famine in the days of David three years, year after year; and David enquired of the LORD. And the LORD answered, It is for Saul, and for his bloody house, because he slew the Gibeonites.... <sup>3</sup> Wherefore David said unto the Gibeonites, What shall I do for you? and wherewith shall I make the atonement, that ye may bless the inheritance of the LORD?... And they answered the king, The man that consumed us, and that devised against us that we should be destroyed from remaining in any of the coasts of Israel, <sup>6</sup> let seven men of his sons be delivered unto us, and we will hang them up unto the LORD in Gibeah of Saul, whom the LORD did choose. And the king said, I will give them.... <sup>14</sup> ... And after that God was intreated for the land.
- 2 Samuel 24: <sup>1</sup> And again the anger of the LORD was kindled against Israel, and he moved David against them to say, Go, number Israel and Judah.... <sup>10</sup> And David's heart smote him after that he had numbered the people. And David said unto the LORD, I have sinned greatly in that I have done: and now, I beseech thee, O LORD, take away the iniquity of thy servant; for I have done very foolishly. <sup>11</sup> For when David was up in

the morning, the word of the LORD came unto the prophet Gad, David's seer, saying, <sup>12</sup> Go and say unto David, Thus saith the LORD, I offer thee three things; choose thee one of them, that I may do it unto thee. <sup>13</sup> So Gad came to David, and told him, and said unto him, Shall seven years of famine come unto thee in thy land? or wilt thou flee three months before thine enemies, while they pursue thee? or that there be three days' pestilence in thy land? now advise, and see what answer I shall return to him that sent me. <sup>14</sup> And David said unto Gad, I am in a great strait: let us fall now into the hand of the LORD; for his mercies are great: and let me not fall into the hand of man. <sup>15</sup> So the LORD sent a pestilence upon Israel from the morning even to the time appointed: and there died of the people from Dan even to Beersheba seventy thousand men.

- 1 Chronicles 21: <sup>7</sup> And God was displeased with this thing; therefore he smote Israel. <sup>8</sup> And David said unto God, I have sinned greatly, because I have done this thing: but now, I beseech thee, do away the iniquity of thy servant; for I have done very foolishly. <sup>9</sup> And the LORD spake unto Gad, David's seer, saying, <sup>10</sup> Go and tell David, saying, Thus saith the LORD, I offer thee three things: choose thee one of them, that I may do it unto thee. <sup>11</sup> So Gad came to David, and said unto him, Thus saith the LORD, Choose thee <sup>12</sup> either three years' famine; or three months to be destroyed before thy foes, while that the sword of thine enemies overtaketh thee; or else three days the sword of the LORD, even the pestilence, in the land, and the angel of the LORD destroying throughout all the coasts of Israel. Now therefore advise thyself what word I shall bring again to him that sent me. <sup>13</sup> And David said unto Gad, I am in a great strait: let me fall now into the hand of the LORD; for very great are his mercies: but let me not fall into the hand of man. <sup>14</sup> So the LORD sent pestilence upon Israel: and there fell of Israel seventy thousand men.
- 1 Kings 2: <sup>21</sup> And she said, Let Abishag the Shunammite be given to Adonijah thy brother to wife.... <sup>25</sup> And king Solomon sent by the hand of Benaiah the son of Jehoiada; and he fell upon him that he died.... <sup>34</sup> So Benaiah the son of Jehoiada went up, and fell upon[Joab], and slew him.... <sup>46</sup> So the king commanded Benaiah the son of Jehoiada; which went out, and fell upon [Shimei], that he died. And the kingdom was established in the hand of Solomon.
- 1 Kings 8: <sup>5</sup> And king Solomon, and all the congregation of Israel, that were assembled unto him, were with him before the ark, sacrificing sheep and oxen, that could not be told nor numbered for multitude.
- 2 Chronicles 5: <sup>6</sup> Also king Solomon, and all the congregation of Israel that were assembled unto him before the ark, sacrificed sheep and oxen, which could not be told nor numbered for multitude.
- [Note: The Bible is, of course, filled with references to killing animals to keep god appeased. I have not included them all here, else this would be a very long document, indeed. I have only included this one incident in which the killing "could not be...numbered". (In other places in the Bible it is told that a king offered tens of thousands of animals for sacrifice [e.g. 2 Chronicles 7:5: And king Solomon offered a sacrifice of twenty and two thousand oxen, and an hundred and twenty thousand sheep], so it can only be presumed that "could not be told nor numbered for multitude" is more than this.)]
- 1 Kings 11: <sup>15</sup> For it came to pass, when David was in Edom, and Joab the captain of the host was gone up to bury the slain, after he had smitten every male in Edom; <sup>16</sup> (for six months did Joab remain there with all Israel, until he had cut off every male in Edom:)
- 1 Kings 13: <sup>8</sup> And the man of God said unto the king, If thou wilt give me half thine house, I will not go in with thee, neither will I eat bread nor drink water in this place: <sup>9</sup> for so was it charged me by the word of the LORD, saying, Eat no bread, nor drink water, nor turn again by the same way that thou camest.... <sup>11</sup> Now there dwelt an old prophet in Beth-el... <sup>15</sup> Then he said unto him, Come home with me, and eat bread. <sup>16</sup> And he said, I may not return with thee, nor go in with thee: neither will I eat bread nor drink water with thee in this place: <sup>17</sup> for it was said to me by the word of the LORD, Thou shalt eat no bread nor drink water there, nor turn again to go by the way that thou camest. <sup>18</sup> He said unto him, I am a prophet also as thou art; and an angel spake unto me by the word of the LORD, saying, Bring him back with thee into

thine house, that he may eat bread and drink water. But he lied unto him. <sup>19</sup>So he went back with him, and did eat bread in his house, and drank water. <sup>20</sup>And it came to pass, as they sat at the table, that the word of the LORD came unto the prophet that brought him back: <sup>21</sup> and he cried unto the man of God that came from Judah, saying, Thus saith the LORD, Forasmuch as thou hast disobeyed the mouth of the LORD, and hast not kept the commandment which the LORD thy God commanded thee, <sup>22</sup> but camest back, and hast eaten bread and drunk water in the place, of the which the LORD did say to thee, Eat no bread, and drink no water; thy carcase shall not come unto the sepulchre of thy fathers.... <sup>24</sup> And when he was gone, a lion met him by the way, and slew him

- 1 Kings 14: <sup>7</sup> Go, tell Jeroboam, Thus saith the LORD God of Israel, Forasmuch as I exalted thee from among the people, and made thee prince over my people Israel, <sup>8</sup> and rent the kingdom away from the house of David, and gave it thee: and yet thou hast not been as my servant David, who kept my commandments, and who followed me with all his heart, to do that only which was right in mine eyes; <sup>9</sup> but hast done evil above all that were before thee: for thou hast gone and made thee other gods, and molten images, to provoke me to anger, and hast cast me behind thy back: <sup>10</sup> therefore, behold, I will bring evil upon the house of Jeroboam, and will cut off from Jeroboam him that pisseth against the wall, and him that is shut up and left in Israel, and will take away the remnant of the house of Jeroboam, as a man taketh away dung, till it be all gone.... <sup>12</sup> Arise thou therefore, get thee to thine own house: and when thy feet enter into the city, the child shall die.... <sup>17</sup> ...and when she came to the threshold of the door, the child died
- 1 Kings 15: <sup>29</sup> And it came to pass, when he reigned, that he smote all the house of Jeroboam; he left not to Jeroboam any that breathed, until he had destroyed him, according unto the saying of the LORD, which he spake by his servant Ahijah the Shilonite: <sup>30</sup> because of the sins of Jeroboam which he sinned, and which he made Israel sin, by his provocation wherewith he provoked the LORD God of Israel to anger.
- 1 Kings 16: <sup>11</sup> And it came to pass, when he began to reign, as soon as he sat on his throne, that he slew all the house of Baasha: he left him not one that pisseth against a wall, neither of his kinsfolks, nor of his friends. <sup>12</sup> Thus did Zimri destroy all the house of Baasha, according to the word of the LORD, which he spake against Baasha by Jehu the prophet, <sup>13</sup> for all the sins of Baasha, and the sins of Elah his son, by which they sinned, and by which they made Israel to sin, in provoking the LORD God of Israel to anger with their vanities.
- 1 Kings 16: <sup>34</sup> In his days did Hiel the Beth-elite build Jericho: he laid the foundation thereof in Abiram his firstborn, and set up the gates thereof in his youngest son Segub, according to the word of the LORD, which he spake by Joshua the son of Nun.
- 1 Kings 17: <sup>1</sup> And Elijah the Tishbite, who was of the inhabitants of Gilead, said unto Ahab, As the LORD God of Israel liveth, before whom I stand, there shall not be dew nor rain these years, but according to my word.... <sup>7</sup> And it came to pass after a while, that the brook dried up, because there had been no rain in the land.... 1 Kings 18: <sup>2</sup> ...And there was a sore famine in Samaria.... <sup>19</sup> Now therefore send, and gather to me all Israel unto mount Carmel.... <sup>33</sup> And he put the wood in order, and cut the bullock in pieces, and laid him on the wood, and said, Fill four barrels with water, and pour it on the burnt sacrifice, and on the wood. <sup>34</sup> And he said, Do it the second time. And they did it the second time. And he said, Do it the third time... <sup>40</sup> And Elijah said unto them, Take the prophets of Baal; let not one of them escape. And they took them: and Elijah brought them down to the brook Kishon, and slew them there.
- 1 Kings 20: <sup>35</sup> And a certain man of the sons of the prophets said unto his neighbour in the word of the LORD, Smite me, I pray thee. And the man refused to smite him. <sup>36</sup> Then said he unto him, Because thou hast

not obeyed the voice of the LORD, behold, as soon as thou art departed from me, a lion shall slay thee. And as soon as he was departed from him, a lion found him, and slew him.

- 2 Kings 1: <sup>9</sup>Then the king sent unto him a captain of fifty with his fifty. And he went up to him: and, behold, he sat on the top of an hill. And he spake unto him, Thou man of God, the king hath said, Come down. <sup>10</sup> And Elijah answered and said to the captain of fifty, If I be a man of God, then let fire come down from heaven, and consume thee and thy fifty. And there came down fire from heaven, and consumed him and his fifty. <sup>11</sup> Again also he sent unto him another captain of fifty with his fifty. And he answered and said unto him, O man of God, thus hath the king said, Come down quickly. <sup>12</sup> And Elijah answered and said unto them, If I be a man of God, let fire come down from heaven, and consume thee and thy fifty. And the fire of God came down from heaven, and consumed him and his fifty.... <sup>16</sup> And he said unto him, Thus saith the LORD, Forasmuch as thou hast sent messengers to enquire of Baal-zebub the god of Ekron, is it not because there is no God in Israel to enquire of his word? therefore thou shalt not come down off that bed on which thou art gone up, but shalt surely die, <sup>17</sup> So he died according to the word of the LORD which Elijah had spoken.
- 2 Kings 2: <sup>23</sup> And he[Elisha] went up from thence unto Beth-el: and as he was going up by the way, there came forth little children out of the city, and mocked him, and said unto him, Go up, thou bald head; go up, thou bald head. <sup>24</sup> And he turned back, and looked on them, and cursed them in the name of the LORD. And there came forth two she bears out of the wood, and tare forty and two children of them.
- 2 Kings 8: <sup>1</sup>Then spake Elisha unto the woman, whose son he had restored to life, saying, Arise, and go thou and thine household, and sojourn wheresoever thou canst sojourn: for the LORD hath called for a famine; and it shall also come upon the land seven years.
- 2 Kings 10: <sup>6</sup>Then he wrote a letter the second time to them, saying, If ye be mine, and if ye will hearken unto my voice, take ye the heads of the men your master's sons, and come to me to Jezreel by to morrow this time. Now the king's sons, being seventy persons, were with the great men of the city, which brought them up. <sup>7</sup> And it came to pass, when the letter came to them, that they took the king's sons, and slew seventy persons, and put their heads in baskets, and sent him them to Jezreel.... <sup>9</sup> And it came to pass in the morning, that he went out, and stood, and said to all the people.... <sup>10</sup> Know now that there shall fall unto the earth nothing of the word of the LORD, which the LORD spake concerning the house of Ahab: for the LORD hath done that which he spake by his servant Elijah.... <sup>17</sup> And when he came to Samaria, he slew all that remained unto Ahab in Samaria, till he had destroyed him, according to the saying of the LORD, which he spake to Elijah.
- 2 Kings 17: <sup>25</sup> And so it was at the beginning of their dwelling there, that they feared not the LORD: therefore the LORD sent lions among them, which slew some of them.
- 2 Kings 23: <sup>20</sup> And [Josiah] slew all the priests of the high places that were there upon the altars
- 1 Chronicles 5: <sup>22</sup> For there fell down many slain, because the war was of God.
- 2 Chronicles 13: <sup>20</sup> Neither did Jeroboam recover strength again in the days of Abijah: and the LORD struck him, and he died.
- 2 Chronicles 14: <sup>13</sup> And Asa and the people that were with him pursued them unto Gerar: and the Ethiopians were overthrown, that they could not recover themselves; for they were destroyed before the LORD, and before his host; and they carried away very much spoil. <sup>14</sup> And they smote all the cities round about Gerar; for the fear of the LORD came upon them: and they spoiled all the cities; for there was exceeding

- much spoil in them. <sup>15</sup> They smote also the tents of cattle, and carried away sheep and camels in abundance, and returned to Jerusalem.
- 2 Chronicles 15: <sup>12</sup> And they entered into a covenant to seek the LORD God of their fathers with all their heart and with all their soul; <sup>13</sup> that whosoever would not seek the LORD God of Israel should be put to death, whether small or great, whether man or woman.
- 2 Chronicles 21: <sup>18</sup> And after all this the LORD smote him in his bowels with an incurable disease. <sup>19</sup> And it came to pass, that in process of time, after the end of two years, his bowels fell out by reason of his sickness: so he died of sore diseases.
- Esther 9: <sup>13</sup> Then said Esther, If it please the king, let it be granted to the Jews which are in Shushan to do to morrow also according unto this day's decree, and let Haman's ten sons be hanged upon the gallows. <sup>14</sup> And the king commanded it so to be done: and the decree was given at Shushan; and they hanged Haman's ten sons. <sup>15</sup> For the Jews that were in Shushan gathered themselves together on the fourteenth day also of the month Adar, and slew three hundred men at Shushan
- Job 1: <sup>8</sup> And the LORD said unto Satan, Hast thou considered my servant Job, that there is none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil? <sup>9</sup> Then Satan answered the LORD, and said, Doth Job fear God for nought? <sup>10</sup> Hast not thou made an hedge about him, and about his house, and about all that he hath on every side? thou hast blessed the work of his hands, and his substance is increased in the land. <sup>11</sup> But put forth thine hand now, and touch all that he hath, and he will curse thee to thy face. <sup>12</sup> And the LORD said unto Satan, Behold, all that he hath is in thy power; only upon himself put not forth thine hand.... <sup>18</sup> While he was yet speaking, there came also another, and said, Thy sons and thy daughters were eating and drinking wine in their eldest brother's house: <sup>19</sup> and, behold, there came a great wind from the wilderness, and smote the four corners of the house, and it fell upon the young men, and they are dead; and I only am escaped alone to tell thee.
- Job 9: <sup>22</sup> This is one thing, therefore I said it, He destroyeth the perfect and the wicked.
- Psalm 136: <sup>1</sup>O give thanks unto the LORD; for he is good: for his mercy endureth for ever.... <sup>10</sup>To him that smote Egypt in their firstborn: for his mercy endureth for ever.... <sup>15</sup> but overthrew Pharaoh and his host in the Red sea: for his mercy endureth for ever.... <sup>17</sup>To him which smote great kings: for his mercy endureth for ever: <sup>18</sup> and slew famous kings: for his mercy endureth for ever
- Psalm 137: <sup>8</sup>O daughter of Babylon, who art to be destroyed; happy shall he be, that rewardeth thee as thou hast served us. <sup>9</sup>Happy shall he be, that taketh and dasheth thy little ones against the stones.
- Proverbs 23: <sup>13</sup> Withhold not correction from the child: for if thou beatest him with the rod, he shall not die. <sup>14</sup> Thou shalt beat him with the rod, and shalt deliver his soul from hell
- Isaiah 13: <sup>13</sup> Therefore I will shake the heavens, and the earth shall remove out of her place, in the wrath of the LORD of hosts, and in the day of his fierce anger.... <sup>15</sup> Every one that is found shall be thrust through; and every one that is joined unto them shall fall by the sword. <sup>16</sup> Their children also shall be dashed to pieces before their eyes; their houses shall be spoiled, and their wives ravished.
- Isaiah 14: <sup>21</sup> Prepare slaughter for his children for the iniquity of their fathers
- Isaiah 19: <sup>2</sup> And I will set the Egyptians against the Egyptians: and they shall fight every one against his brother, and every one against his neighbour; city against city, and kingdom against kingdom.

- Jeremiah 11: <sup>22</sup> therefore thus saith the LORD of hosts, Behold, I will punish them: the young men shall die by the sword; their sons and their daughters shall die by famine: <sup>23</sup> and there shall be no remnant of them
- Jeremiah 15: <sup>7</sup> And I will fan them with a fan in the gates of the land; I will bereave them of children, I will destroy my people, since they return not from their ways. <sup>8</sup> Their widows are increased to me above the sand of the seas: I have brought upon them against the mother of the young men a spoiler at noonday: I have caused him to fall upon it suddenly, and terrors upon the city.
- Jeremiah 18: <sup>21</sup> Therefore deliver up their children to the famine, and pour out their blood by the force of the sword; and let their wives be bereaved of their children, and be widows
- Jeremiah 19: <sup>9</sup> And I will cause them to eat the flesh of their sons and the flesh of their daughters, and they shall eat every one the flesh of his friend in the siege and straitness
- Jeremiah 25: <sup>33</sup> And the slain of the LORD shall be at that day from one end of the earth even unto the other end of the earth
- Jeremiah 50: <sup>21</sup> Go up against the land of Merathaim, even against it, and against the inhabitants of Pekod: waste and utterly destroy after them, saith the LORD, and do according to all that I have commanded thee.... <sup>26</sup> Come against her from the utmost border, open her storehouses: cast her up as heaps, and destroy her utterly: let nothing of her be left.... <sup>29</sup> Call together the archers against Babylon: all ye that bend the bow, camp against it round about; let none thereof escape
- Jeremiah 51: <sup>22</sup> with thee also will I break in pieces man and woman; and with thee will I break in pieces old and young; and with thee will I break in pieces the young man and the maid
- Lamentations 2: <sup>20</sup> Behold, O LORD, and consider to whom thou hast done this. Shall the women eat their fruit, and children of a span long? shall the priest and the prophet be slain in the sanctuary of the Lord? <sup>21</sup> The young and the old lie on the ground in the streets: my virgins and my young men are fallen by the sword; thou hast slain them in the day of thine anger; thou hast killed, and not pitied
- Ezekiel 9: <sup>4</sup> and the LORD said unto him... <sup>5</sup> ... Go ye after him through the city, and smite: let not your eye spare, neither have ye pity: <sup>6</sup> slay utterly old and young, both maids, and little children, and women
- Ezekiel 21: <sup>1</sup> And the word of the LORD came unto me, saying, <sup>2</sup> Son of man, set thy face toward Jerusalem, and drop thy word toward the holy places, and prophesy against the land of Israel, <sup>3</sup> and say to the land of Israel, Thus saith the LORD; Behold, I am against thee, and will draw forth my sword out of his sheath, and will cut off from thee the righteous and the wicked. <sup>4</sup> Seeing then that I will cut off from thee the righteous and the wicked, therefore shall my sword go forth out of his sheath against all flesh from the south to the north: <sup>5</sup> that all flesh may know that I the LORD have drawn forth my sword out of his sheath: it shall not return any more.
- Ezekiel 24: <sup>15</sup> Also the word of the LORD came unto me, saying, <sup>16</sup> Son of man, behold, I take away from thee the desire of thine eyes with a stroke: yet neither shalt thou mourn nor weep, neither shall thy tears run down. <sup>17</sup> Forbear to cry, make no mourning for the dead, bind the tire of thine head upon thee, and put on thy shoes upon thy feet, and cover not thy lips, and eat not the bread of men. <sup>18</sup> So I spake unto the people in the morning: and at even my wife died

- Hosea 9: <sup>14</sup> Give them, O LORD: what wilt thou give? give them a miscarrying womb and dry breasts.... <sup>16</sup> yea, though they bring forth, yet will I slay even the beloved fruit of their womb
- Hosea 13: <sup>16</sup> Samaria shall become desolate; for she hath rebelled against her God: they shall fall by the sword: their infants shall be dashed in pieces, and their women with child shall be ripped up.
- Zechariah 13: <sup>3</sup> And it shall come to pass, that when any shall yet prophesy, then his father and his mother that begat him shall say unto him, Thou shalt not live; for thou speakest lies in the name of the LORD: and his father and his mother that begat him shall thrust him through when he prophesieth.
- Zechariah 14: <sup>1</sup>Behold, the day of the LORD cometh, and thy spoil shall be divided in the midst of thee. <sup>2</sup> For I will gather all nations against Jerusalem to battle; and the city shall be taken, and the houses rifled, and the women ravished
- Matthew 2: <sup>16</sup> Then Herod, when he saw that he was mocked of the wise men, was exceeding wroth, and sent forth, and slew all the children that were in Bethlehem, and in all the coasts thereof, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had diligently enquired of the wise men. <sup>17</sup> Then was fulfilled that which was spoken by Jeremy the prophet, saying, <sup>18</sup> In Rama was there a voice heard, lamentation, and weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, and would not be comforted, because they are not. [*Note: God had warned Mary and Joseph so they could flee to Egypt, leaving all the others to their fate.*]
- Matthew 22: <sup>11</sup> And when the king came in to see the guests, he saw there a man which had not on a wedding garment: <sup>12</sup> and he saith unto him, Friend, how camest thou in hither not having a wedding garment? And he was speechless. <sup>13</sup> Then said the king to the servants, Bind him hand and foot, and take him away, and cast him into outer darkness; there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.
- Acts 4: <sup>34</sup> Neither was there any among them that lacked: for as many as were possessors of lands or houses sold them, and brought the prices of the things that were sold, <sup>35</sup> and laid them down at the apostles' feet: and distribution was made unto every man according as he had need.... Acts 5: <sup>1</sup> But a certain man named Ananias, with Sapphira his wife, sold a possession, <sup>2</sup> and kept back part of the price, his wife also being privy to it, and brought a certain part, and laid it at the apostles' feet. <sup>3</sup> But Peter said, Ananias, why hath Satan filled thine heart to lie to the Holy Ghost, and to keep back part of the price of the land? <sup>4</sup> Whiles it remained, was it not thine own? and after it was sold, was it not in thine own power? why hast thou conceived this thing in thine heart? thou hast not lied unto men, but unto God. <sup>5</sup> And Ananias hearing these words fell down, and gave up the ghost.... <sup>7</sup> And it was about the space of three hours after, when his wife, not knowing what was done, came in. <sup>8</sup> And Peter answered unto her, Tell me whether ye sold the land for so much? And she said, Yea, for so much. <sup>9</sup> Then Peter said unto her, How is it that ye have agreed together to tempt the Spirit of the Lord? behold, the feet of them which have buried thy husband are at the door, and shall carry thee out. <sup>10</sup> Then fell she down straightway at his feet, and yielded up the ghost
- Acts 12: <sup>21</sup> And upon a set day Herod, arrayed in royal apparel, sat upon his throne, and made an oration unto them. <sup>22</sup> And the people gave a shout, saying, It is the voice of a god, and not of a man. <sup>23</sup> And immediately the angel of the Lord smote him, because he gave not God the glory: and he was eaten of worms, and gave up the ghost.
- Revelation 9: <sup>5</sup> And to them it was given that they should not kill them, but that they should be tormented five months: and their torment was as the torment of a scorpion, when he striketh a man.

#### CHAPTER 2 GOD'S EVILNESS AND HATRED

God is love? Evil comes from the devil? Think again.

- Exodus 32: <sup>14</sup> And the LORD repented of the evil which he thought to do unto his people.
- Joshua 23: 15 ... so shall the LORD bring upon you all evil things, until he have destroyed you from off this good land which the LORD your God hath given you.
- Judges 2: 15 Whithersoever they went out, the hand of the LORD was against them for evil
- Judges 9: <sup>23</sup> then God sent an evil spirit between Abimelech and the men of Shechem
- 1 Samuel 16: <sup>14</sup> But the Spirit of the LORD departed from Saul, and an evil spirit from the LORD troubled him.... <sup>23</sup> And it came to pass, when the evil spirit from God was upon Saul, that David took an harp, and played with his hand: so Saul was refreshed, and was well, and the evil spirit departed from him.
- 1 Samuel 18: 10 And it came to pass on the morrow, that the evil spirit from God came upon Saul
- 1 Samuel 19: <sup>9</sup> And the evil spirit from the LORD was upon Saul, as he sat in his house with his javelin in his hand: and David played with his hand. <sup>10</sup> And Saul sought to smite David even to the wall with the javelin; but he slipped away out of Saul's presence
- 2 Samuel 12: <sup>11</sup> Thus saith the LORD, Behold, I will raise up evil against thee out of thine own house, and I will take thy wives before thine eyes, and give them unto thy neighbour, and he shall lie with thy wives in the sight of this sun.
- 2 Samuel 24: <sup>16</sup> And when the angel stretched out his hand upon Jerusalem to destroy it, the LORD repented him of the evil
- 1 Chronicles 21: <sup>15</sup> And God sent an angel unto Jerusalem to destroy it: and as he was destroying, the LORD beheld, and he repented him of the evil
- I Kings 9: 9... therefore hath the LORD brought upon them all this evil
- 1 Kings 14: <sup>7</sup> Go, tell Jeroboam, Thus saith the LORD God of Israel.... <sup>10</sup> therefore, behold, I will bring evil upon the house of Jeroboam
- 1 Kings 21: <sup>28</sup> And the word of the LORD came to Elijah the Tishbite, saying... <sup>29</sup> I bring the evil upon his house
- 1 Kings 22: <sup>23</sup> Now therefore, behold, the LORD hath put a lying spirit in the mouth of all these thy prophets, and the LORD hath spoken evil concerning thee.
- 2 Chronicles 18: <sup>22</sup> Now therefore, behold, the LORD hath put a lying spirit in the mouth of these thy prophets, and the LORD hath spoken evil against thee.
- 2 Kings 21: <sup>12</sup> therefore thus saith the LORD God of Israel, Behold, I am bringing such evil upon Jerusalem and Judah, that whosoever heareth of it, both his ears shall tingle.

- 2 Kings 22: <sup>16</sup> Thus saith the LORD, Behold, I will bring evil upon this place, and upon the inhabitants thereof.... thine eyes shall not see all the evil which I will bring upon this place.
- 2 Chronicles 34: <sup>24</sup> Thus saith the LORD, Behold, I will bring evil upon this place, and upon the inhabitants thereof.... <sup>28</sup> ... neither shall thine eyes see all the evil that I will bring upon this place
- 2 Chronicles 7: <sup>22</sup> And it shall be answered, Because they forsook the LORD God of their fathers, which brought them forth out of the land of Egypt, and laid hold on other gods, and worshipped them, and served them: therefore hath he brought all this evil upon them.
- Nehemiah 13: 18 Did not your fathers thus, and did not our God bring all this evil upon us, and upon this city?
- Job 2: <sup>10</sup> But he said unto her, ... What? shall we receive good at the hand of God, and shall we not receive evil?... Job 42: <sup>11</sup> ... and they bemoaned him, and comforted him over all the evil that the Lord had brought upon him.
- Job 6: <sup>1</sup> But Job answered and said.... <sup>4</sup> For the arrows of the Almighty are within me, the poison whereof drinketh up my spirit: the terrors of God do set themselves in array against me.... Job 29: <sup>1</sup> Moreover Job continued his parable, and said.... Job 31: <sup>23</sup> For destruction from God was a terror to me.... Job 42: <sup>7</sup> And it was so, that after the LORD had spoken these words unto Job, the LORD said to Eliphaz the Temanite, My wrath is kindled against thee, and against thy two friends: for ye have not spoken of me the thing that is right, as my servant Job hath.
- Psalm 11: <sup>5</sup> The LORD trieth the righteous: but the wicked and him that loveth violence his soul hateth.
- Psalm 54: <sup>4</sup> Behold, God is mine helper... <sup>5</sup> He shall reward evil unto mine enemies
- Psalm 78: <sup>49</sup> [God] cast upon them the fierceness of his anger, wrath, and indignation, and trouble, by sending evil angels among them
- Isaiah 45: <sup>7</sup>I make peace, and create evil: I the LORD do all these things.
- Isaiah 63: <sup>17</sup> O LORD, why hast thou made us to err from thy ways, and hardened our heart from thy fear?
- Jeremiah 6: 19 Hear, O earth: behold, I will bring evil upon this people
- Jeremiah 11: <sup>17</sup> For the LORD of hosts, that planted thee, hath pronounced evil against thee.... <sup>22</sup> therefore thus saith the LORD of hosts, ... I will bring evil upon the men of Anathoth
- Jeremiah 16: <sup>10</sup> And it shall come to pass, when thou shalt shew this people all these words, and they shall say unto thee, Wherefore hath the LORD pronounced all this great evil against us? or what is our iniquity? or what is our sin that we have committed against the LORD our God? <sup>11</sup> Then shalt thou say unto them, Because your fathers have forsaken me, saith the LORD
- Jeremiah 18: <sup>5</sup> Then the word of the LORD came to me, saying,.... <sup>8</sup> if that nation, against whom I have pronounced, turn from their evil, I will repent of the evil that I thought to do unto them.... <sup>11</sup> ... Thus saith the LORD; Behold, I frame evil against you

- Jeremiah 19: <sup>3</sup> ... Thus saith the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel; Behold, I will bring evil upon this place....

  <sup>15</sup> Thus saith the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel; Behold, I will bring upon this city and upon all her towns all the evil that I have pronounced against it
- Jeremiah 21: 10 For I have set my face against this city for evil, and not for good, saith the LORD
- Jeremiah 23: 12 ... for I will bring evil upon them, even the year of their visitation, saith the LORD
- Jeremiah 25: <sup>27</sup> Therefore thou shalt say unto them, Thus saith the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel... <sup>29</sup> For, lo, I begin to bring evil on the city which is called by my name

- Jeremiah 44: <sup>2</sup>Thus saith the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel; Ye have seen all the evil that I have brought upon Jerusalem, and upon all the cities of Judah.... <sup>11</sup>Therefore thus saith the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel; Behold, I will set my face against you for evil.... <sup>25</sup>Thus saith the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel... <sup>27</sup>Behold, I will watch over them for evil, and not for good.... <sup>29</sup>And this shall be a sign unto you, saith the LORD, that I will punish you in this place, that ye may know that my words shall surely stand against you for evil
- Jeremiah 45: 5 ... for, behold, I will bring evil upon all flesh, saith the LORD
- Jeremiah 49: 37 ... and I will bring evil upon them, even my fierce anger, saith the LORD

# CHAPTER 3 BIBLICAL MORALITY AND JUSTICE

Does the Bible teach good moral principles and uphold justice? Read the following passages and ask yourself if you would like your children to take their moral values from the Bible!

Genesis 9: <sup>20</sup> And Noah began to be an husbandman, and he planted a vineyard: <sup>21</sup> and he drank of the wine, and was drunken; and he was uncovered within his tent. <sup>22</sup> And Ham, the father of Canaan, saw the nakedness of his father, and told his two brethren without. <sup>23</sup> And Shem and Japheth took a garment, and laid it upon both their shoulders, and went backward, and covered the nakedness of their father; and their faces were backward, and they saw not their father's nakedness. <sup>24</sup> And Noah awoke from his wine, and knew what his younger son had done unto him. <sup>25</sup> And he said, Cursed be Canaan; a servant of servants shall he be unto his brethren.

Genesis 12: <sup>11</sup> And it came to pass, when he was come near to enter into Egypt, that he said unto Sarai his wife, Behold now, I know that thou art a fair woman to look upon: <sup>12</sup> therefore it shall come to pass, when the Egyptians shall see thee, that they shall say, This is his wife: and they will kill me, but they will save thee alive. <sup>13</sup> Say, I pray thee, thou art my sister: that it may be well with me for thy sake; and my soul shall live because of thee.... <sup>17</sup> And the LORD plagued Pharaoh and his house with great plagues because of Sarai Abram's wife

Genesis 16: <sup>3</sup> And Sarai Abram's wife took Hagar her maid the Egyptian, after Abram had dwelt ten years in the land of Canaan, and gave her to her husband Abram to be his wife. <sup>4</sup> And he went in unto Hagar, and she conceived: and when she saw that she had conceived, her mistress was despised in her eyes. ... <sup>6</sup> But Abram said unto Sarai, Behold, thy maid is in thy hand; do to her as it pleaseth thee. And when Sarai dealt hardly with her, she fled from her face.

Genesis 19: <sup>6</sup> And Lot went out at the door unto them, and shut the door after him, <sup>7</sup> and said, I pray you, brethren, do not so wickedly. <sup>8</sup> Behold now, I have two daughters which have not known man; let me, I pray you, bring them out unto you, and do ye to them as is good in your eyes...

- Genesis 21: <sup>12</sup> And God said unto Abraham, Let it not be grievous in thy sight because of the lad, and because of thy bondwoman; in all that Sarah hath said unto thee, hearken unto her voice ... <sup>14</sup> And Abraham rose up early in the morning, and took bread, and a bottle of water, and gave it unto Hagar, putting it on her shoulder, and the child, and sent her away: and she departed, and wandered in the wilderness of Beersheba.
- Genesis 22: <sup>1</sup> And it came to pass after these things, that God did tempt Abraham, and said unto him, Abraham: and he said, Behold, here I am. <sup>2</sup> And he said, Take now thy son, thine only son Isaac, whom thou lovest, and get thee into the land of Moriah; and offer him there for a burnt offering upon one of the mountains which I will tell thee of. ... <sup>10</sup> And Abraham stretched forth his hand, and took the knife to slay his son.
- Genesis 25: <sup>6</sup> But unto the sons of the concubines, which Abraham had, Abraham gave gifts
- Genesis 25: <sup>30</sup> and Esau said to Jacob, Feed me, I pray thee, with that same red pottage; for I am faint: therefore was his name called Edom. <sup>31</sup> And Jacob said, Sell me this day thy birthright. <sup>32</sup> And Esau said, Behold, I am at the point to die: and what profit shall this birthright do to me? <sup>33</sup> And Jacob said, Swear to me this day; and he sware unto him: and he sold his birthright unto Jacob.
- Genesis 27: <sup>1</sup> And it came to pass, that when Isaac was old, and his eyes were dim, so that he could not see.... <sup>19</sup> And Jacob said unto his father, I am Esau thy firstborn; I have done according as thou badest me: arise, I pray thee, sit and eat of my venison, that thy soul may bless me.... <sup>27</sup> And he came near, and kissed him: and he smelled the smell of his raiment, and blessed him, and said, See, the smell of my son is as the smell of a field which the Lord hath blessed: <sup>28</sup> therefore God give thee of the dew of heaven, and the fatness of the earth, and plenty of corn and wine: <sup>29</sup> let people serve thee, and nations bow down to thee: be lord over thy brethren, and let thy mother's sons bow down to thee: cursed be every one that curseth thee, and blessed be he that blesseth thee. <sup>30</sup> And it came to pass, as soon as Isaac had made an end of blessing Jacob, and Jacob was yet scarce gone out from the presence of Isaac his father, that Esau his brother came in from his hunting. <sup>31</sup> And he also had made savoury meat, and brought it unto his father, and said unto his father, Let my father arise, and eat of his son's venison, that thy soul may bless me.... <sup>35</sup> And he said, Thy brother came with subtilty, and hath taken away thy blessing.... <sup>37</sup> And Isaac answered and said unto Esau, Behold, I have made him thy lord, and all his brethren have I given to him for servants
- Malachi 1: 2...Was not Esau Jacob's brother? saith the LORD: yet I loved Jacob, 3 and I hated Esau
- Genesis 26: <sup>6</sup> And Isaac dwelt in Gerar: <sup>7</sup> and the men of the place asked him of his wife; and he said, She is my sister: for he feared to say, She is my wife; lest, said he, the men of the place should kill me for Rebekah; because she was fair to look upon. ... <sup>12</sup> Then Isaac sowed in that land, and received in the same year an hundredfold: and the LORD blessed him.
- Genesis 29: <sup>15</sup> And Laban said unto Jacob, Because thou art my brother, shouldest thou therefore serve me for nought? tell me, what shall thy wages be? ... <sup>18</sup> And Jacob loved Rachel; and said, I will serve thee seven years for Rachel thy younger daughter.
- Genesis 30: <sup>1</sup> And when Rachel saw that she bare Jacob no children, Rachel envied her sister ... <sup>3</sup> And she said, Behold my maid Bilhah, go in unto her; and she shall bear upon my knees, that I may also have children by her. <sup>4</sup> And she gave him Bilhah her handmaid to wife: and Jacob went in unto her.... <sup>9</sup> When Leah saw that she had left bearing, she took Zilpah her maid, and gave her Jacob to wife.
- Genesis 30: <sup>14</sup> And Reuben went in the days of wheat harvest, and found mandrakes in the field, and brought them unto his mother Leah. Then Rachel said to Leah, Give me, I pray thee, of thy son's mandrakes.

- <sup>15</sup> And she said unto her, Is it a small matter that thou hast taken my husband? and wouldest thou take away my son's mandrakes also? And Rachel said, Therefore he shall lie with thee to night for thy son's mandrakes. <sup>16</sup> And Jacob came out of the field in the evening, and Leah went out to meet him, and said, Thou must come in unto me; for surely I have hired thee with my son's mandrakes. And he lay with her that night.
- Genesis 31: 9 Thus God hath taken away the cattle of your father, and given them to me.
- Genesis 38: <sup>13</sup> And it was told Tamar, saying, Behold thy father in law goeth up to Timnath to shear his sheep. <sup>14</sup> And she put her widow's garments off from her, and covered her with a vail, and wrapped herself, and sat in an open place... <sup>15</sup> When Judah saw her, he thought her to be an harlot; because she had covered her face. <sup>16</sup> And he turned unto her by the way, and said, Go to, I pray thee, let me come in unto thee; (for he knew not that she was his daughter in law.) <sup>18</sup>...And he gave it her, and came in unto her, and she conceived by him.
- Genesis 47: <sup>13</sup> And there was no bread in all the land; for the famine was very sore.... <sup>20</sup> And Joseph bought all the land of Egypt for Pharaoh; for the Egyptians sold every man his field, because the famine prevailed over them: so the land became Pharaoh's. <sup>21</sup> And as for the people, he removed them to cities from one end of the borders of Egypt even to the other end thereof... <sup>23</sup> Then Joseph said unto the people, Behold, I have bought you this day and your land for Pharaoh... <sup>25</sup> And they said... we will be Pharaoh's servants.
- Exodus 11: <sup>2</sup> Speak now in the ears of the people, and let every man borrow of his neighbour, and every woman of her neighbour, jewels of silver, and jewels of gold.... Exodus 11: <sup>35</sup> And the children of Israel did according to the word of Moses; and they borrowed of the Egyptians jewels of silver, and jewels of gold, and raiment <sup>36</sup> ... And they spoiled the Egyptians.
- Exodus 20: 5 ... I the LORD thy God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me
- Exodus 21: <sup>2</sup> If thou buy an Hebrew servant, six years he shall serve: and in the seventh he shall go out free for nothing. <sup>3</sup> If he came in by himself, he shall go out by himself: if he were married, then his wife shall go out with him. <sup>4</sup> If his master have given him a wife, and she have born him sons or daughters; the wife and her children shall be her master's, and he shall go out by himself.... <sup>7</sup> And if a man sell his daughter to be a maidservant, she shall not go out as the menservants do. <sup>8</sup> If she please not her master, who hath betrothed her to himself, then shall he let her be redeemed.... <sup>10</sup> If he take him another wife; her food, her raiment, and her duty of marriage, shall he not diminish. <sup>11</sup> And if he do not these three unto her, then shall she go out free without money.
- Exodus 21: <sup>20</sup> And if a man smite his servant, or his maid, with a rod, and he die under his hand; he shall be surely punished. <sup>21</sup> Notwithstanding, if he continue a day or two, he shall not be punished: for he is his money.
- Exodus 21: <sup>22</sup> If men strive, and hurt a woman with child, so that her fruit depart from her, and yet no mischief follow: he shall be surely punished, according as the woman's husband will lay upon him
- Exodus 21: <sup>28</sup> If an ox gore a man or a woman, that they die.... <sup>29</sup> if the ox were wont to push with his horn in time past ... his owner also shall be put to death.... <sup>32</sup> If the ox shall push a manservant or a maidservant; he shall give unto their master thirty shekels of silver.

- Exodus 34: <sup>6</sup> And the LORD passed by before him, and proclaimed, The LORD, The LORD God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abundant in goodness and truth, <sup>7</sup> .... visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children, and upon the children's children, unto the third and to the fourth generation.
- Leviticus 12: <sup>1</sup> And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, <sup>2</sup> Speak unto the children of Israel, saying, If a woman have conceived seed, and born a man child: then she shall be unclean seven days; according to the days of the separation for her infirmity shall she be unclean. <sup>3</sup> And in the eighth day the flesh of his foreskin shall be circumcised. <sup>4</sup> And she shall then continue in the blood of her purifying three and thirty days; she shall touch no hallowed thing, nor come into the sanctuary, until the days of her purifying be fulfilled. <sup>5</sup> But if she bear a maid child, then she shall be unclean two weeks, as in her separation: and she shall continue in the blood of her purifying threescore and six days.
- Leviticus 19: <sup>20</sup> And whosoever lieth carnally with a woman, that is a bondmaid, betrothed to an husband, and not at all redeemed, nor freedom given her; she shall be scourged.... <sup>21</sup> And he shall bring his trespass offering unto the LORD
- Leviticus 21: <sup>16</sup> And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, <sup>17</sup> Speak unto Aaron, saying, Whosoever he be of thy seed in their generations that hath any blemish, let him not approach to offer the bread of his God. <sup>18</sup> For whatsoever man he be that hath a blemish, he shall not approach: a blind man, or a lame, or he that hath a flat nose, or any thing superfluous, <sup>19</sup> or a man that is brokenfooted, or brokenhanded, <sup>20</sup> or crookbackt, or a dwarf, or that hath a blemish in his eye, or be scurvy, or scabbed, or hath his stones broken; <sup>21</sup> no man that hath a blemish of the seed of Aaron the priest shall come nigh to offer the offerings of the LORD made by fire: he hath a blemish; he shall not come nigh to offer the bread of his God.
- Deuteronomy 23: <sup>1</sup>He that is wounded in the stones, or hath his privy member cut off, shall not enter into the congregation of the LORD.
- Leviticus 25: <sup>44</sup> Both thy bondmen, and thy bondmaids, which thou shalt have, shall be of the heathen that are round about you; of them shall ye buy bondmen and bondmaids. <sup>45</sup> Moreover of the children of the strangers that do sojourn among you, of them shall ye buy, and of their families that are with you, which they begat in your land: and they shall be your possession. <sup>46</sup> And ye shall take them as an inheritance for your children after you, to inherit them for a possession; they shall be your bondmen for ever
- Leviticus 27: <sup>3</sup> And thy estimation shall be of the male from twenty years old even unto sixty years old, even thy estimation shall be fifty shekels of silver, after the shekel of the sanctuary. <sup>4</sup> And if it be a female, then thy estimation shall be thirty shekels. <sup>5</sup> And if it be from five years old even unto twenty years old, then thy estimation shall be of the male twenty shekels, and for the female ten shekels. <sup>6</sup> And if it be from a month old even unto five years old, then thy estimation shall be of the male five shekels of silver, and for the female thy estimation shall be three shekels of silver. <sup>7</sup> And if it be from sixty years old and above; if it be a male, then thy estimation shall be fifteen shekels, and for the female ten shekels.
- Numbers 5: <sup>11</sup> And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, <sup>12</sup> Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, If any man's wife go aside, and commit a trespass against him, <sup>13</sup> and a man lie with her carnally, and it be hid from the eyes of her husband, and be kept close, and she be defiled, and there be no witness against her, neither she be taken with the manner; <sup>14</sup> and the spirit of jealousy come upon him, and he be jealous of his wife, and she be defiled: or if the spirit of jealousy come upon him, and he be jealous of his wife, and she be not defiled: <sup>15</sup> then shall the man bring his wife unto the priest, and he shall bring her offering for her, the tenth part of an ephah of barley meal; he shall pour no oil upon it, nor put frankincense thereon; for it is an offering of jealousy, an offering of memorial, bringing iniquity to remembrance.

  <sup>16</sup> And the priest shall bring her near, and set her before the LORD: <sup>17</sup> and the priest shall take holy water in an earthen vessel; and of the dust that is in the floor of the tabernacle the priest shall take, and put it

into the water: 18 and the priest shall set the woman before the LORD, and uncover the woman's head, and put the offering of memorial in her hands, which is the jealousy offering: and the priest shall have in his hand the bitter water that causeth the curse: 19 and the priest shall charge her by an oath, and say unto the woman, If no man have lain with thee, and if thou hast not gone aside to uncleanness with another instead of thy husband, be thou free from this bitter water that causeth the curse: <sup>20</sup> but if thou hast gone aside to another instead of thy husband, and if thou be defiled, and some man have lain with thee beside thine husband: <sup>21</sup> then the priest shall charge the woman with an oath of cursing, and the priest shall say unto the woman, The LORD make thee a curse and an oath among thy people, when the LORD doth make thy thigh to rot, and thy belly to swell; <sup>22</sup> and this water that causeth the curse shall go into thy bowels, to make thy belly to swell, and thy thigh to rot: And the woman shall say, Amen, amen. <sup>23</sup> And the priest shall write these curses in a book, and he shall blot them out with the bitter water:  $^{24}$  and he shall cause the woman to drink the bitter water that causeth the curse: and the water that causeth the curse shall enter into her, and become bitter. <sup>25</sup> Then the priest shall take the jealousy offering out of the woman's hand, and shall wave the offering before the LORD, and offer it upon the altar: <sup>26</sup> and the priest shall take an handful of the offering, even the memorial thereof, and burn it upon the altar, and afterward shall cause the woman to drink the water. <sup>27</sup> And when he hath made her to drink the water, then it shall come to pass, that, if she be defiled, and have done trespass against her husband, that the water that causeth the curse shall enter into her, and become bitter, and her belly shall swell, and her thigh shall rot: and the woman shall be a curse among her people. <sup>28</sup> And if the woman be not defiled, but be clean; then she shall be free, and shall conceive seed.

- Numbers 14: <sup>18</sup> The LORD is longsuffering, and of great mercy, forgiving iniquity and transgression, and by no means clearing the guilty, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation.
- Numbers 30: <sup>6</sup> And if she had at all an husband, when she vowed, or uttered ought out of her lips, wherewith she bound her soul; <sup>7</sup> and her husband heard it.... <sup>8</sup> But if her husband disallowed her on the day that he heard it; then he shall make her vow which she vowed, and that which she uttered with her lips ....

  <sup>13</sup> Every vow, and every binding oath to afflict the soul, her husband may establish it, or her husband may make it void.
- Deuteronomy 5: 9 ... I the LORD thy God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me
- Deuteronomy 21: <sup>10</sup> When thou goest forth to war against thine enemies, and the LORD thy God hath delivered them into thine hands, and thou hast taken them captive, <sup>11</sup> and seest among the captives a beautiful woman, and hast a desire unto her, that thou wouldest have her to thy wife; <sup>12</sup> then thou shalt bring her home to thine house; and she shall shave her head, and pare her nails; <sup>13</sup> and she shall put the raiment of her captivity from off her, and shall remain in thine house, and bewail her father and her mother a full month: and after that thou shalt go in unto her, and be her husband, and she shall be thy wife. <sup>14</sup> And it shall be, if thou have no delight in her, then thou shalt let her go whither she will
- Deuteronomy 22: <sup>22</sup> If a man be found lying with a woman married to an husband, then they shall both of them die, both the man that lay with the woman, and the woman: so shalt thou put away evil from Israel. <sup>23</sup> If a damsel that is a virgin be betrothed unto an husband, and a man find her in the city, and lie with her; <sup>24</sup> then ye shall bring them both out unto the gate of that city, and ye shall stone them with stones that they die; the damsel, because she cried not, being in the city; and the man, because he hath humbled his neighbour's wife: so thou shalt put away evil from among you....

- Deuteronomy 22: <sup>28</sup> If a man find a damsel that is a virgin, which is not betrothed, and lay hold on her, and lie with her, and they be found; <sup>29</sup> then the man that lay with her shall give unto the damsel's father fifty shekels of silver, and she shall be his wife; because he hath humbled her, he may not put her away all his day.
- Deuteronomy 25: <sup>11</sup> When men strive together one with another, and the wife of the one draweth near for to deliver her husband out of the hand of him that smiteth him, and putteth forth her hand, and taketh him by the secrets: <sup>12</sup> then thou shalt cut off her hand, thine eye shall not pity her.
- Joshua 15: <sup>16</sup> And Caleb said, He that smiteth Kirjath-sepher, and taketh it, to him will I give Achsah my daughter to wife. <sup>17</sup> And Othniel the son of Kenaz, the brother of Caleb, took it: and he gave him Achsah his daughter to wife.
- Judges 1: <sup>12</sup> And Caleb said, He that smiteth Kirjath-sepher, and taketh it, to him will I give Achsah my daughter to wife. <sup>13</sup> And Othniel the son of Kenaz, Caleb's younger brother, took it: and he gave him Achsah his daughter to wife.
- Judges 8: <sup>30</sup> And Gideon had threescore and ten sons of his body begotten: for he had many wives. <sup>31</sup> And his concubine that was in Shechem
- Judges 16: <sup>1</sup>Then went Samson to Gaza, and saw there an harlot, and went in unto her.
- Judges 19 -- Note: Please read Judges 19: 1-23 in Chapter 1, God's Violence.
- 1 Samuel 20: <sup>30</sup> Then Saul's anger was kindled against Jonathan, and he said unto him, Thou son of the perverse rebellious woman, do not I know that thou hast chosen the son of Jesse to thine own confusion, and unto the confusion of thy mother's nakedness? <sup>31</sup> For as long as the son of Jesse liveth upon the ground, thou shalt not be established, nor thy kingdom. Wherefore now send and fetch him unto me, for he shall surely die.... 1 Samuel 21: <sup>1</sup> Then came David to Nob to Ahimelech the priest: and Ahimelech was afraid at the meeting of David, and said unto him, Why art thou alone, and no man with thee? <sup>2</sup> And David said unto Ahimelech the priest, The king hath commanded me a business, and hath said unto me, Let no man know any thing of the business whereabout I send thee, and what I have commanded thee
- 1 Samuel 28: <sup>1</sup> And it came to pass in those days, that the Philistines gathered their armies together for warfare, to fight with Israel. And Achish said unto David, Know thou assuredly, that thou shalt go out with me to battle, thou and thy men. <sup>2</sup> And David said to Achish, Surely thou shalt know what thy servant can do. [Israel, of course, is the country, "god's people," that David had already been anointed to be king over].
- 2 Samuel 3: <sup>2</sup> And unto David were sons born in Hebron: and his firstborn was Amnon, of Ahinoam the Jezreelitess; <sup>3</sup> and his second, Chileab, of Abigail the wife of Nabal the Carmelite; and the third, Absalom the son of Maacah the daughter of Talmai king of Geshur; <sup>4</sup> and the fourth, Adonijah the son of Haggith; and the fifth, Shephatiah the son of Abital; <sup>5</sup> and the sixth, Ithream, by Eglah David's wife.
- 2 Samuel 3: <sup>28</sup> And afterward when David heard it, he said, I and my kingdom are guiltless before the LORD for ever from the blood of Abner the son of Ner: <sup>29</sup> let it rest on the head of Joab, and on all his father's house; and let there not fail from the house of Joab one that hath an issue, or that is a leper, or that leaneth on a staff, or that falleth on the sword, or that lacketh bread.

- 2 Samuel 12: <sup>11</sup> Thus saith the LORD, Behold, I will raise up evil against thee out of thine own house, and I will take thy wives before thine eyes, and give them unto thy neighbour, and he shall lie with thy wives in the sight of this sun.
- 2 Samuel 24: <sup>1</sup> And again the anger of the LORD was kindled against Israel, and he moved David against them to say, Go, number Israel and Judah.... <sup>10</sup> And David's heart smote him after that he had numbered the people. And David said unto the LORD, I have sinned greatly in that I have done: and now, I beseech thee, O LORD, take away the iniquity of thy servant; for I have done very foolishly. <sup>11</sup> For when David was up in the morning, the word of the LORD came unto the prophet Gad, David's seer, saying, <sup>12</sup> Go and say unto David, Thus saith the LORD, I offer thee three things; choose thee one of them, that I may do it unto thee. <sup>13</sup> So Gad came to David, and told him, and said unto him, Shall seven years of famine come unto thee in thy land? or wilt thou flee three months before thine enemies, while they pursue thee? or that there be three days' pestilence in thy land? now advise, and see what answer I shall return to him that sent me.... <sup>15</sup> So the LORD sent a pestilence upon Israel from the morning even to the time appointed: and there died of the people from Dan even to Beer-sheba seventy thousand men.... <sup>17</sup> And David spake unto the LORD when he saw the angel that smote the people, and said, Lo, I have sinned, and I have done wickedly: but these sheep, what have they done?
- 1 Kings 11: <sup>1</sup> But king Solomon.... <sup>3</sup> ...had seven hundred wives, princesses, and three hundred concubines
- 1 Kings 11: <sup>9</sup> And the LORD was angry with Solomon, because his heart was turned from the LORD God of Israel, which had appeared unto him twice.... <sup>11</sup> Wherefore the LORD said unto Solomon, Forasmuch as this is done of thee, and thou hast not kept my covenant and my statutes, which I have commanded thee, I will surely rend the kingdom from thee, and will give it to thy servant. <sup>12</sup> Notwithstanding in thy days I will not do it for David thy father's sake: but I will rend it out of the hand of thy son.
- 1 Kings 13: <sup>11</sup> Now there dwelt an old prophet in Beth-el... <sup>15</sup> Then he said unto him, Come home with me, and eat bread. <sup>16</sup> And he said, I may not return with thee, nor go in with thee: neither will I eat bread nor drink water with thee in this place: <sup>17</sup> for it was said to me by the word of the LORD, Thou shalt eat no bread nor drink water there, nor turn again to go by the way that thou camest. <sup>18</sup> He said unto him, I am a prophet also as thou art; and an angel spake unto me by the word of the LORD, saying, Bring him back with thee into thine house, that he may eat bread and drink water. But he lied unto him. <sup>19</sup> So he went back with him, and did eat bread in his house, and drank water. <sup>20</sup> And it came to pass, as they sat at the table, that the word of the LORD came unto the prophet that brought him back: <sup>21</sup> and he cried unto the man of God that came from Judah, saying, Thus saith the LORD, Forasmuch as thou hast disobeyed the mouth of the LORD, and hast not kept the commandment which the LORD thy God commanded thee, <sup>22</sup> but camest back, and hast eaten bread and drunk water in the place, of the which the LORD did say to thee, Eat no bread, and drink no water; thy carcase shall not come unto the sepulchre of thy fathers.... <sup>24</sup> And when he was gone, a lion met him by the way, and slew him
- 1 Kings 14: <sup>8</sup> ... thou hast not been as my servant David, who kept my commandments, and who followed me with all his heart, to do that only which was right in mine eyes; <sup>9</sup> but hast done evil above all that were before thee.... <sup>12</sup> Arise thou therefore, get thee to thine own house: and when thy feet enter into the city, the child shall die.... <sup>17</sup> ...and when she came to the threshold of the door, the child died
- 1 Kings 22: <sup>20</sup> And the LORD said, Who shall persuade Ahab, that he may go up and fall at Ramoth-gilead? And one said on this manner, and another said on that manner. <sup>21</sup> And there came forth a spirit, and stood before the LORD, and said, I will persuade him. <sup>22</sup> And the LORD said unto him, Wherewith? And he said, I will go forth, and I will be a lying spirit in the mouth of all his prophets. And he said, Thou shalt persuade

- him, and prevail also: go forth, and do so. <sup>23</sup> Now therefore, behold, the LORD hath put a lying spirit in the mouth of all these thy prophets, and the LORD hath spoken evil concerning thee.
- 2 Chronicles 18: <sup>19</sup> And the LORD said, Who shall entice Ahab king of Israel, that he may go up and fall at Ramoth-gilead? And one spake saying after this manner, and another saying after that manner. <sup>20</sup> Then there came out a spirit, and stood before the LORD, and said, I will entice him. And the LORD said unto him, Wherewith? <sup>21</sup> And he said, I will go out, and be a lying spirit in the mouth of all his prophets. And the LORD said, Thou shalt entice him, and thou shalt also prevail: go out, and do even so. <sup>22</sup> Now therefore, behold, the LORD hath put a lying spirit in the mouth of these thy prophets, and the LORD hath spoken evil against thee.
- 2 Kings 5: <sup>27</sup> The leprosy therefore of Naaman shall cleave unto thee, and unto thy seed for ever.
- 2 Kings 8: 1...for the LORD hath called for a famine
- 2 Kings 8: <sup>10</sup> And Elisha said unto him, Go, say unto him, Thou mayest certainly recover: howbeit the LORD hath shewed me that he shall surely die.
- 2 Kings 22: <sup>1</sup>Josiah was eight years old when he began to reign, and he reigned thirty and one years in Jerusalem.... <sup>2</sup> And he did that which was right in the sight of the LORD, and walked in all the way of David his father, and turned not aside to the right hand or to the left.... 2 Kings 23: <sup>3</sup> And the king stood by a pillar, and made a covenant before the LORD, to walk after the LORD, and to keep his commandments and his testimonies and his statutes with all their heart and all their soul, to perform the words of this covenant that were written in this book. And all the people stood to the covenant.... <sup>25</sup> And like unto him was there no king before him, that turned to the LORD with all his heart, and with all his soul, and with all his might, according to all the law of Moses; neither after him arose there any like him.

  <sup>26</sup> Notwithstanding the LORD turned not from the fierceness of his great wrath, wherewith his anger was kindled against Judah, because of all the provocations that Manasseh had provoked him withal. <sup>27</sup> And the LORD said, I will remove Judah also out of my sight, as I have removed Israel, and will cast off this city Jerusalem which I have chosen, and the house of which I said, My name shall be there.
- 1 Chronicles 3: 9 These were all the sons of David, beside the sons of the concubines
- 1 Chronicles 14: <sup>3</sup> And David took more wives at Jerusalem: and David begat more sons and daughters.
- 2 Chronicles 2: <sup>17</sup> And Solomon numbered all the strangers that were in the land of Israel, after the numbering wherewith David his father had numbered them; and they were found an hundred and fifty thousand and three thousand and six hundred. <sup>18</sup> And he set threescore and ten thousand of them to be bearers of burdens, and fourscore thousand to be hewers in the mountain, and three thousand and six hundred overseers to set the people a work.
- 2 Chronicles 11: <sup>21</sup> And Rehoboam loved Maachah the daughter of Absalom above all his wives and his concubines: (for he took eighteen wives, and threescore concubines....
- Ezra 10: <sup>2</sup> And Shechaniah the son of Jehiel, one of the sons of Elam, answered and said unto Ezra, We have trespassed against our God, and have taken strange wives of the people of the land: yet now there is hope in Israel concerning this thing. <sup>3</sup> Now therefore let us make a covenant with our God to put away all the wives, and such as are born of them, according to the counsel of my lord, and of those that tremble at the commandment of our God.... <sup>10</sup> And Ezra the priest stood up, and said unto them, Ye have transgressed, and have taken strange wives, to increase the trespass of Israel. <sup>11</sup> Now therefore make confession unto the LORD God of your fathers, and do his pleasure: and separate yourselves from the

people of the land, and from the strange wives. <sup>12</sup> Then all the congregation answered and said with a loud voice, As thou hast said, so must we do.... <sup>19</sup> And they gave their hands that they would put away their wives

Job 1: <sup>6</sup> Now there was a day when the sons of God came to present themselves before the LORD, and Satan came also among them. <sup>7</sup> And the LORD said unto Satan, Whence comest thou? Then Satan answered the LORD, and said, From going to and fro in the earth, and from walking up and down in it. 8 And the LORD said unto Satan, Hast thou considered my servant Job, that there is none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil? <sup>9</sup>Then Satan answered the LORD, and said, Doth Job fear God for nought? 10 Hast not thou made an hedge about him, and about his house, and about all that he hath on every side? thou hast blessed the work of his hands, and his substance is increased in the land. 11 But put forth thine hand now, and touch all that he hath, and he will curse thee to thy face. <sup>12</sup> And the LORD said unto Satan, Behold, all that he hath is in thy power; only upon himself put not forth thine hand. So Satan went forth from the presence of the LORD. 13 And there was a day when his sons and his daughters were eating and drinking wine in their eldest brother's house: 14 and there came a messenger unto Job, and said, The oxen were plowing, and the asses feeding beside them:  $^{15}$  and the Sabeans fell upon them, and took them away; yea, they have slain the servants with the edge of the sword; and I only am escaped alone to tell thee. <sup>16</sup> While he was yet speaking, there came also another, and said, The fire of God is fallen from heaven, and hath burned up the sheep, and the servants, and consumed them; and I only am escaped alone to tell thee. <sup>17</sup> While he was yet speaking, there came also another, and said, The Chaldeans made out three bands, and fell upon the camels, and have carried them away, yea, and slain the servants with the edge of the sword; and I only am escaped alone to tell thee. <sup>18</sup> While he was yet speaking, there came also another, and said, Thy sons and thy daughters were eating and drinking wine in their eldest brother's house: <sup>19</sup> and, behold, there came a great wind from the wilderness, and smote the four corners of the house, and it fell upon the young men, and they are dead; and I only am escaped alone to tell thee.... Job 2: 1 Again there was a day when the sons of God came to present themselves before the LORD, and Satan came also among them to present himself before the LORD. <sup>2</sup> And the LORD said unto Satan, From whence comest thou? And Satan answered the LORD, and said, From going to and fro in the earth, and from walking up and down in it. 3 And the LORD said unto Satan, Hast thou considered my servant Job, that there is none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil? and still he holdeth fast his integrity, although thou movedst me against him, to destroy him without cause. <sup>4</sup> And Satan answered the LORD, and said, Skin for skin, yea, all that a man hath will he give for his life. 5 But put forth thine hand now, and touch his bone and his flesh, and he will curse thee to thy face. <sup>6</sup> And the LORD said unto Satan, Behold, he is in thine hand; but save his life. <sup>7</sup>So went Satan forth from the presence of the LORD, and smote Job with sore boils from the sole of his foot unto his crown.... <sup>10</sup> But he said unto her, ... What? shall we receive good at the hand of God, and shall we not receive evil?... Job 42: 11 ... and they bemoaned him, and comforted him over all the evil that the Lord had brought upon him... 12 So the LORD blessed the latter end of Job more than his beginning: for he had fourteen thousand sheep, and six thousand camels, and a thousand yoke of oxen, and a thousand she asses. <sup>13</sup> He had also seven sons and three daughters.

Job 9: <sup>22</sup> This is one thing, therefore I said it, He destroyeth the perfect and the wicked.

Proverbs 26: <sup>10</sup> The great God that formed all things both rewardeth the fool, and rewardeth transgressors.

Jeremiah 15: <sup>4</sup> And I will cause them to be removed into all kingdoms of the earth, because of Manasseh the son of Hezekiah king of Judah, for that which he did in Jerusalem.

Jeremiah 16: <sup>10</sup> And it shall come to pass, when thou shalt shew this people all these words, and they shall say unto thee, Wherefore hath the LORD pronounced all this great evil against us? or what is our iniquity? or

- what is our sin that we have committed against the LORD our God? <sup>11</sup> Then shalt thou say unto them, Because your fathers have forsaken me, saith the LORD
- Jeremiah 48: <sup>10</sup> Currsed be he that doeth the work of the LORD deceitfully, and cursed be he that keepeth back his sword from blood.
- Ezekiel 14: <sup>9</sup> And if the prophet be deceived when he hath spoken a thing, I the LORD have deceived that prophet
- Ezekiel 20: <sup>25</sup> Wherefore I gave them also statutes that were not good, and judgments whereby they should not live
- Ezekiel 21: <sup>1</sup> And the word of the LORD came unto me, saying, <sup>2</sup> Son of man, set thy face toward Jerusalem, and drop thy word toward the holy places, and prophesy against the land of Israel, <sup>3</sup> and say to the land of Israel, Thus saith the LORD; Behold, I am against thee, and will draw forth my sword out of his sheath, and will cut off from thee the righteous and the wicked.
- Hosea 3: <sup>1</sup>Then said the LORD unto me, Go yet, love a woman beloved of her friend, yet an adulteress, according to the love of the LORD toward the children of Israel, who look to other gods, and love flagons of wine. <sup>2</sup>So I bought her to me for fifteen pieces of silver, and for an homer of barley, and an half homer of barley
- Matthew 13: <sup>10</sup> And the disciples came, and said unto him, Why speakest thou unto them in parables? <sup>11</sup> He answered and said unto them, Because it is given unto you to know the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it is not given.... <sup>13</sup> Therefore speak I to them in parables: because they seeing see not; and hearing they hear not, neither do they understand.... lest at any time they should see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and should understand with their heart, and should be converted, and I should heal them.
- Mark 4: <sup>11</sup> And he said unto them, Unto you it is given to know the mystery of the kingdom of God: but unto them that are without, all these things are done in parables: <sup>12</sup> that seeing they may see, and not perceive; and hearing they may hear, and not understand; lest at any time they should be converted, and their sins should be forgiven them.
- Luke 8: <sup>10</sup> And he said, Unto you it is given to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God: but to others in parables; that seeing they might not see, and hearing they might not understand.
- John 12: <sup>39</sup> Therefore they could not believe, because that Esaias said again, <sup>40</sup> He hath blinded their eyes, and hardened their heart; that they should not see with their eyes, nor understand with their heart, and be converted, and I should heal them.
- Matthew 19: <sup>29</sup> And every one that hath forsaken houses, or brethren, or sisters, or father, or mother, or wife, or children, or lands, for my name's sake, shall receive an hundredfold, and shall inherit everlasting life.
- Luke 12: <sup>47</sup> And that servant, which knew his lord's will, and prepared not himself, neither did according to his will, shall be beaten with many stripes. <sup>48</sup> But he that knew not, and did commit things worthy of stripes, shall be beaten with few stripes.
- Luke 12: <sup>51</sup> Suppose ye that I am come to give peace on earth? I tell you, Nay; but rather division: <sup>52</sup> for from henceforth there shall be five in one house divided, three against two, and two against three. <sup>53</sup> The father shall be divided against the son, and the son against the father; the mother against the daughter,

- and the daughter against the mother; the mother in law against her daughter in law, and the daughter in law against her mother in law.
- Luke 14: <sup>26</sup> If any man come to me, and hate not his father, and mother, and wife, and children, and brethren, and sisters, yea, and his own life also, he cannot be my disciple.
- Acts 4: <sup>4</sup> Howbeit many of them which heard the word believed; and the number of the men was about five thousand. [One example of what is typical in the Bible, in that the men are the only ones who count.]
- Romans 9: <sup>18</sup> Therefore hath he mercy on whom he will have mercy, and whom he will he hardeneth.
- 1 Corinthians 11: <sup>3</sup> But I would have you know, that the head of every man is Christ; and the head of the woman is the man; and the head of Christ is God. <sup>4</sup> Every man praying or prophesying, having his head covered, dishonoureth his head. <sup>5</sup> But every woman that prayeth or prophesieth with her head uncovered dishonoureth her head: for that is even all one as if she were shaven. <sup>6</sup> For if the woman be not covered, let her also be shorn: but if it be a shame for a woman to be shorn or shaven, let her be covered. <sup>7</sup> For a man indeed ought not to cover his head, forasmuch as he is the image and glory of God: but the woman is the glory of the man. <sup>8</sup> For the man is not of the woman; but the woman of the man. <sup>9</sup> Neither was the man created for the woman; but the woman for the man. <sup>10</sup> For this cause ought the woman to have power on her head because of the angels.
- 1 Corinthians 14: <sup>34</sup> Let your women keep silence in the churches: for it is not permitted unto them to speak; but they are commanded to be under obedience, as also saith the law. <sup>35</sup> And if they will learn any thing, let them ask their husbands at home: for it is a shame for women to speak in the church.
- 1 Timothy 2: <sup>11</sup> Let the woman learn in silence with all subjection. <sup>12</sup> But I suffer not a woman to teach, nor to usurp authority over the man, but to be in silence.... <sup>15</sup> Notwithstanding she shall be saved in childbearing
- 2 Thessalonians 2: <sup>11</sup> And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: <sup>12</sup> that they all might be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness.

# CHAPTER 4 A FEW MORE VERSES

Below are a few more verses that didn't fit into the previously listed categories, but that that the reader may find of interest.

Leviticus 19: <sup>19</sup> Ye shall keep my statutes. Thou shalt not let thy cattle gender with a diverse kind: thou shalt not sow thy field with mingled seed: neither shall a garment mingled of linen and woollen come upon thee.

Deuteronomy 22: <sup>11</sup> Thou shalt not wear a garment of divers sorts, as of woollen and linen together.

- Numbers 22: <sup>28</sup> And the LORD opened the mouth of the ass, and she said unto Balaam, What have I done unto thee, that thou hast smitten me these three times? <sup>29</sup> And Balaam said unto the ass, Because thou hast mocked me: I would there were a sword in mine hand, for now would I kill thee.
- 1 Samuel 18: <sup>3</sup> Then Jonathan and David made a covenant, because he loved him as his own soul. <sup>4</sup> And Jonathan stripped himself of the robe that was upon him, and gave it to David, and his garments, even to his sword, and to his bow, and to his girdle.
- 2 Samuel 11: <sup>1</sup> And it came to pass, after the year was expired, at the time when kings go forth to battle....
- 2 Samuel 22: <sup>7</sup> in my distress I called upon the LORD, and cried to my God.... <sup>9</sup> There went up a smoke out of his nostrils, and fire out of his mouth....
- 1 Kings 14: <sup>10</sup> therefore, behold, I will bring evil upon the house of Jeroboam, and will cut off from Jeroboam him that pisseth against the wall
- 1 Kings 16: 11 ... he left him not one that pisseth against a wall
- 1 Kings 21: 21 ... and will cut off from Ahab him that pisseth against the wall
- 2 Kings 9: 8 ... and I will cut off from Ahab him that pisseth against the wall
- 2 Kings 19: <sup>35</sup> And it came to pass that night, that the angel of the LORD went out, and smote in the camp of the Assyrians an hundred fourscore and five thousand: and when they arose early in the morning, behold, they were all dead corpses.
- Psalm 6: <sup>4</sup> Return, O LORD, deliver my soul: oh save me for thy mercies' sake. <sup>5</sup> For in death there is no remembrance of thee: in the grave who shall give thee thanks?
- Psalm 115: <sup>17</sup> The dead praise not the LORD, neither any that go down into silence.
- Psalm 24: <sup>1</sup>The earth is the LORD's, and the fulness thereof.... <sup>2</sup>For he hath founded it upon the seas
- Ecclesiastes 2: <sup>24</sup> There is nothing better for a man, than that he should eat and drink, and that he should make his soul enjoy good in his labour. This also I saw, that it was from the hand of God.
- Ecclesiastes 8: <sup>15</sup> Then I commended mirth, because a man hath no better thing under the sun, than to eat, and to drink, and to be merry: for that shall abide with him of his labour the days of his life, which God giveth him under the sun.

- Ecclesiastes 9: <sup>2</sup> All things come alike to all: there is one event to the righteous, and to the wicked; to the good and to the clean, and to the unclean; to him that sacrificeth, and to him that sacrificeth not: as is the good, so is the sinner; and he that sweareth, as he that feareth an oath. <sup>3</sup> This is an evil among all things that are done under the sun, that there is one event unto all: yea, also the heart of the sons of men is full of evil, and madness is in their heart while they live, and after that they go to the dead.
- Ecclesiastes 9: <sup>5</sup> For the living know that they shall die: but the dead know not any thing, neither have they any more a reward; for the memory of them is forgotten. <sup>6</sup> Also their love, and their hatred, and their envy, is now perished; neither have they any more a portion for ever in any thing that is done under the sun.
- Ecclesiastes 9: <sup>10</sup> Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with thy might; for there is no work, nor device, nor knowledge, nor wisdom, in the grave, whither thou goest.
- Song of Solomon 1: <sup>13</sup> A bundle of myrrh is my wellbeloved unto me; he shall lie all night betwixt my breasts. Song of Solomon 4: <sup>5</sup> Thy two breasts are like two young roes that are twins, which feed among the lilies. Song of Solomon 7: <sup>3</sup> Thy two breasts are like two young roes that are twins.... <sup>7</sup> This thy stature is like to a palm tree, and thy breasts to clusters of grapes.... <sup>8</sup> ... now also thy breasts shall be as clusters of the vine Song of Solomon 8: <sup>10</sup> I am a wall, and my breasts like towers
- Isaiah 32:8 But the liberal deviseth liberal things; and by liberal things shall he stand.
- Isaiah 42: <sup>19</sup> Who is blind, but my servant? or deaf, as my messenger that I sent? who is blind as he that is perfect, and blind as the LORD's servant?
- Jeremiah 12: <sup>1</sup> Righteous art thou, O LORD, when I plead with thee: yet let me talk with thee of thy judgments: Wherefore doth the way of the wicked prosper? wherefore are all they happy that deal very treacherously? <sup>2</sup> Thou hast planted them, yea, they have taken root: they grow, yea, they bring forth fruit: thou art near in their mouth, and far from their reins.

# CHAPTER 5 CONTRADICTIONS IN THE BIBLE

This may be thought of as the "heart" of this book, being the compilation of the contradictions and discrepancies that I found either as I was writing my parody of the Bible, *Holy Hustle! A Bible Parody Containing All 66 Books of both the Old and the New Hustles*, or by the research I did afterward. I do not by any means claim that this list is exhaustive. The Bible is so convoluted and confusing that I doubt anyone will ever find every possible contradiction or discrepancy contained therein.

I have left out many passages that I initially thought might be contradictions or that others claimed to be contradictions, because upon researching I found them to be rather "weak". Much of the Bible is, of course, subject to interpretation; hence the thousands of sects and denominations of Christianity today. Therefore, what would seem to be a contradiction may not necessarily be so. I have culled out many of the weaker examples that I originally included on my list and am including here only what I consider to be the more firm examples of contradictions.

Sometimes what people will often call a contradiction is not truly a contradiction. For example, the Bible states in some places that Jonah was swallowed by a whale and in other places that he was swallowed by great fish. Some people will state that this is a contradiction, and it is, according to our current knowledge, but the Bible writers were not writing according to today's definitions. Certainly, in the times the Bible was written, a "fish" was any of those animals that squiggled through the water, regardless of their size or whether they had hair and breathed air. The statements are not in error according to the definitions used in those days. Similarly a list of birds in at least one place in the Bible includes bats.

Also, there are many passages that seem to be contradictory because a person is referred to a certain man's father in one place, but as his grandfather, great-grandfather or even further-remove ancestor in another. I believe it was common practice in the Bible to "shorten" the chain of ancestry when simply giving such descriptions as identifiers and are not mistakes or attempts to deceive. Abraham is described throughout the Bible as "our father", even by those many generations later in the New Testament. This was certainly not meant to try to tell the reader that Abraham was the person's immediate male predecessor. Even in our day, we refer to our "forefathers" or the "fathers" of our country. Therefore, I have not included such seeming discrepancies as contradictions. They are, though, counted as contradictions when found in listings of genealogies which are purporting to gived a full listing of generations.

Oftentimes names will disagree in corresponding passages, as when Matthew and Mark includes Thaddeus in the list of Jesus' twelve disciples, but Luke instead lists Judas, the son of James (not to be confused with Judas Iscrariot, Jesus' betrayer). However, even as today, people sometimes went by more than one name. Esau was also known as Edom, and Jacob was also known as Israel. I am sure the reader knows people who go by some other name than their legal given first name, such as a middle name or nickname. Is Judas, the son of James, the same person or a different person from Thaddeus? Since it is impossible to know for sure, I have generally omitted contradictions of names unless there is some other evidence that there is a contradiction, such as if one passage said the person was a Hittite and the other that he or she was an Amalekite.

There are, of course, many Bible passages that conflict with history. I have not researched them out and included them in this chapter. However, a few of the most obvious ones will be mentioned in Chapter 6: Other Questions.

I have tried to strike a balance between being "exhaustive" and being "safe". I wish for the list to be as complete as I can make it, but at the same time I do not want to include examples that are "weak" and will be easily refuted. I have made my best judgment. Other people's judgments will, of course, vary, and the reader is welcome to his or her opinion of how well I have succeeded. I have indicated by double-asterisk(\*\*) those entries that are "hard facts", such as numbers, that cannot be explained away by "interpreting" them. If the Bible says a certain king began reigning at 22 years old, and in another place says that same king began reigning when he was 42 years old, that is a clear contradiction--no interpretation involved. When one place

says the number of men in Israel's army was 500,000, and in another place it says it was 650,000 at that time, that is simply a contradiction.

Of course, those who wish to insist that the Bible is the "inerrant word of God" will find ways to "explain away" many, if not most, contradictions. I recently came across an amusing webpage:

So, what are we to do when someone approaches us with an alleged Bible error? 1) Prayerfully study the Scriptures and see if there is a simple solution. 2) Do some research using some of the fine Bible commentaries, "Bible defense" books, and biblical research websites. 3) Ask our pastors/church leaders to see if they can find a solution. 4) If there is still no clear answer after steps 1), 2), and 3) are followed, we trust God that His Word is truth and that there is a solution that just simply has not been realized yet. (https://www.gotquestions.org/Bible-errors.html)

I could not help but laugh (and roll my eyes) as I read it saying essentially, "Try every way you can think of to explain away every contradiction, and, if you can't do it, just accept it as the truth anyway! Don't even consider that we might be wrong! Oh no, no! Not a possibility! No matter what the facts, no matter how ridiculous, we are simply right!" These people start out with the assumption that they are right, rather than asking the question of what is right and making an honest assessment of the facts to determine it.

I did not compare these passages in other translations of the Bible or try to research out the wording in the original languages. (All passages quoted are taken from the traditional King James Version of the Bible.) Meanings can often change or be lost upon translation to a different language and also due to the fact that the King James Version of the Bible is 400 years old, and English words and phrases can change their meanings over time. It is possible that some of the contradictions below could be explained by errors or problems in translation, but I believe the intelligent reader will acknowledge that such argument cannot explain all or even most of the discrepancies below.

And, of course, if you enjoy a more humorous approach to reading about the contradictions and absurdities of the Bible, I recommend my Bible paraody, *Holy Hustle! A Bible Parody Containing All 66 Books of both the Old and the New Hustles*.

Vs:

John 11: <sup>43</sup> And when he thus had spoken, he cried with a loud voice, Lazarus, come forth. <sup>44</sup> And he that was dead came forth, bound hand and foot with graveclothes: and his face was bound about with a napkin. Jesus saith unto them, Loose him, and let him go. <sup>45</sup> Then many of the Jews which came to Mary, and had seen the things which Jesus did, believed on him.

Q: Are people persuaded by someone coming back from the dead?

## 282.

Deuteronomy 24: <sup>1</sup>When a man hath taken a wife, and married her, and it come to pass that she find no favour in his eyes, because he hath found some uncleanness in her: then let him write her a bill of divorcement, and give it in her hand, and send her out of his house. <sup>2</sup> And when she is departed out of his house, she may go and be another man's wife.

Vs:

Luke 16: 18 ... and whosoever marrieth her that is put away from her husband committeth adultery Q: Is it okay to marry a divorced woman?

#### 283. \*\*

Matthew 21: <sup>19</sup> And when he saw a fig tree in the way, he came to it, and found nothing thereon, but leaves only, and said unto it, Let no fruit grow on thee henceforward for ever. And presently the fig tree withered away. <sup>20</sup> And when the disciples saw it, they marvelled, saying, How soon is the fig tree withered away!

Q: In the parable of the husbandmen, who answered Jesus' question about what the lord of the vineyard would do?

Luke 21: <sup>16</sup> And ye shall be betrayed both by parents, and brethren, and kinsfolks, and friends; and some of you shall they cause to be put to death. <sup>17</sup> And ye shall be hated of all men for my name's sake.

Luke 21: 18 But there shall not an hair of your head perish.

Q: In Jesus' description of future times will his followers be killed?

Q: Did Jesus know what the father knew?

Matthew 25: <sup>34</sup> Then shall the King say unto them on his right hand, Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world

Vs:

John 14: <sup>2</sup> In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you.

Q: When was heaven "prepared" for us?

#### 290.

John 14: <sup>26</sup> But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name....

Vs:

John 15: <sup>26</sup> But when the Comforter is come, whom I will send unto you from the Father Q: Who sent the holy ghost?

### 291.

John 15: <sup>15</sup> Henceforth I call you not servants; for the servant knoweth not what his lord doeth: but I have called you friends; for all things that I have heard of my Father I have made known unto you.

Vs:

John 16: [later in the same discourse] <sup>12</sup>I have yet many things to say unto you, but ye cannot bear them now

Q: Had Jesus made everything known to his disciples when he made the first statement?

#### 292. \*\*

Matthew 26: <sup>6</sup> Now when Jesus was in Bethany, in the house of Simon the leper, <sup>7</sup> There came unto him a woman having an alabaster box of very precious ointment, and poured it on his head, as he sat at meat. <sup>8</sup> But when his disciples saw it, they had indignation, saying, To what purpose is this waste? <sup>9</sup> For this ointment might have been sold for much, and given to the poor.

Vs:

Luke 7: <sup>36</sup> And one of the Pharisees desired him that he would eat with him. Vs:

John 13: <sup>1</sup> Now before the feast of the passover, when Jesus knew that his hour was come that he should depart out of this world unto the Father, having loved his own which were in the world, he loved them unto the end. <sup>2</sup> And supper being ended, the devil having now put into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray him....

Jesus answered him, Whither I go, thou canst not follow me now; but thou shalt follow me afterwards.

Vs

John 16: <sup>5</sup> But now I go my way to him that sent me; and none of you asketh me, Whither goest thou? Q: Did any of Jesus' disciples ask him where he was going?

Vs:

John 17: <sup>12</sup> While I was with them in the world, I kept them in thy name: those that thou gavest me I have kept, and none of them is lost, but the son of perdition; that the scripture might be fulfilled.

Q: Did Jesus lose any of his followers other than the "son of perdition"?

Matthew 26: <sup>30</sup> And when they had sung an hymn, they went out into the mount of Olives. <sup>31</sup> Then saith Jesus unto them, All ye shall be offended because of me this night: for it is written, I will smite the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock shall be scattered abroad. <sup>32</sup> But after I am risen again, I will go before you into Galilee. <sup>33</sup> Peter answered and said unto him, Though all men shall be offended because of thee, yet will I never be offended. <sup>34</sup> Jesus said unto him, Verily I say unto thee, That this night, before the cock crow, thou shalt deny me thrice. <sup>35</sup> Peter said unto him, Though I should die with thee, yet will I not deny thee. Mark 15: <sup>15</sup> And so Pilate, willing to content the people, released Barabbas unto them, and delivered Jesus, when he had scourged him, to be crucified.... <sup>17</sup> And they clothed him with purple, and platted a crown of thorns, and put it about his head

# CHAPTER 6 SOME MORE QUESTIONS

The following passages do not, to my knowledge, directly contradict another passage of scripture, but many nevertheless illustrate the errors and inaccuracies of the Bible. Many of them contradict reality, such as assuming the earth to be flat or that the stars are just balls of light suspended over the earth. I have not included here the great number of "miracles" of the Bible, even though they are, of course, absurd and contradict reality. However, the Bible makes the claim that there is an omnipotent creator of the universe who is able to interrupt the laws of nature and of physics to perform miracles. Therefore, I do not reference individual miracles, but only those statements that indicate a misunderstanding of the nature of known reality.

Although I do mention it in at least one example, I have not generally included places where the New Testament seems to misquote the Old Testament or refers to quotes that don't exist in the Old Testament. Many critics will cite such seeming errors or omissions, and they are most likely correct in doing so. However, it would seem that there are books of the Bible that have been "lost" and do not occur in our Bible, and these missing books could contain some of the missing quotes. For instance, the Bible refers to The Book of Jashur (2 Samuel 1:18), The Book of the Acts of Solomon (1 Kings 11:41) and The Book of Nathan the Prophet (2 Chronicles 9:29). I make the assumption that when a New Testament writer refers to a quote that is not found in the Old Testament it is because these books have gone missing.

I also do not make reference to such things as dragons, unicorns, satyrs and cockatrices, all mythical beings which are mentioned in the Bible. Although we know such beings to be mythical, I believe that when the Bible refers to such animals it was probably often referring to animals that indeed existed. We are just not sure what animals they were referring to. I hypothesize that the "unicorn" could actually be a rhinoceros, since it is an animal that has one horn, and unicorns are described in the Bible as very strong creatures. Although there are no rhinos in the area of ancient Israel, there used to be some in the northern area of Egypt, so they may have at least been aware that these animals existed. Suffice for the reader to be aware that these creatures are mentioned in the Bible, and the reader can easily do a search and read these passages and make up his or her own mind as to where he or she believes the Bible is referring to mythical creatures. (Either way, though, I still give you permission to snicker as you read such references in the Bible.)

Occasionally, I have made reference to a prophecy or future prediction in the Bible that is problematic. However, most prophecies are quite vague and unclear, leaving wide berth as to the interpretation, or even as to whether it is a prophecy at all. Also, apologists of the Bible will claim that those prophecies that have not been fulfilled will yet be fulfilled, no matter how ridiculous of assumptions or interpretations they have to make to envision such fulfillment, so, in general I have not included them herein.

Finally, there is a possibility that the reader might somehow get the impression that I had a little bit of fun writing some of the questions contained here. I neither admit nor deny anything!

  - Q: Do you think Adam did a rather extraordinarily fast job of naming every animal on earth in time so that god could still create Eve on the same day, given that there are around 10,000 "fowls of the air" species on earth, and there are 60 x 24 = 1440 minutes in a day? Don't you wish Adam would have left us his list so that biologists today wouldn't have to rediscover and rename all the species that they keep finding all the time?

# 4.

- Genesis 2: <sup>10</sup> And a river went out of Eden to water the garden; and from thence it was parted, and became into four heads. <sup>11</sup> The name of the first is Pison: that is it which compasseth the whole land of Havilah, where there is gold; <sup>12</sup> and the gold of that land is good: there is bdellium and the onyx stone. <sup>13</sup> And the name of the second river is Gihon: the same is it that compasseth the whole land of Ethiopia. <sup>14</sup> And the name of the third river is Hiddekel: that is it which goeth toward the east of Assyria.   - Q: One of the rivers from the garden of Eden was the Euphrates, which obviously puts it in the vicinity of Mesopotamia. What path do you suppose the river Gihon took from Eden to compass the land of Ethiopia? And where is the river that divides into four rivers? (Can you find it on a map?)

# 5.

Genesis 2: <sup>24</sup> Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh.

#### Vs:

- Genesis 16: <sup>1</sup> Now Sarai Abram's wife bare him no children: and she had an handmaid, an Egyptian, whose name was Hagar. <sup>2</sup> And Sarai said unto Abram, Behold now, the LORD hath restrained me from bearing: I pray thee, go in unto my maid; it may be that I may obtain children by her. And Abram hearkened to the voice of Sarai. <sup>3</sup> And Sarai Abram's wife took Hagar her maid the Egyptian, after Abram had dwelt ten years in the land of Canaan, and gave her to her husband Abram to be his wife.
  - Q: By the "transitive property of biblical marriage" were Sarai and Hagar then "one flesh"? (Of course, the same question applies to Jacob, Moses, Gideon, David, Solomon and many other of "god's men".) Is polygamy okay with god?

# 6.

Genesis 3: <sup>1</sup> Now the serpent was more subtil than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said unto the woman... <sup>13</sup> And the LORD God said unto the woman, What is this that thou hast done? And the woman said, The serpent beguiled me, and I did eat. <sup>14</sup> And the LORD God said unto the serpent,

Because thou hast done this, thou art cursed above all cattle, and above every beast of the field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt thou eat all the days of thy life

Q: Would god condemn a whole race of intelligent, conversant, sentient beings to slithering on their bellies? Is the snake in your backyard an intelligent, sentient being?

Was it a tattoo saying, "Do not kill!"?

Genesis 6: <sup>17</sup> And, behold, I, even I, do bring a flood of waters upon the earth, to destroy all flesh, wherein is the breath of life, from under heaven; and every thing that is in the earth shall die.... <sup>19</sup> And of every living thing of all flesh, two of every sort shalt thou bring into the ark, to keep them alive with thee; they shall be male and female.

Q: How comfy do you think the 5000 species of mammals, 10,000 species of birds, 1,000,000 species of insects and 700 species of dinosaurs were in Noah's 450'-long ark? And since "EVERY living thing of ALL flesh" would die, did that mean that Noah had to take two humpback whales onto the ark? In what part of the ark did he house them?

## 11.

Genesis 7: <sup>4</sup> For yet seven days, and I will cause it to rain upon the earth

Q: Given the statistics from the previous question, how many animals per hour/minute did Noah have to load into the ark to get them all in in seven days? How fast did he have to walk to get the penguins and polar bears?

#### 12.

Genesis 7: <sup>1</sup> And the LORD said unto Noah, Come thou and all thy house into the ark; for thee have I seen righteous before me in this generation. <sup>2</sup> Of every clean beast thou shalt take to thee by sevens, the male and his female: and of beasts that are not clean by two, the male and his female.

  - Q: The highest mountain on earth is Mount Everest, at 29,038 feet high. There are 12 inches in a foot, 24 hours in a day and 60 minutes in an hour. Now grab your calculator and tell us: How fast was it raining in inches per [whatever unit of time produces a reasonable number]?

# 14.

Genesis 7: <sup>20</sup> Fifteen cubits upward did the waters prevail; and the mountains were covered.

Q: Were there no mountains on earth in those days higher than 15 cubits (approx. 20 feet)?

# **15.**

- Genesis 8: <sup>3</sup> and the waters returned from off the earth continually: and after the end of the hundred and fifty days the waters were abated.... <sup>10</sup> And he stayed yet other seven days; and again he sent forth the dove out of the ark; <sup>11</sup> and the dove came in to him in the evening; and, lo, in her mouth was an olive leaf pluckt off: so Noah knew that the waters were abated from off the earth.
  - Q: Where do you suppose the dove found an olive tree with a leaf to pluck off after the entire earth was submerged for nearly half a year?

- Genesis 8: <sup>21</sup> ... and the LORD said in his heart, I will not again curse the ground any more for man's sake; ... neither will I again smite any more every thing living, as I have done.... (chapter 9) ... <sup>11</sup> And I will establish my covenant with you; neither shall all flesh be cut off any more by the waters of a flood; neither shall there any more be a flood to destroy the earth... <sup>13</sup> I do set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be for a token of a covenant between me and the earth. <sup>14</sup> And it shall come to pass, when I bring a cloud over the earth, that the bow shall be seen in the cloud: <sup>15</sup> and I will remember my covenant, which is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall no more become a flood to destroy all flesh. <sup>16</sup> And the bow shall be in the cloud; and I will look upon it, that I may remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is upon the earth.
  - Q: Why would god need a rainbow to remember his covenant? Was he getting dementia? (And were the principles of optics different prior to the flood so rainbows didn't form?)

- Genesis 9: <sup>2</sup> And the fear of you and the dread of you shall be upon every beast of the earth, and upon every fowl of the air, upon all that moveth upon the earth, and upon all the fishes of the sea; into your hand are they delivered.
- Q: Does this verse make you feel more comfortable if you're out in a jungle without a weapon and there's a tiger lurking about? You wouldn't have any trouble shewing a grizzly away if it were around, would you?

## 18.

- Genesis 11: <sup>5</sup> And the LORD came down to see the city and the tower, which the children of men builded. <sup>6</sup> And the LORD said, Behold, the people is one, and they have all one language; and this they begin to do: and now nothing will be restrained from them, which they have imagined to do.
  - Q: If nothing could be restrained from them, then were humans once ready to turn into gods?

#### 19.

- Genesis 15: <sup>18</sup> In the same day the LORD made a covenant with Abram, saying, Unto thy seed have I given this land, from the river of Egypt unto the great river, the river Euphrates
  - Q: When did the nation of Israel ever stretch from the Nile to the Euphrates?

## 20.

Genesis 19: <sup>4</sup> But before they lay down, the men of the city, even the men of Sodom, compassed the house round, both old and young, all the people from every quarter: <sup>5</sup> and they called unto Lot, and said unto him, Where are the men which came in to thee this night? bring them out unto us, that we may know them. <sup>6</sup> And Lot went out at the door unto them, and shut the door after him, <sup>7</sup> and said, I pray you, brethren, do not so wickedly.... <sup>11</sup> And [the angels] smote the men that were at the door of the house with blindness, both small and great: so that they wearied themselves to find the door.

Also, while you're at it, do you really believe that after they were all miraculously struck with blindness they continued to "weary themselves" to try to get into Lot's house?)

# 21.

- Genesis 26: <sup>34</sup> And Esau was forty years old when he took to wife Judith the daughter of Beeri the Hittite, and Bashemath the daughter of Elon the Hittite
- Genesis 36: <sup>1</sup> Now these are the generations of Esau, who is Edom. <sup>2</sup> Esau took his wives of the daughters of Canaan; Adah the daughter of Elon the Hittite, and Aholibamah the daughter of Anah the daughter of Zibeon the Hivite; <sup>3</sup> and Bashemath Ishmael's daughter, sister of Nebajoth.

Genesis 27: <sup>1</sup> And it came to pass, that when Isaac was old, and his eyes were dim, so that he could not see, he called Esau his eldest son, and said unto him, My son: and he said unto him, Behold, here am I. <sup>2</sup> And he said, Behold now, I am old, I know not the day of my death: <sup>3</sup> now therefore take, I pray thee, thy weapons, thy quiver and thy bow, and go out to the field, and take me some venison; <sup>4</sup> and make me savoury meat, such as I love, and bring it to me, that I may eat; that my soul may bless thee before I die.

Q: How near death was Isaac when he gave his blessing?

#### 23.

Genesis 29: <sup>18</sup> And Jacob loved Rachel; and said, I will serve thee seven years for Rachel thy younger daughter.... <sup>23</sup> And it came to pass in the evening, that he took Leah his daughter, and brought her to him; and he went in unto her. ... <sup>25</sup> And it came to pass, that in the morning, behold, it was Leah Q: Would you sleep with a woman, not knowing if she was actually the one you married?

#### 24.

(Note: Joseph was one of the twelve original patriarchs of Israel, and at this point didn't even have any children yet.)

# 26.

Genesis 46: <sup>8</sup> And these are the names of the children of Israel, which came into Egypt, Jacob and his sons: Reuben, Jacob's firstborn. <sup>9</sup> And the sons of Reuben; Hanoch, and Phallu, and Hezron, and Carmi.

- <sup>10</sup> And the sons of Simeon; Jemuel, and Jamin, and Ohad, and Jachin, and Zohar, and Shaul the son of a Canaanitish woman.

- Exodus 3: <sup>7</sup> And the LORD said, I have surely seen the affliction of my people which are in Egypt, and have heard their cry by reason of their taskmasters; for I know their sorrows; <sup>8</sup> and I am come down to deliver them out of the hand of the Egyptians, and to bring them up out of that land unto a good land and a large, unto a land flowing with milk and honey
  - Q: To those familiar with Near Eastern geography: Was the land that became Israel a land that could be described as "flowing with milk and honey"?

#### 28.

Exodus 4: <sup>21</sup> And the LORD said unto Moses, When thou goest to return into Egypt, see that thou do all those wonders before Pharaoh, which I have put in thine hand: but I will harden his heart, that he shall not let the people go. <sup>22</sup> And thou shalt say unto Pharaoh, Thus saith the LORD, Israel is my son, even my firstborn: <sup>23</sup> And I say unto thee, Let my son go, that he may serve me: and if thou refuse to let him go, behold, I will slay thy son, even thy firstborn. <sup>24</sup> And it came to pass by the way in the inn, that the LORD met him, and sought to kill him.

If we assume that there were also 600 thousand women and another 600 thousand children, for a total of 1,800,000 people, and they were to form a line three abreast with two feet from the "belt buckle" of one to the one behind him (close enough to undoubtedly be tripping over each other's feet) how long would this line of people be if we exclude all the animals? (To save you getting out your calculator: 1 mile = 5280 feet; the line would obviously be 600,000 x 2 feet = 1,200,000 feet long. 1,200,000 / 5280 = 227 miles long.)

#### 32.

Q: God had just miraculously led Isreal out of Egypt, killing the firstborn in every Egyptian household and drowning the Egyptian army in the Red Sea, and was taking them to exterminate all the peoples of the Promised Land, but the Philistines were just too much to deal with. Right?

## 34.

Exodus 21: <sup>7</sup> And if a man sell his daughter to be a maidservant, she shall not go out as the menservants do. <sup>8</sup> If she please not her master, who hath betrothed her to himself, then shall he let her be redeemed: to sell her unto a strange nation he shall have no power, seeing he hath dealt deceitfully with her. <sup>9</sup> And if he have betrothed her unto his son, he shall deal with her after the manner of daughters. <sup>10</sup> If he take him another wife; her food, her raiment, and her duty of marriage, shall he not diminish. <sup>11</sup> And if he do not these three unto her, then shall she go out free without money.

Q: So does he have to provide them or not? What punishment or enforcement did he face if he didn't?

#### 35

Exodus 22: <sup>28</sup> Thou shalt not revile the gods, nor curse the ruler of thy people.

Q: Who were these other gods that were to be respected?

## 36.

Exodus 23: 32 Thou shalt make no covenant with ... their gods

Q: How many gods were there who were capable of making covenants?

Exodus 40: <sup>12</sup> And thou shalt bring Aaron and his sons unto the door of the tabernacle of the congregation, and wash them with water. <sup>13</sup> And thou shalt put upon Aaron the holy garments, and anoint him, and sanctify him; that he may minister unto me in the priest's office. <sup>14</sup> And thou shalt bring his sons, and clothe them with coats: <sup>15</sup> and thou shalt anoint them, as thou didst anoint their father, that they may minister unto me in the priest's office: for their anointing shall surely be an everlasting priesthood throughout their generations.

Q: What kind of hoof does a camel have? (Answer: Divided)

Leviticus 12: <sup>1</sup> And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, <sup>2</sup> Speak unto the children of Israel, saying, If a woman have conceived seed, and born a ... child .... <sup>6</sup> ... when the days of her purifying are fulfilled, for a son, or for a daughter, she shall bring a lamb of the first year for a burnt offering, and a young pigeon, or a turtledove, for a sin offering

Q: Why does having a child require a sin offering? Didn't god tell us to "be fruitful and multiply"?

## 44.

Deuteronomy 7: <sup>1</sup> When the LORD thy God shall bring thee into the land whither thou goest to possess it, and hath cast out many nations before thee... <sup>3</sup> neither shalt thou make marriages with them; thy daughter thou shalt not give unto his son, nor his daughter shalt thou take unto thy son.

Vs:

  - Q: Whether there is a contradiction here is subject to interpretation. God commanded Saul to completely destroy the Amalekites. Saul went to "a city of" (per King James Version) Amalek and destroyed them all, except for the king (who Samuel later killed). He then claimed he had "utterly destroyed" the Amalekites. The only ways in which the Bible says Saul disobeyed god was in keeping the king, who was later killed, and some animals alive. If indeed he "utterly destroyed" the Amalekites, where did these Amalekites come from in a later chapter?

#### 78.

1 Samuel 15: <sup>6</sup> And Saul said unto the Kenites, Go, depart, get you down from among the Amalekites, lest I destroy you with them: for ye shewed kindness to all the children of Israel, when they came up out of Egypt. So the Kenites departed from among the Amalekites.

- 1 Samuel 19: <sup>9</sup> And the evil spirit from the LORD was upon Saul, as he sat in his house with his javelin in his hand: and David played with his hand. <sup>10</sup> And Saul sought to smite David even to the wall with the javelin: but he slipped away out of Saul's presence, and he smote the javelin into the wall
- Q: Doesn't it seem strange that god's spirit (evil or not) would try to kill David who had been selected by god to be the next king?

- 1 Samuel 7: <sup>13</sup> So the Philistines were subdued, and they came no more into the coast of Israel: and the hand of the LORD was against the Philistines all the days of Samuel.
- 1 Samuel 14: <sup>22</sup> Likewise all the men of Israel which had hid themselves in mount Ephraim, when they heard that the Philistines fled, even they also followed hard after them in the battle. <sup>23</sup> So the LORD saved Israel that day:... <sup>31</sup> And they smote the Philistines that day from Michmash to Aijalon:... <sup>47</sup> So Saul took the kingdom over Israel, and fought against all his enemies on every side, against Moab, and against the children of Ammon, and against Edom, and against the kings of Zobah, and against the Philistines: and whithersoever he turned himself, he vexed them.

# Vs:

- 1 Samuel 17: <sup>3</sup> And the Philistines stood on a mountain on the one side, and Israel stood on a mountain on the other side: and there was a valley between them. <sup>4</sup> And there went out a champion out of the camp of the Philistines, named Goliath, of Gath, whose height was six cubits and a span.... <sup>8</sup> And he stood and cried unto the armies of Israel, and said unto them, Why are ye come out to set your battle in array? am not I a Philistine, and ye servants to Saul? choose you a man for you, and let him come down to me. <sup>9</sup> If he be able to fight with me, and to kill me, then will we be your servants: but if I prevail against him, and kill him, then shall ye be our servants, and serve us. ... <sup>24</sup> And all the men of Israel, when they saw the man, fled from him, and were sore afraid.
- Q: If the Israelites had been whipping the butts of the Philistines as described, why didn't they just attack the Philistines, rather than let this one man change the rules of the game and turn it into a two-man contest?

#### 83.

- 1 Samuel 16: <sup>17</sup> And Saul said unto his servants, Provide me now a man that can play well, and bring him to me. <sup>18</sup> Then answered one of the servants, and said, Behold, I have seen a son of Jesse the Bethlehemite, that is cunning in playing, and a mighty valiant man, and a man of war, and prudent in matters, and a comely person, and the Lord is with him. <sup>19</sup> Wherefore Saul sent messengers unto Jesse, and said, Send me David thy son, which is with the sheep. <sup>20</sup> And Jesse took an ass laden with bread, and a bottle of wine, and a kid, and sent them by David his son unto Saul. <sup>21</sup> And David came to Saul, and stood before him: and he loved him greatly; and he became his armourbearer....
- 1 Samuel 17: <sup>32</sup> And David said to Saul, Let no man's heart fail because of him; thy servant will go and fight with this Philistine....<sup>37</sup> ... And Saul said unto David, Go, and the LORD be with thee.... <sup>55</sup> And when Saul saw David go forth against the Philistine, he said unto Abner, the captain of the host, Abner, whose son is this youth? And Abner said, As thy soul liveth, O king, I cannot tell. <sup>56</sup> And the king said, Enquire thou whose son the stripling is.
  - Q: Saul didn't even refer to David by name. Did he even know who this "stripling" was that he "loved greatly," had been his harp player and armor bearer, and had just discussed the killing of the giant with him?

# 84.

- 1 Samuel 18: <sup>6</sup> And it came to pass as they came, when David was returned from the slaughter of the Philistine, that the women came out of all cities of Israel, singing and dancing, to meet king Saul, with tabrets, with joy, and with instruments of musick. <sup>7</sup> And the women answered one another as they played, and said, Saul hath slain his thousands, and David his ten thousands.
  - Q: Did they really sing this song after David had killed just the one Philistine, Goliath?

#### 85.

1 Samuel 18: <sup>27</sup> Wherefore David arose and went, he and his men, and slew of the Philistines two hundred men; and David brought their foreskins, and they gave them in full tale to the king, that he might be the king's son in law. And Saul gave him Michal his daughter to wife.

- 1 Samuel 19: <sup>8</sup> And there was war again: and David went out, and fought with the Philistines, and slew them with a great slaughter; and they fled from him.
- 1 Samuel 23: <sup>5</sup> So David and his men went to Keilah, and fought with the Philistines, and brought away their cattle, and smote them with a great slaughter. So David saved the inhabitants of Keilah.

Vs:

- 1 Samuel 27: ¹And David said in his heart, I shall now perish one day by the hand of Saul: there is nothing better for me than that I should speedily escape into the land of the Philistines.... ² And David arose, and he passed over with the six hundred men that were with him unto Achish, the son of Maoch, king of Gath.... ⁵ And David said unto Achish, If I have now found grace in thine eyes, let them give me a place in some town in the country, that I may dwell there: for why should thy servant dwell in the royal city with thee? ⁶ Then Achish gave him Ziklag that day: wherefore Ziklag pertaineth unto the kings of Judah unto this day.
- 1 Samuel 28: <sup>1</sup> And it came to pass in those days, that the Philistines gathered their armies together for warfare, to fight with Israel. And Achish said unto David, Know thou assuredly, that thou shalt go out with me to battle, thou and thy men. <sup>2</sup> And David said to Achish, Surely thou shalt know what thy servant can do. And Achish said to David, Therefore will I make thee keeper of mine head for ever.
- Q: Did the Philistine king Achish really give the man who had slaughtered so many Philistines a city and make him his own personal bodyguard?

#### 86.

1 Samuel 19: <sup>12</sup> So Michal let David down through a window: and he went, and fled, and escaped. <sup>13</sup> And Michal took an image, and laid it in the bed...

Q: How many images do you think godly David had in his house?

# 87.

1 Samuel 19: <sup>19</sup> And it was told Saul, saying, Behold, David is at Naioth in Ramah. <sup>20</sup> And Saul sent messengers to take David ... <sup>22</sup> Then went he also to Ramah, and came to a great well that is in Sechu: and he asked and said, Where are Samuel and David? And one said, Behold, they be at Naioth in Ramah. <sup>23</sup> And he went thither to Naioth in Ramah

Q: If Saul already knew that David was in Naioth why did he go to Sechu and ask where David was?

#### 88.

1 Samuel 20: <sup>18</sup> Then Jonathan said to David, Tomorrow is the new moon: and thou shalt be missed, because thy seat will be empty. <sup>19</sup> And when thou hast stayed three days, then thou shalt go down quickly, and come to the place where thou didst hide thyself when the business was in hand, and shalt remain by the stone Ezel. <sup>20</sup> And I will shoot three arrows on the side thereof, as though I shot at a mark. <sup>21</sup> And, behold, I will send a lad, saying, Go, find out the arrows. If I expressly say unto the lad, Behold, the arrows are on this side of thee, take them; then come thou: for there is peace to thee, and no hurt; as the LORD liveth. <sup>22</sup> But if I say thus unto the young man, Behold, the arrows are beyond thee; go thy way: for the LORD hath sent thee away.... <sup>35</sup> And it came to pass in the morning, that Jonathan went out into the field at the time appointed with David, and a little lad with him.... <sup>41</sup> And as soon as the lad was gone, David arose out of a place toward the south, and fell on his face to the ground, and bowed himself three times: and they kissed one another, and wept one with another, until David exceeded.

Q: Would Jonathan really go through all this hoopla if he was going to talk to David anyway?

# 89.

1 Samuel 21: <sup>12</sup> And David laid up these words in his heart, and was sore afraid of Achish the king of Gath. <sup>13</sup> And he changed his behaviour before them, and feigned himself mad in their hands, and scrabbled on the doors of the gate, and let his spittle fall down upon his beard.

Q: Are you proud of our great hero David (who had fought so valiantly)?

- 1 Samuel 25: <sup>37</sup> But it came to pass in the morning, when the wine was gone out of Nabal, and his wife had told him these things, that his heart died within him, and he became as a stone. <sup>38</sup> And it came to pass about ten days after, that the LORD smote Nabal, that he died.
  - Q: How long can you live with a dead heart? (Should Nabal be entered into the Guinness Book of World Records?)

# 91.

- 1 Samuel 28: <sup>8</sup> And Saul disguised himself, and put on other raiment, and he went, and two men with him, and they came to the woman by night: and he said, I pray thee, divine unto me by the familiar spirit, and bring me him up, whom I shall name unto thee.... <sup>11</sup> Then said the woman, Whom shall I bring up unto thee? And he said, Bring me up Samuel.... <sup>16</sup> Then said Samuel, Wherefore then dost thou ask of me, seeing the LORD is departed from thee, and is become thine enemy?.... <sup>19</sup> Moreover the LORD will also deliver Israel with thee into the hand of the Philistines: and tomorrow shalt thou and thy sons be with me: the LORD also shall deliver the host of Israel into the hand of the Philistines.
- Q: Do god's prophets (like Samuel) and his enemies both go to the same place? (And do people really speak from the dead?)

# 92.

1 Samuel 30: <sup>1</sup> And it came to pass, when David and his men were come to Ziklag on the third day, that the Amalekites had invaded the south, and Ziklag, and smitten Ziklag, and burned it with fire; <sup>2</sup> and had taken the women captives, that were therein: they slew not any, either great or small, but carried them away, and went on their way.

#### Vs:

- 1 Samuel 27: <sup>1</sup>And David said in his heart, I shall now perish one day by the hand of Saul: there is nothing better for me than that I should speedily escape into the land of the Philistines. ... <sup>7</sup> And the time that David dwelt in the country of the Philistines was a full year and four months. <sup>8</sup> And David and his men went up, and invaded the Geshurites, and the Gezrites, and the Amalekites: for those nations were of old the inhabitants of the land, as thou goest to Shur, even unto the land of Egypt. <sup>9</sup> And David smote the land, and left neither man nor woman alive, and took away the sheep, and the oxen, and the asses, and the camels, and the apparel, and returned, and came to Achish. <sup>10</sup> And Achish said, Whither have ye made a road to day? 1 Kings 15: <sup>5</sup> Because David did that which was right in the eyes of the LORD, and turned not aside from any thing that he commanded him all the days of his life, save only in the matter of Uriah the Hittite.

#### Vs:

Deuteronomy 23: <sup>3</sup> An Ammonite or Moabite shall not enter into the congregation of the LORD; even to their tenth generation shall they not enter into the congregation of the LORD for ever

Nehemiah 13: <sup>1</sup>On that day they read in the book of Moses in the audience of the people; and therein was found written, that the Ammonite and the Moabite should not come into the congregation of God for ever

#### Vs:

Ruth 1: <sup>4</sup> And they took them wives of the women of Moab; the name of the one was Orpah, and the name of the other Ruth.... Ruth 4: <sup>13</sup> So Boaz took Ruth, and she was his wife: and when he went in unto her, the LORD gave her conception, and she bare a son. <sup>14</sup> And the women said unto Naomi, Blessed be the LORD, which hath not left thee this day without a kinsman, that his name may be famous in Israel. <sup>15</sup> And he shall be unto thee a restorer of thy life, and a nourisher of thine old age: for thy daughter in law, which loveth thee, which is better to thee than seven sons, hath born him. <sup>16</sup> And Naomi took the child, and laid it in her bosom, and became nurse unto it. <sup>17</sup> And the women her neighbours gave it a name, saying, There is a son born to Naomi; and they called his name Obed: he is the father of Jesse, the father of David.

Q: Isn't it interesting that King David's great-grandmother was one of those Moabites who weren't even allowed into the "congregation of the lord"?

# 95.

2 Samuel 11: <sup>26</sup> And when the wife of Uriah heard that Uriah her husband was dead, she mourned for her husband. <sup>27</sup> And when the mourning was past, David sent and fetched her to his house, and she became his wife, and bare him a son. But the thing that David had done displeased the LORD.... <sup>15</sup> ... And the LORD struck the child that Uriah's wife bare unto David, and it was very sick. <sup>18</sup> And it came to pass on the seventh day, that the child died.... <sup>24</sup> And David comforted Bath-sheba his wife, and went in unto her, and lay with her: and she bare a son, and he called his name Solomon: and the LORD loved him.

#### Vs:

1 Chronicles 3: <sup>1</sup> Now these were the sons of David.... <sup>5</sup> And these were born unto him in Jerusalem; Shimea, and Shobab, and Nathan, and Solomon, four, of Bath-shua the daughter of Ammiel <u>Q:</u> Which number was Solomon of Bathsheba's (Bathshua's) sons?

#### 96.

2 Samuel 13: <sup>14</sup> Howbeit he would not hearken unto her voice: but, being stronger than she, forced her, and lay with her. <sup>15</sup> Then Amnon hated her exceedingly; so that the hatred wherewith he hated her was greater than the love wherewith he had loved her. And Amnon said unto her, Arise, be gone. <sup>16</sup> And she said unto him, There is no cause: this evil in sending me away is greater than the other that thou didst unto me. But he would not hearken unto her. <sup>17</sup> Then he called his servant that ministered unto him, and said, Put now this woman out from me, and bolt the door after her.

Q: Isn't it rather a strange girl who refuses to leave her rapist?

# 97.

2 Samuel 15: <sup>13</sup> And there came a messenger to David, saying, The hearts of the men of Israel are after Absalom. <sup>14</sup> And David said unto all his servants that were with him at Jerusalem, Arise, and let us flee; for we shall not else escape from Absalom: make speed to depart, lest he overtake us suddenly, and bring

evil upon us, and smite the city with the edge of the sword. <sup>15</sup> And the king's servants said unto the king, Behold, thy servants are ready to do whatsoever my lord the king shall appoint. <sup>16</sup> And the king went forth, and all his household after him. And the king left ten women, which were concubines, to keep the house. <sup>17</sup> And the king went forth, and all the people after him.... <sup>23</sup> And all the country wept with a loud voice, and all the people passed over: the king also himself passed over the brook Kidron, and all the people passed over, toward the way of the wilderness.

Q: If "all the country" were sympathetic to David, then who was following Absalom?

#### 98.

- 2 Samuel 16: <sup>15</sup> And Absalom, and all the people the men of Israel, came to Jerusalem, and Ahithophel with him.
  - Q: Jerusalem must have been pretty full that day if every man from Israel was there, don't you think?

#### 99.

- 2 Samuel 18: <sup>14</sup> Then said Joab, I may not tarry thus with thee. And he took three darts in his hand, and thrust them through the heart of Absalom, while he was yet alive in the midst of the oak. <sup>15</sup> And ten young men that bare Joab's armour compassed about and smote Absalom, and slew him.
- Q: Didn't Absalom have an amazingly tough heart that it could be pierced through three times and he would still be alive so that the other men could then kill him? ("They don't make 'em like they used to!")

# 100.

2 Samuel 21: <sup>8</sup> But the king took the two sons of Rizpah the daughter of Aiah, whom she bare unto Saul, Armoni and Mephibosheth; and the five sons of Michal the daughter of Saul, whom she brought up for Adriel the son of Barzillai the Meholathite: <sup>9</sup> and he delivered them into the hands of the Gibeonites, and they hanged them in the hill before the LORD: and they fell all seven together, and were put to death in the days of harvest, in the first days, in the beginning of barley harvest.... And after that God was intreated for the land.

Q: Does god approve of/accept human sacrifice?

# 101.

2 Samuel 24: <sup>1</sup> And again the anger of the LORD was kindled against Israel, and he moved David against them to say, Go, number Israel and Judah.... <sup>10</sup> And David's heart smote him after that he had numbered the people. And David said unto the LORD, I have sinned greatly in that I have done: and now, I beseech thee, O LORD, take away the iniquity of thy servant; for I have done very foolishly.

Q: How sinful is it to do what god moves you to do?

#### 102.

1 Kings 1: <sup>1</sup> Now king David was old and stricken in years; and they covered him with clothes, but he gat no heat. ... <sup>5</sup> Then Adonijah the son of Haggith exalted himself, saying, I will be king... <sup>16</sup> And Bathsheba bowed, and did obeisance unto the king. And the king said, What wouldest thou? <sup>17</sup> And she said unto him, My lord, thou swarest by the LORD thy God unto thine handmaid, saying, Assuredly Solomon thy son shall reign after me, and he shall sit upon my throne. <sup>18</sup> And now, behold, Adonijah reigneth; and now, my lord the king, thou knowest it not... <sup>33</sup> The king also said unto them, Take with you the servants of your lord, and cause Solomon my son to ride upon mine own mule, and bring him down to Gihon: <sup>34</sup> And let Zadok the priest and Nathan the prophet anoint him there king over Israel: and blow ye with the trumpet, and say, God save king Solomon.

Vs:

1 Chronicles 22: <sup>1</sup>Then David said, This is the house of the LORD God, and this is the altar of the burnt offering for Israel. <sup>2</sup> And David commanded... <sup>5</sup> And David said, Solomon my son is young and tender, and the house that is to be builded for the LORD must be exceeding magnifical ... <sup>6</sup> Then he called for Solomon his

son, and charged him to build an house for the LORD God of Israel. <sup>7</sup> And David said to Solomon, ... <sup>8</sup> ... the word of the LORD came to me, saying, ... <sup>9</sup> Behold, a son shall be born to thee ... for his name shall be Solomon, and I will give peace and quietness unto Israel in his days. <sup>10</sup> ... and I will establish the throne of his kingdom over Israel for ever. <sup>11</sup> Now, my son, the LORD be with thee; and prosper thou, and build the house of the LORD thy God, as he hath said of thee. ... <sup>17</sup> David also commanded all the princes of Israel to help Solomon his son, saying, <sup>18</sup> Is not the LORD your God with you? and hath he not given you rest on every side? for he hath given the inhabitants of the land into mine hand; and the land is subdued before the LORD, and before his people.

- 1 Chronicles 23: <sup>1</sup> So when David was old and full of days, he made Solomon his son king over Israel. <sup>2</sup> And he gathered together all the princes of Israel, with the priests and the Levites. ... <sup>6</sup> And David divided them into courses ...
- Q: Was David an old, feeble man or still a strong leader when he made Solomon king? There may not be an absolute contradiction here, but don't these two accounts seem hard to correlate?

#### 103.

1 Kings 1: <sup>15</sup> And Bath-sheba went in unto the king into the chamber.... <sup>22</sup> And, lo, while she yet talked with the king, Nathan the prophet also came in.... <sup>28</sup> Then king David answered and said, Call me Bath-sheba.... <sup>32</sup> And king David said, Call me Zadok the priest, and Nathan the prophet....

Q: How could Bath-sheba and Nathan come in if they were already there?

#### 104.

1 Kings 5: <sup>2</sup> And Solomon sent to Hiram, saying... <sup>5</sup> And, behold, I purpose to build an house unto the name of the LORD my God.... <sup>6</sup> Now therefore command thou that they hew me cedar trees out of Lebanon.... <sup>11</sup> And Solomon gave Hiram twenty thousand measures of wheat for food to his household, and twenty measures of pure oil: thus gave Solomon to Hiram year by year.

# Vs:

- 2 Chronicles 2: <sup>3</sup> And Solomon sent to Huram the king of Tyre, saying, As thou didst deal with David my father, and didst send him cedars to build him an house to dwell therein, even so deal with me. <sup>4</sup> Behold, I build an house to the name of the LORD my God... <sup>10</sup> And, behold, I will give to thy servants, the hewers that cut timber, twenty thousand measures of beaten wheat, and twenty thousand measures of barley, and twenty thousand baths of wine, and twenty thousand baths of oil.
- Q: Did Solomon give barley and wine? To whom did he give them? Was it annually or a one-time thing?

# 105.

2 Chronicles 9: <sup>23</sup> And all the kings of the earth sought the presence of Solomon, to hear his wisdom, that God had put in his heart.

Q: How many times do you suppose the Aztec king "sought the presence of Solomon"?

# 106.

1 Kings 6: <sup>1</sup> And it came to pass in the four hundred and eightieth year after the children of Israel were come out of the land of Egypt, in the fourth year of Solomon's reign over Israel, in the month Zif, which is the second month, that he began to build the house of the LORD. <sup>2</sup> And the house which king Solomon built for the LORD, the length thereof was threescore cubits, and the breadth thereof twenty cubits, and the height thereof thirty cubits.

# Vs:

- 2 Chronicles 2: <sup>1</sup> And Solomon determined to build an house for the name of the LORD, and an house for his kingdom. <sup>2</sup> And Solomon told out threescore and ten thousand men to bear burdens, and fourscore thousand to hew in the mountain, and three thousand and six hundred to oversee them.
- Q: Do you think Solomon hired enough men to build a 90' x 30' x 45' building? (One cubit is approx. 1 ½ feet.)

- 2 Chronicles 3: <sup>3</sup> Now these are the things wherein Solomon was instructed for the building of the house of God. The length by cubits after the first measure was threescore cubits, and the breadth twenty cubits. <sup>4</sup> And the porch that was in the front of the house, the length of it was according to the breadth of the house, twenty cubits, and the height was an hundred and twenty: and he overlaid it within with pure gold.
  - Q: Do you think Solomon made the porch high enough for a building 60 cubits long and 20 cubits wide?

#### 108.

- 1 Kings 7: <sup>23</sup> And he made a molten sea, ten cubits from the one brim to the other: it was round all about, and his height was five cubits: and a line of thirty cubits did compass it round about.
- 2 Chronicles 4: <sup>2</sup> Also he made a molten sea of ten cubits from brim to brim, round in compass, and five cubits the height thereof; and a line of thirty cubits did compass it round about.
  - Q: Was the value of pi a little less in those days?

# 109.

- 2 Chronicles 7: <sup>5</sup> And king Solomon offered a sacrifice of twenty and two thousand oxen, and an hundred and twenty thousand sheep.... <sup>9</sup> ... for they kept the dedication of the altar seven days, and the feast seven days.
  - Q: How many of Solomon's animals were sacrificed per hour during the seven days of this feast?

#### 110.

2 Chronicles 10: <sup>1</sup> And Rehoboam went to Shechem: for to Shechem were all Israel come to make him king.

O: How big of a gathering place do suppose it was if it held all Israel?

# 111.

- 1 Kings 12: <sup>18</sup>Then king Rehoboam sent Adoram, who was over the tribute; and all Israel stoned him with stones, that he died.
- Q: How big of a pile of stones would that be if everyone in Israel threw just one stone? (Israel was described as having hundreds of thousands of soldiers, besides women, children, etc.)

# 112.

- 1 Kings 14: <sup>1</sup> At that time Abijah the son of Jeroboam fell sick. <sup>2</sup> And Jeroboam said to his wife, Arise, I pray thee, and disguise thyself, that thou be not known to be the wife of Jeroboam; and get thee to Shiloh: behold, there is Ahijah the prophet, which told me that I should be king over this people. <sup>3</sup> And take with thee ten loaves, and cracknels, and a cruse of honey, and go to him: he shall tell thee what shall become of the child.
  - Q: What was the point of disguising herself if she was going to ask about their own child?

# 113.

2 Chronicles 13: <sup>3</sup> And Abijah set the battle in array with an army of valiant men of war, even four hundred thousand chosen men: Jeroboam also set the battle in array against him with eight hundred thousand chosen men, being mighty men of valour.... <sup>17</sup> And Abijah and his people slew them with a great slaughter: so there fell down slain of Israel five hundred thousand chosen men.

Vs:

1 Kings 20: <sup>13</sup> And, behold, there came a prophet unto Ahab king of Israel, saying, Thus saith the LORD, Hast thou seen all this great multitude? behold, I will deliver it into thine hand this day; and thou shalt know that I am the LORD.... <sup>15</sup> Then he numbered the young men of the princes of the provinces, and they were two hundred and thirty two: and after them he numbered all the people, even all the children of Israel, being seven thousand.

Q: If we accept these rather unbelievable numbers of hundreds of thousands of soldiers fighting and being killed, how did the 300,000 remaining soldiers dwindle to a total population of Israel of 7,000 by the time of Ahab?

#### 114.

1 Kings 17: <sup>7</sup> And it came to pass after a while, that the brook dried up, because there had been no rain in the land.... 1 Kings 18: <sup>19</sup> Now therefore send, and gather to me all Israel unto mount Carmel, and the prophets of Baal four hundred and fifty, and the prophets of the groves four hundred, which eat at Jezebel's table. <sup>20</sup> So Ahab sent unto all the children of Israel, and gathered the prophets together unto mount Carmel.... <sup>33</sup> And he put the wood in order, and cut the bullock in pieces, and laid him on the wood, and said, Fill four barrels with water, and pour it on the burnt sacrifice, and on the wood. <sup>34</sup> And he said, Do it the second time. Q: Where do you suppose they got all these barrels of water on top of a mountain in the middle of a drought?

#### 115.

- 1 Kings 18: <sup>36</sup> And it came to pass at the time of the offering of the evening sacrifice, that Elijah the prophet came near, and said, LORD God of Abraham, Isaac, and of Israel, let it be known this day that thou art God in Israel, and that I am thy servant, and that I have done all these things at thy word. <sup>37</sup> Hear me, O LORD, hear me, that this people may know that thou art the LORD God, and that thou hast turned their heart back again. <sup>38</sup> Then the fire of the LORD fell, and consumed the burnt sacrifice, and the wood, and the stones, and the dust, and licked up the water that was in the trench.
- 1 Kings 19: <sup>4</sup> But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a juniper tree: and he requested for himself that he might die; and said, It is enough; now, O LORD, take away my life; for I am not better than my fathers.
  - Q: Did the man that had just called down fire from heaven really think so pitifully of himself?

1 Kings 19: <sup>13</sup> And it was so, when Elijah heard it, that he wrapped his face in his mantle, and went out, and stood in the entering in of the cave.... <sup>15</sup> And the LORD said unto him, Go, return on thy way to the wilderness of Damascus: and when thou comest, anoint Hazael to be king over Syria: <sup>16</sup> and Jehu the son of Nimshi shalt thou anoint to be king over Israel

Vs:

- 2 Kings 9: <sup>1</sup> And Elisha the prophet called one of the children of the prophets, and said unto him, Gird up thy loins, and take this box of oil in thine hand, and go to Ramoth-gilead: <sup>2</sup> and when thou comest thither, look out there Jehu the son of Jehoshaphat the son of Nimshi, and go in, and make him arise up from among his brethren, and carry him to an inner chamber; <sup>3</sup> then take the box of oil, and pour it on his head, and say, Thus saith the LORD, I have anointed thee king over Israel.
  - Q: Why didn't Elijah anoint Jehu like god told him to? Why did Elisha (Elijah's successor) have to send someone to do it?

# 117.

- 2 Kings 6: <sup>18</sup> And when they came down to him, Elisha prayed unto the LORD, and said, Smite this people, I pray thee, with blindness. And he smote them with blindness according to the word of Elisha. <sup>19</sup> And Elisha said unto them, This is not the way, neither is this the city: follow me, and I will bring you to the man whom ye seek. But he led them to Samaria.
- Q: Do you believe that a whole troop of soldiers being suddenly struck with blindness would continue their search for their quarry?

2 Chronicles 21: <sup>1</sup> Now Jehoshaphat slept with his fathers, and was buried with his fathers in the city of David. And Jehoram his son reigned in his stead. <sup>2</sup> And he had brethren the sons of Jehoshaphat, Azariah, and Jehiel, and Zechariah, and Azariah, and Michael, and Shephatiah

Q: He had a brother named Azariah and another brother named Azariah?

# 119.

2 Kings 16: <sup>2</sup>Twenty years old was Ahaz when he began to reign, and reigned sixteen years in Jerusalem....
<sup>20</sup>And Ahaz slept with his fathers, and was buried with his fathers in the city of David: and Hezekiah his son reigned in his stead....

Vs:

2 Kings 18: <sup>1</sup> Now it came to pass in the third year of Hoshea son of Elah king of Israel, that Hezekiah the son of Ahaz king of Judah began to reign. <sup>2</sup> Twenty and five years old was he when he began to reign <u>Q:</u> How old was Ahaz when Hezekiah was born?

# 120.

2 Chronicles 21: <sup>5</sup> Jehoram was thirty and two years old when he began to reign, and he reigned eight years in Jerusalem... <sup>17</sup> so that there was never a son left him, save Jehoahaz, the youngest of his sons

Vs:

2 Chronicles 22: <sup>6</sup> ...And Azariah the son of Jehoram king of Judah went down to see Jehoram the son of Ahab at Jezreel, because he was sick.

Vs:

2 Chronicles 22: 1...So Ahaziah the son of Jehoram king of Judah reigned

<u>Q:</u> How many different names did Jehoram's son have?

# **121.**

- 1 Samuel 15: <sup>17</sup> And Samuel said, When thou wast little in thine own sight, wast thou not made the head of the tribes of Israel, and the LORD anointed thee king over Israel? ... <sup>26</sup> And Samuel said unto Saul, I will not return with thee: for thou hast rejected the word of the LORD, and the LORD hath rejected thee from being king over Israel.

Psalm 35 - A Psalm of David: <sup>11</sup> False witnesses did rise up; they laid to my charge things that I knew not. <sup>12</sup> They rewarded me evil for good to the spoiling of my soul. <sup>13</sup> But as for me, when they were sick, my clothing was sackcloth: I humbled my soul with fasting; and my prayer returned into mine own bosom. <sup>14</sup> I behaved myself as though he had been my friend or brother: I bowed down heavily, as one that mourneth for his mother.

Vs:

1 Samuel 27: <sup>1</sup>And David said in his heart, I shall now perish one day by the hand of Saul: there is nothing better for me than that I should speedily escape into the land of the Philistines.... <sup>7</sup> And the time that David dwelt in the country of the Philistines was a full year and four months. <sup>8</sup> And David and his men went up, and invaded the Geshurites, and the Gezrites, and the Amalekites: for those nations were of old the inhabitants of the land, as thou goest to Shur, even unto the land of Egypt. <sup>9</sup> And David smote the land, and left neither man nor woman alive, and took away the sheep, and the oxen, and the asses, and the camels, and the apparel, and returned, and came to Achish. <sup>10</sup> And Achish said, Whither have ye made a road to day? Q: Does god sleep?

# 125.

Psalm 50: <sup>14</sup> Offer unto God thanksgiving; and pay thy vows unto the most High: <sup>15</sup> and call upon me in the day of trouble: I will deliver thee, and thou shalt glorify me.

Q: Do you suppose that all those Christians who were thrown to the lions in the days of the Romans must have forgotten to call upon god in their day of trouble?

# 126.

Psalm 58: 8 As a snail which melteth, let every one of them pass away

Q: Do you suppose these melting snails went extinct with the dinosaurs?

# **127.**

Psalm 72: A Psalm for Solomon. <sup>1</sup> Give the king thy judgments, O God, and thy righteousness unto the king's son..... <sup>8</sup> He shall have dominion also from sea to sea, and from the river unto the ends of the earth.

Q: When did Solomon ever have dominion from sea to sea or "unto the ends of the earth"?

#### 128.

Psalm 121: <sup>6</sup> The sun shall not smite thee by day, nor the moon by night.

Q: What do suppose the chances are that the moon would smite someone?

Proverbs 10: <sup>3</sup> The LORD will not suffer the soul of the righteous to famish: but he casteth away the substance of the wicked.

Q: Have you ever seen any signs of god allowing righteous people to famish? Have you ever known of any wicked people to die rich?

#### 130.

Proverbs 10: <sup>27</sup> The fear of the LORD prolongeth days: but the years of the wicked shall be shortened.

Q: Have you ever seen someone who fears god die young? Have you ever heard of someone wicked living to a ripe old age?

#### 131.

Proverbs 19: <sup>5</sup> A false witness shall not be unpunished, and he that speaketh lies shall not escape.

Q: You don't suppose anyone has gotten away with lying since this was written, do you?

#### 132.

Proverbs 19: <sup>23</sup> The fear of the LORD tendeth to life: and he that hath it shall abide satisfied; he shall not be visited with evil.

Q: You don't know anyone who fears the lord who has been "visited" by evil, do you?

# 133.

Many more verses in the Bible promising wellbeing to the righteous and woe to the wicked.

Q: Does god keep his promises?

#### 134.

Proverbs 30: <sup>1</sup>The words of Agur the son of Jakeh, even the prophecy: the man spake unto Ithiel, even unto Ithiel and Ucal, <sup>2</sup>Surely I am more brutish than any man, and have not the understanding of a man. <sup>3</sup>I neither learned wisdom, nor have the knowledge of the holy.

Q: Do you agree with Agur? Will you put your trust in someone who has no "knowledge of the holy"?

# 135.

Proverbs 31: <sup>1</sup>The words of king Lemuel, the prophecy that his mother taught him.

Q: Who was King Lemuel, given that he is mentioned nowhere else in the Bible? Should we trust him? (Note: There was no Lemuel in either the kings of Judah or of Isreal. He had to have been from a "heathen" nation.)

# 136.

Ecclesiastes 1: <sup>5</sup>The sun also ariseth, and the sun goeth down, and hasteth to his place where he arose.

O: By what route does the sun hasten back to where it was?

# 137.

Ecclesiastes 1: <sup>9</sup>The thing that hath been, it is that which shall be; and that which is done is that which shall be done: and there is no new thing under the sun.

Q: No? Nothing at all, huh? Did we miss Moses' moon walk?

# 138.

Isaiah 7: <sup>1</sup>And it came to pass in the days of Ahaz the son of Jotham, the son of Uzziah, king of Judah, that Rezin the king of Syria, and Pekah the son of Remaliah, king of Israel, went up toward Jerusalem to war against it, but could not prevail against it.... <sup>14</sup>Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall

conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel. <sup>15</sup> Butter and honey shall he eat, that he may know to refuse the evil, and choose the good. <sup>16</sup> For before the child shall know to refuse the evil, and choose the good, the land that thou abhorrest shall be forsaken of both her kings.

Vs:

- Matthew 1: <sup>18</sup> Now the birth of Jesus Christ was on this wise.... <sup>22</sup> Now all this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, <sup>23</sup> Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us.
  - Q: Did the two kings forsake their land before Immanuel knew how to tell evil from good? (Answer: Yes. They were long dead before he was even born! [Ahaz was king in the 8<sup>th</sup> century B.C.]) How was this to be a sign to Ahaz that the kings would forsake their lands if it didn't take place until centuries later?

# 139.

- Isaiah 13: <sup>10</sup> For the stars of heaven and the constellations thereof shall not give their light: the sun shall be darkened in his going forth, and the moon shall not cause her light to shine.
- Matthew 24: <sup>29</sup> Immediately after the tribulation of those days shall the sun be darkened, and the moon shall not give her light, and the stars shall fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens shall be shaken:
- Isaiah 30: <sup>26</sup> Moreover the light of the moon shall be as the light of the sun, and the light of the sun shall be sevenfold, as the light of seven days, in the day that the LORD bindeth up the breach of his people, and healeth the stroke of their wound.

- Q: I can only assume here that the river is the Nile and the sea is the Mediterranean. Do you recall from your history lessons when the Nile River and Mediterranean Sea were dried up?

# 142.

- Isaiah 19: <sup>18</sup> In that day shall five cities in the land of Egypt speak the language of Canaan, and swear to the LORD of hosts; one shall be called, The city of destruction.
- Q: What are the five cities that spoke/speak the language of Canaan? (What language would that be?) Which city was it that came to be called "The City of Destruction"?

#### 143.

- Isaiah 34: <sup>6</sup> The sword of the LORD is filled with blood, it is made fat with fatness, and with the blood of lambs and goats, with the fat of the kidneys of rams: for the LORD hath a sacrifice in Bozrah, and a great slaughter in the land of Idumea. <sup>7</sup> And the unicorns shall come down with them, and the bullocks with the bulls; and their land shall be soaked with blood, and their dust made fat with fatness. <sup>8</sup> For it is the day of the LORD's vengeance, and the year of recompences for the controversy of Zion. <sup>9</sup> And the streams thereof shall be turned into pitch, and the dust thereof into brimstone, and the land thereof shall become burning pitch. <sup>10</sup> It shall not be quenched night nor day;

Isaiah 35: <sup>7</sup> And the parched ground shall become a pool, and the thirsty land springs of water: in the habitation of dragons, where each lay, shall be grass with reeds and rushes. <sup>9</sup> No lion shall be there, nor any ravenous beast shall go up thereon, it shall not be found there; but the redeemed shall walk there

Q: Let's see now, do you think a dragon would be a ravenous beast?

#### 145.

Isaiah 55: <sup>6</sup> Seek ye the LORD while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near Q: When can the lord not be found? When is he not near?

#### 146.

Q: How do you think it worked in Isaiah's day without a water cycle?

# 147.

Jeremiah 22: <sup>11</sup> For thus saith the LORD touching Shallum the son of Josiah king of Judah, which reigned instead of Josiah his father.... <sup>15</sup> Shalt thou reign, because thou closest thyself in cedar? did not thy father eat and drink, and do judgment and justice, and then it was well with him?

Vs:

2 Kings 22: <sup>1</sup> Josiah was eight years old when he began to reign, and he reigned thirty and one years in Jerusalem.... 2 Kings 23: <sup>29</sup> In his days Pharaoh-nechoh king of Egypt went up against the king of Assyria to the river Euphrates: and king Josiah went against him; and he slew him at Megiddo, when he had seen him. <sup>30</sup> And his servants carried him in a chariot dead from Megiddo, and brought him to Jerusalem, and buried him in his own sepulchre.

Q: How old was Shallum's father, Josiah, when he died? Would you consider it to have gone well with someone you know if he/she died at that age?

# 148.

Jeremiah 23: <sup>15</sup> Therefore thus saith the LORD of hosts concerning the prophets; Behold, I will feed them with wormwood, and make them drink the water of gall: for from the prophets of Jerusalem is profaneness gone forth into all the land.... <sup>16</sup> Thus saith the LORD of hosts, Hearken not unto the words of the prophets that prophesy unto you: they make you vain: they speak a vision of their own heart, and not out of the mouth of the LORD.... <sup>26</sup> How long shall this be in the heart of the prophets that prophesy lies? yea, they are prophets of the deceit of their own heart... <sup>30</sup> Therefore, behold, I am against the prophets, saith the LORD, that steal my words every one from his neighbour. <sup>31</sup> Behold, I am against the prophets, saith the LORD, that use their tongues, and say, He saith.

Vs:

Jeremiah 25: <sup>4</sup> And the LORD hath sent unto you all his servants the prophets, rising early and sending them; but ye have not hearkened, nor inclined your ear to hear.

Q: Did god want his people to listen to the prophets?

# 149.

Jeremiah 34: <sup>4</sup> Yet hear the word of the LORD, O Zedekiah king of Judah; Thus saith the LORD of thee, Thou shalt not die by the sword: <sup>5</sup> but thou shalt die in peace

Vs:

Jeremiah 52: <sup>10</sup> And the king of Babylon slew the sons of Zedekiah before his eyes: he slew also all the princes of Judah in Riblah. <sup>11</sup> Then he put out the eyes of Zedekiah; and the king of Babylon bound him in chains, and carried him to Babylon, and put him in prison till the day of his death.

Q: Zedekiah didn't "die by the sword," but, given the description, does it sound very honest to say that he would "die in peace"?

Jeremiah 42: <sup>5</sup>Then they said to Jeremiah, The LORD be a true and faithful witness between us, if we do not even according to all things for the which the LORD thy God shall send thee to us. <sup>6</sup>Whether it be good, or whether it be evil, we will obey the voice of the LORD our God, to whom we send thee; that it may be well with us, when we obey the voice of the LORD our God.... <sup>9</sup>And [Jeremiah] said unto them, Thus saith the LORD, ... <sup>10</sup> If ye will still abide in this land, then will I build you, and not pull you down, ... <sup>13</sup> But if ye say, We will not dwell in this land, neither obey the voice of the LORD your God,... <sup>16</sup>Then it shall come to pass, that the sword, which ye feared, shall overtake you there in the land of Egypt ... <sup>20</sup> For ye dissembled in your hearts, when ye sent me unto the LORD your God, saying, Pray for us unto the LORD our God; and according unto all that the LORD our God shall say, so declare unto us, and we will do it. <sup>21</sup> And now I have this day declared it to you; but ye have not obeyed the voice of the LORD your God, nor any thing for the which he hath sent me unto you.

Q: Verses 9 through 21 above are a single continuous discourse. So it is indeed a true statement that they had not obeyed the voice of the lord. Don't you think god should give them a chance to act before saying that they hadn't followed his words?

# **151.**

Ezekiel 26: <sup>7</sup> For thus saith the Lord GoD; Behold, I will bring upon Tyrus Nebuchadrezzar king of Babylon....
<sup>11</sup> With the hoofs of his horses shall he tread down all thy streets: he shall slay thy people by the sword, and thy strong garrisons shall go down to the ground. <sup>12</sup> And they shall make a spoil of thy riches, and make a prey of thy merchandise

Vs:

Ezekiel 29: <sup>18</sup> Son of man, Nebuchadrezzar king of Babylon caused his army to serve a great service against Tyrus: every head was made bald, and every shoulder was peeled: yet had he no wages, nor his army, for Tyrus, for the service that he had served against it: <sup>19</sup> therefore thus saith the Lord God; Behold, I will give the land of Egypt unto Nebuchadrezzar king of Babylon; and he shall take her multitude, and take her spoil, and take her prey; and it shall be the wages for his army.

Q: Did Nebuchadnezzar get spoil from Tyrus?

#### **152.**

Ezekiel 29: <sup>10</sup> Behold, therefore I am against thee, and against thy rivers, and I will make the land of Egypt utterly waste and desolate, from the tower of Syene even unto the border of Ethiopia. <sup>11</sup> No foot of man shall pass through it, nor foot of beast shall pass through it, neither shall it be inhabited forty years.

O: Do you recall from your history lessons what the time period was when Egypt was uninhabited for 40 years?

#### **153**.

Daniel 2: 1...Nebuchadnezzar dreamed dreams... <sup>26</sup> The king answered and said to Daniel, whose name was Belteshazzar, Art thou able to make known unto me the dream which I have seen, and the interpretation thereof? <sup>27</sup> Daniel answered in the presence of the king, and said, ... <sup>36</sup> ... and we will tell the interpretation thereof before the king.... <sup>38</sup> And wheresoever the children of men dwell, the beasts of the field and the fowls of the heaven hath he given into thine hand, and hath made thee ruler over them all....

<u>Q:</u> Do you think Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon, was pleased to learn that he was now ruler over the Aztecs?

#### **154.**

Daniel 3: <sup>24</sup> Then Nebuchadnezzar the king was astonied, and rose up in haste, and spake, and said unto his counsellors, Did not we cast three men bound into the midst of the fire? They answered and said unto the

Amos 8: <sup>9</sup> And it shall come to pass in that day, saith the Lord GOD, that I will cause the sun to go down at noon

Q: Let's see, how will that work, now? Just drops right straight down from high in the sky?

# 159.

Zephaniah 3: <sup>7</sup> I said, Surely thou wilt fear me, thou wilt receive instruction; so their dwelling should not be cut off, howsoever I punished them: but they rose early, and corrupted all their doings

Q: Why do you think god got this wrong?

#### 160.

Zechariah 7: <sup>14</sup> but I scattered them with a whirlwind among all the nations whom they knew not.

O: Since god scattered them among all nations, how many do you think got scattered to the Aztecs?

#### 161.

Luke 1: <sup>20</sup> And, behold, thou shalt be dumb, and not able to speak, until the day that these things shall be performed, because thou believest not my words, which shall be fulfilled in their season.... <sup>62</sup> And they made signs to his father, how he would have him called.

Q: Why would they make signs to a person who is unable to talk?

#### **162**.

Luke 1: <sup>31</sup> And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name JESUS.... <sup>34</sup> Then said Mary unto the angel, How shall this be, seeing I know not a man? <sup>35</sup> And the angel answered and said unto her, The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God.

Q: Did Mary ask to be impregnated? Did god do it anyway? Do we have a word for that?

- Matthew 1: <sup>21</sup> And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins. <sup>22</sup> Now all this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, <sup>23</sup> Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us.
- Q: If Mary's son was to be called "Emmanuel", why is this the only verse in the New Testament in which that name occurs? Did he ever actually get called that? And who was this "prophet" who seems to be otherwise nonexistent in the Bible? (*I.e.*, this quote is not found in the Old Testament.)

# 164.

- Matthew 2: <sup>23</sup> and he came and dwelt in a city called Nazareth: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophets, He shall be called a Nazarene.
- Matthew 27: <sup>9</sup>Then was fulfilled that which was spoken by Jeremy the prophet, saying, And they took the thirty pieces of silver, the price of him that was valued, whom they of the children of Israel did value; <sup>10</sup> And gave them for the potter's field, as the Lord appointed me.
  - Q: Why is it that there is no mention previously in the Bible about someone being called a Nazarene or this quote about the potter's field?

#### 165.

Luke 1: <sup>24</sup> And after those days his wife Elisabeth conceived.... <sup>30</sup> And the angel said unto her, Fear not, Mary: for thou hast found favour with God. <sup>31</sup> And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name JESUS.... <sup>39</sup> And Mary arose in those days, and went into the hill country with haste, into a city of Juda; <sup>40</sup> and entered into the house of Zacharias, and saluted Elisabeth.... <sup>57</sup> Now Elisabeth's full time came that she should be delivered; and she brought forth a son.... <sup>60</sup> And his mother answered and said, Not so; but he shall be called John.... Luke 2: <sup>7</sup> And [Mary] brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger

Vs:

Matthew 2: <sup>13</sup> And when they were departed, behold, the angel of the Lord appeareth to Joseph in a dream, saying, Arise, and take the young child and his mother, and flee into Egypt, and be thou there until I bring thee word: for Herod will seek the young child to destroy him. <sup>14</sup> When he arose, he took the young child and his mother by night, and departed into Egypt: <sup>15</sup> and was there until the death of Herod: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, Out of Egypt have I called my son. <sup>16</sup> Then Herod, when he saw that he was mocked of the wise men, was exceeding wroth, and sent forth, and slew all the children that were in Bethlehem, and in all the coasts thereof, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had diligently enquired of the wise men.

Vs:

Luke 3: <sup>2</sup> ... the word of God came unto John the son of Zacharias in the wilderness. <sup>3</sup> And he came into all the country about Jordan, preaching the baptism of repentance for the remission of sins.

Q: Isn't it interesting that John the Baptist survived Herod's slaughter even though apparently they didn't take him to Egypt with them? And can you honestly believe that Herod would kill every child under two in his kingdom based on a rumor that a "king" had been born to the Jewish people?

#### 166.

- Luke 1: <sup>30</sup> And the angel said unto her, Fear not, Mary: for thou hast found favour with God. <sup>31</sup> And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name JESUS. <sup>32</sup> He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David: <sup>33</sup> and he shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end.
- Matthew 1: <sup>20</sup> But while he thought on these things, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a dream, saying, Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is

- Q: Does it seem strange to you that Jesus' parents, after being notified of who their son was prior to his birth, would be so dense as to what was going on?

#### 167.

Luke 2: 52 And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favour with God and man.

Q: Pretty good for someone who was already god, huh?

#### 168.

John 7: 5 For neither did his brethren believe in him [Jesus].

Q: How good of a job did "blessed" Mary and Joseph do in teaching their kids?

#### 169.

Matthew 4: <sup>8</sup> Again, the devil taketh him up into an exceeding high mountain, and sheweth him all the kingdoms of the world, and the glory of them

Luke 4: <sup>5</sup> And the devil, taking him up into an high mountain, shewed unto him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time.

Q: What mountain do you think it was that Jesus could see the Incas from?

# 170.

Matthew 5: <sup>1</sup> And seeing the multitudes, he went up into a mountain: and when he was set, his disciples came unto him:

Vs:

Luke 6: <sup>17</sup> And he came down with them, and stood in the plain, and the company of his disciples, and a great multitude of people out of all Judaea and Jerusalem, and from the sea coast of Tyre and Sidon, which came to hear him,... <sup>20</sup> And he lifted up his eyes on his disciples, and said,

Blessed be ye poor: for yours is the kingdom of God.

Blessed are ye that weep now: for ye shall laugh.

- <sup>22</sup> Blessed are ye, when men shall hate you, and when they shall separate you from their company, and shall reproach you, and cast out your name as evil, for the Son of man's sake.
- Q: There are some similarities to these two speeches, one of which Jesus gave on a mountain and the other on a plain. Do you think they are really two different speeches?

Luke 14: <sup>34</sup> Salt is good: but if the salt have lost his savour, wherewith shall it be seasoned?

Q: How would salt lose its savor?

Q: This is the first place in the entire Bible where hell is mentioned as a place of fire. Why do you think god didn't bother to tell the people of the Old Testament about what this place is like?

#### 174.

Luke 4: <sup>30</sup> But he passing through the midst of them went his way, <sup>31</sup> and came down to Capernaum, a city of Galilee, and taught them on the sabbath days. <sup>32</sup> And they were astonished at his doctrine: for his word was with power.... <sup>36</sup> And they were all amazed, and spake among themselves, saying, What a word is this! for with authority and power he commandeth the unclean spirits, and they come out. <sup>37</sup> And the fame of him went out into every place of the country round about.

Vs:

Matthew 11: <sup>23</sup> And thou, Capernaum, which art exalted unto heaven, shalt be brought down to hell: for if the mighty works, which have been done in thee, had been done in Sodom, it would have remained until this day.

Q: Does Capernaum sound to you like a place Jesus should condemn?

# **175.**

Matthew 5: <sup>22</sup> But I say unto you, That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment: and whosoever shall say to his brother, Raca, shall be in danger of the council: but whosoever shall say, Thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire.

Vs:

1 Corinthians 15: <sup>35</sup> But some man will say, How are the dead raised up? and with what body do they come? <sup>36</sup> Thou fool, that which thou sowest is not quickened, except it die

Q: Was Paul (the author of 1 Corinthians) "in danger of hell fire"?

# **176.**

Matthew 6: <sup>5</sup> And when thou prayest, thou shalt not be as the hypocrites are: for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and in the corners of the streets, that they may be seen of men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward. <sup>6</sup> But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly.

Vs:

1 Timothy 2: 8 I will therefore that men pray every where, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and doubting.

O: Why does Paul countermand Jesus' words and urge us to pray like the hypocrites do?

1 Timothy 6: <sup>14</sup> that thou keep this commandment without spot, unrebukeable, until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ: <sup>15</sup> which in his times he shall shew, who is the blessed and only Potentate, the King of kings, and Lord of lords; <sup>16</sup> who only hath immortality

Vs:

John 3: <sup>16</sup> For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

Q: Do believers have immortality or not?

# 178.

Matthew 6: <sup>26</sup> Behold the fowls of the air: for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feedeth them.

Matthew 10: <sup>29</sup> Are not two sparrows sold for a farthing? and one of them shall not fall on the ground without your Father. <sup>30</sup> But the very hairs of your head are all numbered. <sup>31</sup> Fear ye not therefore, ye are of more value than many sparrows.

Luke 12: <sup>24</sup> Consider the ravens: for they neither sow nor reap; which neither have storehouse nor barn; and God feedeth them: how much more are ye better than the fowls?

Q: Half of all sparrows die every year. Those that survive have many diseases and parasites. Why do you think Jesus chose to use sparrows to illustrate god's care for his disciples?

#### 179.

Matthew 7: <sup>13</sup> Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: <sup>14</sup> because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it.

Vs:

1 Timothy 4: <sup>10</sup> For therefore we both labour and suffer reproach, because we trust in the living God, who is the Saviour of all men, specially of those that believe.

John 12: 32 And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me.

Q: How many will be saved?

# 180.

Matthew 15: <sup>21</sup> Then Jesus went thence, and departed into the coasts of Tyre and Sidon. <sup>22</sup> And, behold, a woman of Canaan came out of the same coasts, and cried unto him, saying, Have mercy on me, O Lord, thou son of David; my daughter is grievously vexed with a devil. <sup>23</sup> But he answered her not a word. And his disciples came and besought him, saying, Send her away; for she crieth after us. <sup>24</sup> But he answered and said, I am not sent but unto the lost sheep of the house of Israel.

Vs:

Matthew 8: <sup>5</sup> And when Jesus was entered into Capernaum, there came unto him a centurion, beseeching him, <sup>6</sup> and saying, Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, grievously tormented. <sup>7</sup> And Jesus saith unto him, I will come and heal him. <sup>8</sup> The centurion answered and said, Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest come under my roof: but speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed. <sup>9</sup> For I am a man under authority, having soldiers under me: and I say to this man, Go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my servant, Do this, and he doeth it. <sup>10</sup> When Jesus heard it, he marvelled, and said to them that followed, Verily I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel

Q: If Jesus was only sent to the Israelites like he claimed, then why didn't he respond to the centurion like he did to the woman of Tyre?

# 181.

Matthew 9: <sup>23</sup> And when Jesus came into the ruler's house, and saw the minstrels and the people making a noise, <sup>24</sup> he said unto them, Give place: for the maid is not dead, but sleepeth. And they laughed him to

scorn. <sup>25</sup> But when the people were put forth, he went in, and took her by the hand, and the maid arose. <sup>26</sup> And the fame hereof went abroad into all that land.

Q: Why would Jesus' fame spread if all he did was wake a sleeping girl? Was he lying when he said she wasn't dead?

#### 182.

Matthew 13: <sup>45</sup> Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto a merchant man, seeking goodly pearls: <sup>46</sup> who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had, and bought it.

Q: Would you trust this person as your financial advisor?

#### 183.

John 10: <sup>7</sup> Then said Jesus unto them again, Verily, verily, I say unto you, I am the door of the sheep. <sup>8</sup> All that ever came before me are thieves and robbers

Q: Were Moses, Elijah and Isaiah thieves and robbers?

#### 184.

Matthew 15: 20 ... but to eat with unwashen hands defileth not a man.

Mark 7: <sup>14</sup> And when he had called all the people unto him, he said unto them, Hearken unto me every one of you, and understand: <sup>15</sup> There is nothing from without a man, that entering into him can defile him <u>Q:</u> Shall we not continue to teach our kids to wash their hands?

#### 185.

Matthew 16: <sup>18</sup> And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. <sup>19</sup> And I will give unto thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.

Q: What did John the Baptist restore?

# 187.

Mark 9: <sup>1</sup> And he said unto them, Verily I say unto you, That there be some of them that stand here, which shall not taste of death, till they have seen the kingdom of God come with power.

Luke 9: <sup>27</sup> But I tell you of a truth, there be some standing here, which shall not taste of death, till they see the kingdom of God.

Q: Did some of those standing there see Jesus coming in his kingdom? Did that generation pass away without Jesus coming back?

- Q: How many of the "we which are alive and remain" to whom Paul was speaking are still waiting for Christ's return?

# 190.

Acts 2: <sup>14</sup> But Peter, standing up with the eleven, lifted up his voice, and said unto them.... <sup>16</sup> But this is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel; <sup>17</sup> And it shall come to pass in the last days....

1 Corinthians 7: <sup>29</sup> But this I say, brethren, the time is short

Philippians 4: <sup>5</sup> Let your moderation be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand.

Hebrews 1: <sup>1</sup>God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, <sup>2</sup> hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son

Hebrews 9: <sup>26</sup> ...but now once in the end of the world hath he appeared

Hebrews 10: <sup>37</sup> For yet a little while, and he that shall come will come, and will not tarry.

James 5: 8 ... for the coming of the Lord draweth nigh.

  - Q: Of all the prayers in which a request has been made in Jesus' name in the last 2000 years, what percentage do you think resulted in Jesus doing what was asked for? Jesus brought back at least three persons from the dead and continuously went around healing diseases, casting out demons and performing other miracles. What follower of Jesus can you name who has done "greater works than these"?

#### 192.

- James 5: <sup>14</sup> Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: <sup>15</sup> and the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up.
- Q: Are you ready to throw away your health insurance policy? (Unfortunately there are a few who really do take this quite seriously. Even more unfortunately, their children often suffer greatly for it.)

Mark 6: <sup>34</sup> And Jesus, when he came out, saw much people, and was moved with compassion toward them, because they were as sheep not having a shepherd: and he began to teach them many things.... <sup>39</sup> And he commanded them to make all sit down by companies upon the green grass.... <sup>41</sup> ...and gave them to his disciples to set before them... <sup>42</sup> And they did all eat, and were filled.... <sup>44</sup> And they that did eat of the loaves were about five thousand men.

Q: Don't you think Jesus had very strong vocal chords to speak to 5000 men (plus women and children?) without modern amplifying equipment?




